

## **Santa Cruz County Assessment Appeals Board**

### **Filing Deadlines & Appeal Information:**

#### **Regular Assessment:**

- **Filing Period:** July 2<sup>nd</sup> through November 30<sup>th</sup>
- For values as of January 1 of current year

#### **Supplemental Assessment:**

- **Filing Deadline:** Sixty (60) days after the mailing date printed on the notice.
- You must provide the mailing date printed on the Notice of Supplemental Assessment (field located in Step 5) & upload a copy of your Notice of Supplemental Assessment (during DocuSign certification).
- Santa Cruz County does not accept any appeal applications based on a Secured Property Tax Bill.

#### **Roll Change:**

- **Filing Deadline:** Sixty (60) days after the mailing date printed on the notice.
- You must provide the mailing date printed on the assessment notice (field located in Step 5) & upload a copy of your assessment notice (during DocuSign certification).
- Santa Cruz County does not accept appeal applications based on a Secured Property Tax Bill.
- You must submit a separate application for each roll year you are appealing.

#### **Escape Assessment:**

- **Filing Deadline:** Sixty (60) days after the mailing date printed on the notice.
- You must provide the mailing date printed on the Notice of Enrollment of Escape Assessment (field located in Step 5) & upload a copy of your Notice of Escape Assessment (during DocuSign certification).
- Santa Cruz County does not accept any appeal applications based on a Secured Property Tax Bill.
- Santa Cruz County does not accept escape assessment appeals based on a Notice of Proposed Escape Assessment. You must submit the Notice of Enrollment of Escape Assessment with your application.
- You must submit a separate application for each roll year you are appealing.

#### **Calamity Assessment:**

- **Filing Deadline:** Six (6) months after the mailing date printed on the notice.
- You must provide the mailing date printed on the Calamity Assessment notice (field located in Step 5) & upload a copy of your Calamity Assessment notice (during DocuSign certification).
- Santa Cruz County does not accept any appeal applications based on a Secured Property Tax Bill.

- You must submit a separate application for each roll year you are appealing.

**Penalty Assessment:**

- **Filing Deadline:** Sixty (60) days after the mailing date printed on the notice.
- You must provide the mailing date printed on the Penalty Assessment notice (field located in Step 5) & upload a copy of your Penalty Assessment notice (during DocuSign certification).
- Santa Cruz County does not accept any appeal applications based on a Secured Property Tax Bill.
- You must submit a separate application for each roll year you are appealing.
