SUBJECT: BUENA VISTA LANDFILL GAS POWER PROJECT

Members of the Board:

The Department of Public Works and the department's landfill gas power development consultant, Brown, Vence and Associates (BVA) are nearing completion of all financial and contractual agreements necessary to begin final construction of the Buena Vista Landfill Gas Power Project. In order to complete the final tasks, it will be necessary to amend the County's contract with BVA to assist with the completion of some of the remaining work. Under this amendment BVA will provide staff with technical assistance in completing the permitting process with the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District. BVA will also assist staff in completing the Project Award Package (PAP) with the California Energy Commission (CEC). As your Board is already aware, our department was successful in securing a \$767,000 bid award through the CEC in the form of cash payments for production of electricity from landfill gas. The process of securing this funding involved the County issuing a performance bond as security for our bid. In order for the performance bond to be released, two milestones must first be met: the PAP must be completed and approved by the CEC and the County must demonstrate that all necessary permit processes have been initiated. These two additional tasks will complete the work necessary to have our performance bond released.

In addition to the above tasks, it is also appropriate at this time to complete a final update on the power sales market conditions prior to executing a final power sale agreement, It has been eight months since we last solicited proposals for power sales agreements and there have been several positive changes in the state wide energy markets. BVA will assist the County in reviewing and negotiating, if appropriate, any new marketing opportunities in light of the current electric industry market conditions. An additional task for assisting in a current market update is included in the attached amendment.

We also want to take this opportunity to update your Board briefly on the current status and schedule for project development. We are currently planning to return to your Board in late December or early January with a final project development package. At that time your Board will be asked to approve the final project and execute several agreements related to the financial and operational structure for the project. This package will include, but not be limited to, agreements for power sales, gas rights, Section 29 Federal tax credit investment, turn-key facilities construction, operation and maintenance, payment of Renewable Energy Production Incentive (REPI) credits, and payment of AB 1890 incentive payments from the CEC. Your Board will also be requested to approve the capital expenditure for the project.

While the risks associated with this project have been well managed through the project structure, there have nonetheless been some lingering concerns expressed regarding financial risks to the County. In response to these concerns, Public Works has been exploring the option of developing this project as a joint public/private venture with BVA. Under terms of the original agreement for this project, BVA retains the right for private development, if the County selects this option. Under this alternative the County would still own and finance the capital improvements for the plant to take **full** advantage of the financial incentives, available only to government agencies, through the Department of Energy's REP1 program. The operational and production risks would be transferred to BVA's development group who would in turn guarantee their work through a financial surety mechanism such as a performance bond or corporate letter of credit in a format acceptable to the County. In addition to assuming the operational and production risks, the developer would also guarantee, from project revenues, the full return of the County's capital investment, debt service, and development costs. In addition, REPIs derived for the project would be shared between the County and the BVA development group. In our continuing review of this project and in response to concerns expressed by your Board and others, Public Works has concluded that development of this project as a public/private venture could provide a more reasonable balance of both benefits and risks. We can achieve the positive environmental benefit and some small financial benefit associated with reuse of a valuable waste disposal by-product, while limiting the County's financial and operational risks on the project. This revised project development scenario will be outlined in greater detail in our future correspondence and presentations to your Board.

The attached amendment to agreement will require a \$6,850 increase in contract appropriations for an amended not-to-exceed amount of \$106,820. Sufficient funds are available in the Solid Waste Enterprise fund for this purpose.

It is therefore recommended that your Board take the following actions:

- 1. Accept and file this status report on the Buena Vista Landfill Gas Power Project.
- 2. Approve the attached amendment to agreement with Brown, Vence and Associates for development of the Buena Vista Landfill Gas Power Project for an amended contract not-to-exceed amount of \$106,820.

3. Authorize the Director of Public Works to sign the contract amendment on behalf of the County.



Brown Vence & Associates, Inc. (BVA) requests an amendment to our existing contract to cover additional services requested by the Santa Cruz County Department of Public Works related to the Landfill Gas-to-Electricity Project, This amendment covers the following Tasks:

- 1. Prepare and submit the County's air permit applications to the Monterey Bay Air Pollution Control District,
- 2. Develop and submit the County's Project Award Package from the New Renewables Account Auction to the California Energy Commission, and
- 3. Resurvey the power market to ensure that the County is obtaining the best power sales agreement available.

SCOPE OF WORK

BVA offers to provide the following technical and management services necessary to further assist the Department in the development of landfill gas-to-electricity projects at the Buena Vista Landfill. This scope of work builds upon work previously completedby the Department and BVA.

Task 11: Air Permits

BVA will prepare the County's air permit applications to the Monterey Bay Air **Pollution** Control District, **Each** engine to be installed requires a separate permit to authorize Printed on construction and operation. All applicable permit fees will be paid by the County. BVA Recycled has budgeted \$1.,3 10 for this task.

Task 12: CEC Project Award Package

BVA will prepare the County's Project Award Package (PAP) for the California Energy Commission (CEC). The PAP is the document that the CEC will approve and adopt to officially award the County's renewable power project with an on-going incentive payment through the California's New Renewable Resources Account. BVA will follow the CEC's guidelines for preparing the PAP, including information regarding project location, finances, schedule, permits, and eligibility for incentive payments. BVA will complete the PAP for the County's review. Following approval by the County, BVA will submit the PAP to the CEC. The CEC is expected to adopt the PAP no later than June 4, 1999. \$1,480 has been budgeted for this task.

Task 13: Power Sales Market Update and Negotiation

Over eight months has passed since the County's **RFP was** issued to select a renewable power purchaser. **BVA** will resurvey the renewable power market for any new opportunities and assist the County in final negotiations with the power purchaser. \$4,060 has been budgeted for **this** task.

We request a contract amendment for an additional \$6,850 (see Exhibit A).
