RE: Approval of Resolution for Medi-Cal Outreach Grant

Dear Members of the Board,

This letter requests approval of a resolution to support the submittal of a Medi-Cal Outreach grant to the State Department of Health Services.

<u>Background</u> - In August, 1998 HSA received notification of the availability of grant funds to conduct Medi-Cal Outreach activities. A required letter of intent to submit an application for funding was submitted by the September 30, 1998 deadline.

Outreach activities are to be directed to children and families who are in need of health services available through Medi-Cal, are eligible to apply for program benefits, but have not participated due to a variety of reasons.

The application requires collaboration with community agencies that serve the target population. Such a coalition of agencies was formed beginning in 1997, with the purpose of increasing Medi-Cal enrollments which have declined over the past years. The Coalition includes representatives from the following agencies:

At the beginning of this year, the Coalition was invited to provide input on the development of an outreach grant sponsored by the California HealthCare Foundation. Although the application was not approved for funding, the requested activities were later included in an application submitted by the coalition and HRA to the Packard Foundation, which has received preliminary approval. The Packard grant, to be administered by HRA, will fund outreach activities including the development of outreach and media materials, and will fund outreach staff support at HRA, FNS, DRC, VRC, PWSD and the SCCCC.

Members of the Coalition met again in August, 1998 to discuss potential activities to be funded by the Medi-Cal Outreach grant. The Coalition discussed additional gaps in outreach services that needed to be addressed. The Medi-Cal Outreach Grant application includes the following activities to meet these identified needs: 1) a new Eligibility Worker III position in HRA to be outstationed in the community to interface with new outreach efforts at the various Community agencies and clinics; 2) a Benefits Advocate in Community Mental Health to focus outreach efforts to children, adolescents and families involved with the CPS, juvenile justice, alcohol and drug and/or mental health systems; and 3) a countywide Medi-Cal Outreach Coordinator in HSA. A copy of the Medi-Cal Outreach Grant is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

A Board resolution in support of the grant application is attached.

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board:

- 1) Approve the resolution in support of the Medi-Cal Outreach Grant; and
- 2) Authorize the HSA Administrator to submit the grant application on behalf of the County.
