Approval To Return and Replace A Drug Detection Dog

Dear Members of the Board:

On December 17, 1996 your Board authorized the Sheriff's Office to enter into a contractual agreement to accept a donated drug detection dog to enhance our drug enforcement efforts in Santa Cruz County. The Sheriff's Office has benefited significantly through the use of this dog in seizing illicit drugs and also in reducing the number of man hours required to search for these drugs. While the dog is still effective in conducting drug searches, his age is impacting his ability to conduct prolonged searches.

The drug detection dogs current handler Deputy Sheriff Steve Carney, has acquired another dog trained exclusively in drug detection. Bea is a two year old 45 pound black female Labrador Retriever who has proven herself to be extremely successful conducting drug searches for other agencies. Due to her success, and at the recommendation of the current drug detection dog handler, the Sheriff's Office is requesting authorization by your Board to amend the current agreement with Deputy Sheriff Steve Carney for the donation of a drug detection dog by retiring Boz and replacing him with Bea.

The Santa Cruz County Narcotic Enforcement Team Council will continue to provide \$1000.00 annually for routine feeding, annual vaccinations, medications and other minor miscellaneous care cost.

The Sheriff's Office will provide funds from the State Supplemental Law Enforcement Service Trust Fund, account number 072727 to cover those costs for care/maintenance not funded by the SCCNET Council. Those cost will include Canine Care Pay, certification, cost for emergency veterinary care

and/ or replacement in the event of death or disability sustained during the course of authorized drug detection activities.

It is therefore Recommended that your Board approve the attached Amendment to the Agreement with Deputy Sheriff Steve Carney retiring, "Boz" and accepting the donation of, "Bea" as a drug detection dog.

- 1. The dog "Boz" is hereby retired and deleted from the agreement. The dog "Bea" is substituted as a drug detection dog and Handler donates and transfers "Bea" under the same terms and conditions as set forth in the agreement.
