SUBJECT: Mental Health and Substance Abuse Contract Amendments for

Services to CalWORKs Recipients

Dear Members of the Board:

Background:

CalWORKs clients often need special assistance and services in order to transition from the Temporary Aid for Needy Families (TANF) program to gainful employment. As part of the State plan for CalWORKs, funding has been allocated to counties to fund both mental health and alcohol and drug services to CalWORKs recipients.

The Human Resources Agency and the Health Services Agency have been working with community service providers over the past year to identify the special needs of CalWORKs clients and to develop expanded services and access to care for this client group. Services to be provided in both North and South County will include residential, outpatient counseling and methadone programs in alcohol and drug programs as well as mental health counseling, medications, and case management. Most of these services will be delivered by existing contract agencies skilled in substance abuse and/or mental health care. Complex assessments and referral will be done by County-employed mental health or substance abuse staff.

In addition to the ongoing State allocation for these services, HRA has received a grant for special augmented services for CalWORKs recipients. These funds

were awarded to HRA last November, and are known as the Governor's 15% discretionary funding, augmenting outpatient services. HRA sent a report to your Board regarding this grant award on October 27, 1998. Both the ongoing State allocation for CalWORKs and the grant funds are incorporated into the attached HSA CalWORKs contract amendments.

HRA has accepted and appropriated the funding for CalWORKs within their current budget. HSA requests approval of the attached budget transfer to allow for appropriations to HSA's budget to permit CalWORKs contract amendments and payments to be processed. HSA will cost apply expenses to the HRA budget as actual expenditures are made so that they can be included on HRA CalWORKs claims to the state. The attached budget transfer also corrects an error in the current HSA budget by restating HSA estimated revenues from CalWORKs sources to cost applied appropriations from CalWORKs sources. This corrected methodology complies with County accounting practices. No new County funds are needed for the requested contract amendments.

It is, therefore, RECOMMENDED that your Board:

- Approve the attached request for Transfer or Revision of Budget Appropriations and/or Funds (AUD-74) to allow for sufficient appropriations for the Mental Health and Substance Abuse CalWORKs contracts and to correct an error in budgeting methodology; and
- 2. Adopt the attached resolution accepting and appropriating revenues of \$160,837 from the Calworks program; and
- 3. Approve the attached amendments to the following 1998-99 agreements and authorize the Health Services Agency Administrator to sign:
 - A) Volunteer Center of Santa Cruz, Contract No. 205A (Budget Index 363210, Subobject 3665) increase maximum amount by \$135,700 for a new maximum of \$535,900;
 - B) Janus Alcoholism Services, Contract No. 133A (Budget Index 364042, Subobject 3975) increase maximum amount by \$54,000 for a new maximum of \$471,293;
 - C) Janus Perinatal Program, Contract No. 604A (Budget Index 364042, Subobject 3975) increase maximum amount by \$30,000 for a new maximum of \$438,972;
 - D) Santa Cruz Community Counseling Center, Inc., Contract No. 100A (Budget Index 364042, Subobject 3975) increase maximum amount by \$80,100 for a new maximum of \$978,256;

- E) Fenix Services, Inc., Contract No. 796A (Budget Index 364042, Subobject 3975) increase maximum amount by \$109,000 for a new maximum of \$428,529;
- F) Triad Community Services, Contract No. 880A (Budget Index 364042, Subobject 3975) increase maximum amount by \$38,000 for a new maximum of \$402,492; and
- G) Women's Crisis Support & Shelter Services, Contract No. 298A (Budget Index 364042, Subobject 3975) increase maximum amount by \$4,000 for a new maximum of \$44,186.

Volunteer Center of Santa Cruz Community Connection Program Amendment to 1998-99 Agreement

The parties hereto agree to amend that certain agreement dated July 1, 1998, County Contract No. 205A, by changes as follows;

1. Cover Sheet

Increase the Community Connection portion (No. 205A) of the contract by \$135,700 for a new maximum of \$535,900; change the total contract (No. 205A/B/C) maximum on the Cover Sheet from \$491,600 to \$627,300.

2. Exhibit C, Scope of Service and Budget, Part A, Paragraph 1.2

Add the following language as Paragraph 1.2f:

f. <u>CalWORKs</u>. Welfare to Work is an employment service program for recipients of Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF, formerly AFDC). Participants in the <u>CalWORKS</u> program who are having difficulty following through with vocational training, job search, basic skills, obtaining or maintaining employment due to mental health issues may be assessed by the <u>COUNTY</u> Access Team or referred directly to this program for services by the <u>CalWORKs</u> Social Worker or the HSA Behavioral Health Specialist.

