## APPROVE FISCAL PROCESS FOR THE COUNTY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COMMISSION

Dear Members of the Board:

As you are aware, the Board of Supervisors is authorized to accept donations on behalf of the County. The purpose of this letter is to request your Board's authorization for the County Domestic Violence Commission (DVC) to solicit and accept donations for public education activities in relation to the prevention of domestic violence and to approve the DVC's recommended process for the expenditure of these funds.

Over the past few months, the County Domestic Violence Commission (DVC) has developed procedural guidelines for acceptance of donations designated for the commission's work in the prevention of domestic violence. After discussion with the Auditor-Controller, County Counsel and County Administrative Office, the DVC Executive Committee finalized draft procedures, which were presented to the full commission at their regular meeting of October 14. The procedures as reviewed and recommended by the DVC are attached. We are seeking your Board's approval for the solicitation, acceptance and expenditure of donated funds.

It is therefore recommended that your Board:

- 1. Authorize the County Domestic Violence Commission (DVC) to solicit and accept donated funds for the purposes of public education regarding the prevention of Domestic Violence; and
- 2. Approve the process as recommended by the DVC for the expenditure of such donated funds.

## **Recommended Action:**

As recommended by the DVC Executive Committee, approve process for accepting and expending donations and authorize the DVC chair to seek Board of Supervisors' authorization for the Commission's process.

## **Current** Status

Presently, there exists a trust fund (Account No. 072150) within the County's financial system that acts as the receiving account for donations to the DVC. This fund has a present balance for DVC monies of \$2,486.37, which represents the following revenue sources:

- 1. Donation from a local car dealership \$1,000
- 2. Unspent grant funds from the 1995 conference \$1,386.37
- 3. Donation from a local fund raiser \$100

The trust fund does not accrue interest.

Expenditures of trust funds approved to date by the County Administrative Officer upon the recommendation of the Domestic Violence Commission are:

Following payment of these outstanding accounts, the balance of trust funds available for the Commission will be \$1,768.51.

#### **County Fiscal Process**

By County ordinance establishing the DVC, the District Attorney's Office is responsible for the DVC monies within the trust fund. Deposits to the fund are made through this department or by the County Administrative Office, which provides fiscal oversight to all County Departments.

The Auditor-Controller is recommending that the Commission obtain authorization from the Board of Supervisors for accepting and expending funds. This authorization would then permit the DVC to be more time efficient in processing claims against the trust balance.

To expend any trust funds, the Commission must take action at a regular DVC meeting to recommend expenditures for specific purposes. This action would then be forwarded to the County Administrative Office for approval. The Auditor-Controller would then be presented a claim from County staff for action. Generally, the Auditor's Office has a processing turnaround time of approximately two weeks.

## <u>Commission Procedural Guidelines</u> (Recommended)

The Donestic Violence Commission has defined the process by which funds received by the Commission will be expended. The following elements are considered:

- 1. Funds received by the Domestic Violence Commission will be used for public education activities and associated support related to the prevention of domestic violence.
- 2. All funds received by the Commission will be deposited to the County General Trust (072150).
- 3. For those funds received that are donated for specific purposes (i.e. grant funds) within the Commission's scope of authority, the Commission can only recommend expenditures in line with the donor's designated purpose. For donations that are not within the Commission's purview, the donor will be contacted by the Chair of the Commission to suggest other local community groups/resources that would be appropriate recipients in view of the donor's instructions.
- 3. The DVC Executive Committee will maintain a ledger that will account for all funds received and dispersed, including any specific requirements.

- 4. The DVC Executive Committee will review all requests for expenditures and make recommendations for action to the full commission at a regular meeting or special, noticed meeting, either approving or denying the request.

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
