To members of the Santa Cruz County Domestic Violence Commission:

I am interested in serving on the Domestic Violence Commission in Santa Cruz County and hope you will seriously consider my request to serve as a commissioner. I am particularly interested in filling the vacancy for a commissioner who is willing and capable of representing the views of the gay/lesbian/bisexual/transgendered community. I am alarmed by preliminary studies which show that 22% to 46% of all lesbians have been in a physically violent same-sex relationship. I am also aware that in at least one study (Gay and Lesbian Community Action Council, 1987) it was found that 17% of gay males had also reported having been in a physically violent gay relationship. As we know, with all domestic violence statistics, frequently this is an issue which is underreported due to a variety of causes, not the least of which is the shame many victims of domestic violence experience as a result of the behavior they are subjected to. These dynamics are further heightened and efforts to seek help are further hindered when the individual being affected by domestic violence is a member of the "queer" community. Fear of being misunderstood or treated differently because of homophobia place additional barriers in front of gay/lesbian/bisexual/transgendered people seeking help. Finally, there has been a historical reluctance in the "queer" community towards acknowledging that domestic violence exists in our relationships and our community. There is much work to be done in educating victims/survivors and service providers alike about how to best help this population.

I feel quite energized by this issue and have had experience working directly with persons affected by domestic violence. I have helped develop domestic violence programs, have trained others to provide assistance to persons affected by domestic violence (law enforcement officers, hospital personnel, social services personnel, business leaders in the community, women's groups, clergy, etc.) and have designed and produced educational materials for use in training and outreach to the community. With respect to gay/lesbian/bisexual/transgendered issues, I have helped cofacilitate a.training on working with gay youth and their families with Kate Kaufman, author of "Free your Mind", a book on working with gay youth and their families. I helped in initial efforts to organize a group for gay youth in Watsonville, and remain.

committed to doing whatever I can to improve the quality of lives for domestic violence victims/survivors and the "queer" community in Santa Cruz County.