This component provides mental health services, brokerage and work related emergency payments directed toward relieving symtoms that interfere with employment activities such as anxiety and depression as well as dysfunctional behaviors such as disorganization. These services may be individual or group therapy, job coaching, decision making, rehabilitation counseling, symptom reduction, self management and educational activities supporting employment related outcomes. These services will be provided at or near HRA CalWORKs Service Centers or One-Stop Career Centers. These services will be delivered in a culturally and linguistically sensitive manner.

This program will work in **close** collaboration with the COUNTY Access Team to insure that additional mental health services that are medically necessary are provided as needed. CONTRACTOR may refer individuals to the Access Team, as needed, for additional services (e.g., medication assessment).

CONTRACTOR shall participate as requested in multi-disciplinary team meetings to coordinate mental health treatment activities with CalWORKs Welfare to Work program activities and to monitor individual service and treatment outcomes. Team meetings will also address service

delivery issues and promote the development of an integrated case management approach that is employment focused. Participant service plan objectives will address family self-sufficiency and employment goals as well as mental health treatment goals. Treatment goals . developed by the CONTRACTOR are to be incorporated into Welfare to Work Plan Activity Assessments when these plans are developed by the CalWORKs Social Worker and/or CalWORKs Employment and Training Specialist.

CONTRACTOR will work in close collaboration with CalWORKs Social Workers, the HSA Behavioral Health Specialist and COUNTY Access Team to develop client tracking and reporting systems as well as protocols for protecting client confidentiality and exchanging confidential information.

3. Exhibit C, Scope of Service and Budget, Part A, Paragraph 1.3

Add the following language:

<u>Description of CalWORKs population</u>: The CalWORKs component will serve a different population based on the employment related needs of participants referred by the HRA CalWORKs Welfare to Work program.

4. Exhibit C, Scope of Service and Budget, Part A

Delete existing Contract Budget and replace with new attached Contract Budget.

All other provisions, excepting those mentioned above, shall remain the same.

EXHIBIT A - INDIVIDUAL CONTRACTOR INFORMATION

- A.1 ADMINISTRATION: County's Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator, hereinafter called County's Administrator, under the direction of the Health Services Agency Administrator shall represent County in all matters pertaining to services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and shall administer this Agreement on behalf of County. Contractor's Executive Director shall administer this Agreement on behalf of Contractor.
- A.2. TERM: The term of this Agreement shall commence on July 1, 1998 and continue through and including June 30, 1999 during which time Contractor shall perform the services provided herein.
- A.3. COMPENSATION FOR FEE-FOR-SERVICE CONTRACTS: County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Four Hundred and Seventeen Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety Three dollars and no/100 (\$417,293.00) Four Hundred and Seventy-One Thbusand. Two Hundred Ninety Three dollars and no/100 (\$471,293.00) for services performed during the term of this Agreement in accord with the negotiated rates set forth in Exhibit D. CalWORKS funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibits E-4 and E-5 related to CalWORKS clients. Governor's 15% Welfare-to-Work Grant funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibit E-5 related to Welfare-to-Work clients. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base and required COUNTY funds exceed this amount.

In no event shall County be required to pay for the cost of services which are covered by funding received by Contractor from other governmental contracts or grants.

A.4. NOTICE: Any notice or notices required or permitted to be given pursuant to this Agreement may be personally served on the other party by the party giving such notice, or may be served by mail to the County's Administrator at: County of Santa Cruz, HEALTH SERVICES AGENCY, Division of Alcohol and Drug Programs, 1060 Emeline Avenue, Santa Cruz, CA 95060, or to Contractor at: Janus of Santa Cruz, 200 7th Avenue, Suite 150, Santa Cruz, CA 95062.

- #A. CLIENT BED DAY (RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT): A day in which 1 treatment bed is utilized to provide 24 hour inpatient care. The bed must be licensed and funded. The facility, staffing and other conditions necessary to provide the treatment services to a client occupying that bed must be available, Billable day shall include the day of admission, but not the day of discharge.
- #B. CLIENT BED DAY (SPECIAL CARE UNIT DETOX): Special Care Unit Services shall include alcohol and drug detoxification and pretreatment services for the purpose of assisting acutely intoxicated individuals during the alcohol and/or drug withdrawal period. Services to clients who stay less than 12 hours may be billed at one-half (1/2) of the "client day" rate.

