SUBJECT: EMERGENCY CONTRACTS DURING THE EL NIÑO STORMS


Members of the Board:

Because of severe winter storms, seven emergency contracts were required to assure continued use of the County maintained road system. Information about each contract is detailed in Attachment 1.

Sufficient funds were available within the road fund to cover these expenditures until we receive reimbursement from the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Office of Emergency Services.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors ratify the emergency contracts for road repairs as outlined in Attachment 1.


