SUBJECT: 1998/99 COUNTY SERVICE AREA BENEFIT ASSESSMENT/ SERVICE CHARGES

Members of the Board:

Santa Cruz County Code Section 4.26 requires that the Board of Supervisors take certain annual actions related to County Service Area rates. As part of these annual proceedings, your Board must set a public hearing to consider objections or protests on the rates and at the conclusion of the hearing approve a 1998/99 rate report.

The rates presented to your Board today remain at the same level as in 1997/98, with the exception of proposed rate increases in CSA 5, Sand Dollar Zone, CSA 30, Glenwood Acres, CSA 33, Redwood Drive, CSA 35, Country Estates and CSA 44, Sunbeam Woods. Proceedings for those increases have previously been brought to your Board for consideration and action.

Once today's actions have been approved by the Board, Public Works will place Benefit Assessment/Service Charge reports on tile with the Clerk of the Board. These reports, containing the Assessor's **parcel number**, the owner's name, and the amount of the Benefit Assessment/Service Charge, will be available on or before May 4, 1998, which will allow for public review two weeks prior to the proposed May 19, 1998, public hearing. As in prior years, the rate report must be approved by your Board and forwarded to the Auditor-Controller by August 10, 1998.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors take the following action:

1. Adopt the attached resolution setting May 19, 1998, during the morning agenda (which begins at 9:00 a.m.) as the date and time for a public hearing on the proposed Benefit Assessment/Service Charge rates for various County Service Areas and on the proposed Benefit Assessment/Service Charge reports.

2. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish the attached Notices of Public Hearing in the manner prescribed by law.