- #D. & #E. STAFF HOUR: CalWORKS and Governor's 15% Staff hours are defined as those hours that a direct service staff person is on the iob and available to provide services. A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients, including individual and group counseling, intake, assessment, case management, aftercare, participation in CalWORKS multi-disciplinary team meetings. and outreach and educational activities related to informing and encouraging CalWORKS recipients to enter into alcohol and drug treatment services. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations, holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County.

 Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County. Time to be billed in 15 minute increments of direct staff time.
- D.4. ADVANCES: Advances shall be made on a base of \$417,293 \$471,293.
- D.5. INCREASE IN MAXIMUM ALLOCATION FOR MODE OF SERVICE: Funds may not be shifted between modalities, e.g. Outclient and Residential, without written approval by County Administrator. Shifts can be requested to the extent that there are funds available as a result of reduced billings for another mode of service or other modes of services hereunder. Such shifting of funds shall be on a dollar for dollar basis, and, as the Maximum Allocation for provision of a particular mode of service is augmented, there shall be a corresponding reduction in the Maximum Allocation for another mode of service or modes of service.

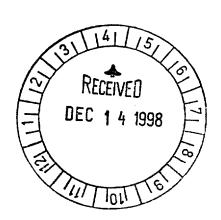

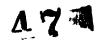

- A.2. TERM: The term of this Agreement shall commence on July 1, 1998 and continue through and including June 30, 1999 during which time Contractor shall perform the services provided herein.
- A.3. COMPENSATION: Total contract amount shall not exceed Four Hundred and Eight Thousand, Nine Hundred and Seventy Two dollars and no/100 (\$408.972.00), Four. Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand, Nine Hundred and Seventy Two Dollars and No/100 (\$438.972.00) for services performed during the term of this Agreement in accord with the negotiated rates set forth in Exhibit D. CalWORKS funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibit E-3 related to CalWORKS clients. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base and required COUNTY funds exceed this amount.

FOR NEGOTIATED RATE CONTRACTS: County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Three Hundred Seventeen Thousand, Four Hundred Fourteen dollars (317,414) Three Hundred Forty-Seven Thousand, Four Hundred Fourteen Dollars (\$347,414) for services performed during the term of this Agreement in accord with the negotiated rates set forth in Exhibit D. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base and required County funds exceed this amount.

In no event shall County be required to pay for the cost of services which are covered by funding received by Contractor from other governmental contracts or grants.

FOR COST REIMBURSEMENT CONTRACTS (DRUG MEDI-CAL): County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Ninety One Thousand, Five Hundred and Fifty Eight Dollars (\$91,558), as follows:

- (A) \$45,779 State General Fund Match to Medi-Cal and
- (B) \$45,779 Federal Drug Medical funds,

for services performed during the term of this Agreement, based on reimbursement of allowable costs. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base exceed the amount on Line (A).

In no event shall County be required to pay for the cost of services which are covered by funding received by Contractor from other governmental contracts or grants,

D.3. DEFINITIONS:

- A. CLIENT BED DAY HOUSING (NNA): A day in which 1 housing bed is utilized to provide 24 hour inpatient care. The bed must be licensed and funded. The facility, staffing and other conditions necessary to provide the treatment services to a client occupying that bed must be available. Billable day shall include the day of admission, but not the day of discharge.
- B.& C. CLIENT BED DAY TREATMENT (Medical and NNA): A day in which 1 treatment bed is provided to an eligible client to provide 24 hour inpatient care. The bed must be licensed and funded. Drug Medical pays for only the cost of treatment and does not pay for housing costs. The facility, staffing and other conditions necessary to provide the treatment services to a client occupying that bed must be available.
- D.& E. CLIENT DAY DAY CARE HABILITATIVE (DCH) TREATMENT (Medical and NNA): the Day Treatment Program will be for a minimum of three days, 3 hours a day per week of scheduled, formalized services. Exceptions may include crisis visits. Substance abuse services shall be for pregnant and postpartum women and/or to EPSDT eligible beneficiaries. The services will include intake, admission physical examinations, treatment planning, individual and group counseling, body specimen screens,

medication services, collateral services, and crisis intervention as well as a complement of structured therapeutic activities including vocational counseling, 12 step education, and health education.

