Please find enclose my application to serve on the SCCHO Board, and my CV. I have discussed the position with Dr. Wells Shoemaker, and have served in an interim capacity as medical director during his absence on two occasions. I have also discussed the responsibilities with Mr. John Petersdorf. I feel well advised of the time commitment and types of issues to be addressed. I am willing to commit the necessary time, and mental energy.

There are several reasons for my interest in this board: I hope to improve health services in the county, particularly for the disabled, and have worked to this end at Dominican, Cabrillo and home health agencies. I believe this can best be achieved by cooperation and coordination between patients, providers and payors. This board presents a unique opportunity to address these issues in a meaningful way. My time working with the staff at SCCHO has offered me insight into the conflicting demands for funds, and I am interested in helping shape guidelines and accountability for the use of public funds. I am keen to learn from other board members, and share my experiences.

I hope to offer insight from several perspectives: I have served as a physician for straightforward and difficult cases in the county, acted as medical director for acute and subacute rehabilitation programs, and dealt with provider issues from many disciplines. I have been patient advocate and in the position of saying "no" to patient requests. Previously I practiced in Canada, where I faced many of the same issues. Additionally, I was medical director of a rehabilitation program for three years, involved in teaching at the University of Toronto, and served on the Province of Ontario Advisory Board for the Assistive Devices Program-this group established prescribing and pricing policies for the government health plan with respect to wheelchairs, mobility devices, orthotics and prosthesis (limb, eye, breast, etc.).

I hope to be able to offer perspective from my experiences in Santa Cruz and Canada, an open mind, and a commitment to improving health services to your board.