Initial interview and screening followed by assessment in the following areas: psychosocial, legal, use/abuse of substances, medical. Provision of counseling services specifically addressing issues of substance use/abuse within the context of the personal and familial life of each client. Therapeutic interventions will be based upon goals identified in treatment plan and mutually agreed upon between client(s) and therapist. Provision of counseling services in groups specifically addressing issues of substance use/abuse, life skills, self-esteem. Therapist will utilize intervention strategies specifically targeted to breaking through denial for new client groups and sustaining sobriety for continuing client groups. Case management, transportation and childcare will be provided to meet Perinatal Treatment Standards. Client will receive or be referred for appropriate medical care and pediatric medical care.

- F. CLIENT BED DAY CalWORKS HOUSING: A day in which housine beds are utilized to provide

 24 hour residence to a CalWORKS client and her accompanying children. Custodial (parent)

 resident is required to give a 2-week notice of termination of residence or forfeit deposit charge

 equal to that amount of residency. The facility, staffing and other conditions necessary to provide
 the services to a client and the client's child(ren) occupying the beds must be available. Billable
 day shall include the day of admission, but not the day of discharge.
- D.4. ADVANCE BASE: Advances shall be made on a base of \$402,105 (Advance base does not include 15% of Federal Medical funds. See provision C.9.), State and Federal Medical funds earned by Contractor in excess of this amount shall be paid by County upon submission by Contractor
- D.5. INCREASE IN MAXIMUM ALLOCATION FOR MODE OF SERVICE: Funds may not be shifted between modalities, e.g., Day Treatment and Residential, without written approval by County Administrator. Shifts can be requested to the extent that there are funds available as a result of reduced billings for another mode of service or other modes of services hereunder. Such shifting of funds shall be on a dollar for dollar basis and as the Maximum Allocation for provision of a particular mode of service is augmented, there shall be a corresponding reduction in the Maximum Allocation for another mode of service or modes of services.

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES/PRIMARY PROBLEMS TREATED

Janus maintains a transitional living facility offering a drug-free, non-drinking environment for women who are either pregnant or parenting who have an identified impairment in their ability to care for their children due to alcohol and other drug abuse. Women enrolled in the CalWORKS Welfare-to-Work programs who qualify for housing will be provided a clean and sober living environment to help them overcome drug and alcohol abuse barriers to employment.

- GOAL I: To provide 3 rooms, each room with a capacity for at least one adult and one child, in a drug -free non-drinking transitional living environment for 12 CalWORKS women and their children.
 - OBJECTIVE A: To urovide 986 CalWORKS bed days of housing to 12 eligible women and their children.
 - OBJECTIVE B: To maintain program capacity of at least 3 adult and 3 children's beds.
 - OBJECTIVE C: Encourage individuals to participate financially in their own recovery by collecting a monthly rental fee for their use of transitional living quarters.
 - OBJECTIVE D: To provide housing to 12 women, three of which will be Latinas.
 - D.I. Alcohol and drug services are to be employment focused, and in accordance with CalWORKS Welfare to Work plans and/or participation agreements. Contractor will support and encourage iob seeking and job retention activities and will assist participants to overcome employment barriers linked to alcohol and drug abuse issues. As authorized and approved by HRA. CalWORKS funds may also be claimed for start-up activities approved by the County Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator.
 - D.2. Contractor shall participate as requested in multi-disciplinary team meetings to coordinate alcohol and drug treatment activities with CalWORKS Welfare to Work program activities and to monitor individual service and treatment plan outcomes. Team meetings will also address general service delivery coordination issues, and the development of an integrated assessment and case management approach that is employment focused. Service plan objectives will incorporate family self-sufficiency and employment goals as well as treatment and alcohol, drug

and mental health goals. Employment focused treatment goals will be incorporated into Welfare to Work Activity Agreements when this plan is approved or amended by the HRA Employment and Training Specialist.

- D.3. CONTRACTOR shall establish procedures for screening all clients at intake regarding their status as a CalWORKS recipient and, pending appropriate releases of information, refer CalWORKS recipients who were not initially referred by the Human Resources Aeency (HRA) back to HRA for inclusion of alcohol and drug treatment into their CalWORKS activity agreement and/or CalWORKS Welfare to Work plan.
- D.4. If access to service for clients referred under CalWORKS cannot be provided within seven days of the receipt of the HRA referral. CONTRACTOR shall inform HRA and the Health Services Agency (HSA) Alcohol and Drug Program, and work in cooperation with HRA and HSA to address access issues.
- D.5. CONTRACTOR will coordinate with HRA and HSA to develop participant tracking and monitoring systems, as needed, by the CalWORKS program.
 CONTRACTOR will also work with HRA and HSA to develop protocols for protecting client confidentiality and exchanging necessary and appropriate information as recmired for reporting purposes.

GOAL II. To comply with all contract provisions and DADPA/HRA claim and reporting requirements in order to fulfill the terms and conditions of the contract.

CalWORKS funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibits E-5, E6 and E-7 related to CalWORKS clients. Governor's 15% Welfare-to-Work Grant funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibit E-6 related to Welfare-to-Work clients. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base and required COUNTY funds exceed this amount.

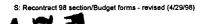

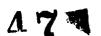

EXHIBIT A

INDIVIDUAL CONTRACTOR INFORMATION

- A.1 ADMINISTRATION: County's Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator, hereinafter called County's Administrator, under the direction of the Health Services Agency Administrator shall represent County in all matters pertaining to services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and shall administer this Agreement on behalf of County. Contractor's Executive Director shall administer this Agreement on behalf of Contractor.
- A.2. TERM: The term of this Agreement shall commence on July 1, 1998 and continue through and including June 30, 1999 during which time Contractor shall perform the services provided herein.
- A.3. COMPENSATION FOR FEE-FOR-SERVICE CONTRACTS: County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Three Hundred and Nineteen Thousand, Five Hundred and Twenty Nine dollars and no/100 (\$319,529.00) Four Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand, Five Hundred Twenty-Nine and No/100 (\$428,529.00) for services performed during the term of this Agreement in accord with the negotiated rates set forth in Exhibit D. CalWORKS funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibit E-5 related to CalWORKS clients. Governor's 15% Welfare-to-Work Grant funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibit E-6 related to Welfare-to-Work clients. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base and required COUNTY funds exceed this amount.

In no event shall County be required to pay for the cost of services which are covered by funding received by Contractor from other governmental contracts or grants.

A.4. NOTICE: Any notice or notices required or permitted to be given pursuant to this Agreement may be personally served on the other party by the party giving such notice, or may be served by mail to the County's Administrator at: County of Santa Cruz, HEALTH SERVICES AGENCY, Division of Alcohol and Drug Programs, 1060 Emeline Avenue, Santa Cruz, CA 95060, or to Contractor at: Fenix Services, 406 Main Street, Suite 403, Watsonville, CA 95076.

A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients including individual counseling and group therapy of a minimum of 3 and not more than 15 unrelated individuals, intake, assessment, case management or aftercare. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations, holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County, Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County. Time to be billed in 15 minute increments of direct staff time.

Outreach/Information and Referral: A staff hour in the Outpatient program to inform individuals who call, come to the office, are contacted through outreach efforts, and/or attend community meetings about AOD services. Staff persons will give specific information about the benefits and services of Medi-Cal and will encourage persons to apply for Medi-Cal benefits by referring them to Medi-Cal eligibility offices. Information and/or referrals to other treatment services, medical services or other health and social services is part of the intake, admission, program and discharge process. Records will be kept of staff hours and numbers of people given specific information about Medi-Cal or referred to Medi-Cal offices in accordance with current State MAA guidelines and regulations.

#B. STAFF HOUR: Prevention Services: A staff hour is defined as those hours that a direct service staff person is on the job and available to provide services. A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations, holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County. Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County. Time billed in 30 minute increments of direct work time.

Public Information/Prevention Education/Referral: A staff hour in the Prevention program to inform individuals who call, come to the office, are contacted through outreach efforts, and/or attend community meetings about AOD prevention. Staff persons will give specific information about the benefits and services of Medi-Cal and will encourage persons to apply for Medi-Cal benefits by referring them or giving directions to Medi-Cal eligibility offices. Public information and education about and/or referrals to treatment resources, medical services or other health and social services is part of the prevention activities. Records will be kept of all presentations in which AOD treatment resources are presented and specific information about Medi-Cal services and location of offices are given to meeting participants or individuals in accordance with current State MAA guidelines and regulations.

- #C. REFIDENTIAL BED DAY: A day in which 1 treatment bed is utilized to provide 24 hour inpatient care. In the case of CalWORKS clients, 1 treatment bed includes provisions for bed and care of both the clients and their children. The bed must be licensed and funded. The facility, staffing and other conditions necessary to provide the treatment services to a client occupying that bed must be available. Billable day shall include the day of admission, but not the day of discharge.
- #F. STAFF HOUR: CalWORKS and Governor's 15% staff hours are defined as those hours that a direct service staff person is on the job and available to provide services. A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients, including individual and group counseling, intake, assessment, case management, aftercare, participation in CalWORKS multi-disciplinary team meetings, and outreach and educational activities related to informing and encouraging CalWORKS recipients to enter into alcohol and drug treatment services. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations, holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County. Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County. Time to be billed in 15 minute increments of direct staff time.
- D.4. ADVANCE BASE: Advances shall be made on a base of \$319,529 \$428,529.
- D.5. INCREASE IN MAXIMUM ALLOCATION FOR MODE OF SERVICE: Funds may not be shifted between modalities, e.g., Outpatient and Residential without written approval by County Administrator. Shifts can be requested to the extent that there are funds available as a result of reduced billings for another mode of service or other modes of services hereunder. PRIMARY PROBLEMS TREATED

Hermanas Residential Program is a community-based residential treatment program consisting of a social model, peer oriented recovery home for Latina alcoholics. The 90 to 120 day residential program in cludes individual counseling, group work, aftercare and outreach services designed to address issues that create barriers to clients returning to work. Program emphasis is on the Latina population, taking into consideration the cultural diversity, language, and socio-economic factors that impact this population. Fenix Outpatient Perinatal Program provides comprehensive services to women and their children, with a priority to pregnant substance abusing women, pregnant injection drug using women, and parenting substance using women who have an identified impairment in their ability to work or care for their children. The service includes preliminary intake screening and referral, individual and group counseling, case management, childcare, transportation and insuring clients are referred for appropriate adult medical care and pediatric medical care. INDIVIDUAL CONTRACTOR INFORMATION

- A.1 ADMINISTRATION: County's Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator, hereinafter called County's Administrator, under the direction of the Health Services Agency Administrator shall represent County in all matters pertaining to services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and shall administer this Agreement on behalf of County. Contractor's Executive Director shall administer this Agreement on behalf of Contractor.
- A.2. TERM: The term of this Agreement shall commence on July 1, 1998 and continue through and including June 30, 1999 during which time Contractor shall perform the services provided herein.
- A.3. COMPENSATION: Total contract amount not to exceed Three Hundred Sixty-Four Thousand, Four Hundred Ninety-Two Dollars (\$ 364,492.00) Four Hundred Two Thousand, Four Hundred Ninety-Two Dollars (\$402492.00) as follow::

COMPENSATION FOR FEE-FOR-SERVICE CONTRACTS: County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Forty-Four Thousand, Forty-Eight Dollars (\$44,048) Eighty-Two Thousand, Forty-Eight Dollars (\$82,048) for services performed during the term of this Agreement in accord with negotiated rates set forth in Exhibit D. CalWORKS funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibits E-4, E-5, and E-6 related to CalWORKS. Of these funds, the Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) allocated for methadone maintenance will be expended on a fee-for-service basis only and cannot be used for Medical matching funds. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base and required COUNTY funds exceed this amount.

COST-BASED REIMBURSEMENT FOR CalWORKS START-UP ACTIVITIES: Out of the total sum stated in the first paragraph of section A.3., County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Three Thousand Five Dollars (\$3,005) for reimbursement of actual costs of start-up activities related to CalWORKS services as described in Exhibits E-5 and E6 in accordance with the attached start-up budgets. Any changes in line items of the start-up budget that exceed the greater of 10% of the line item amount or \$500 must be approved by the County's Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator.

In no event shall County be required to pay for the cost of services which are covered by funding received by Contractor from other governmental contracts or grants

FOR COST REIMBURSEMENT CONTRACTS (DRUG MEDI-CAL): County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed:

- (A) \$ 160,222 in State Match and
- (B) \$ 160,222 in Federal funds, for a total of \$ 320,444 for Drug Medical services performed during the term of this Agreement, based on fixed rates. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base exceed the amount on Line (A).

In no event shall County be required to pay for the cost of services which are covered by funding received by Contractor from other governmental contracts or grants.

CLIENT VISIT INDIVIDUAL AND\OR GROUP COUNSELING (DRUG MEDI-CAL Narcotic Treatment and CalWORKS Methadone Maintenance Program): A unit of service is a calendar month of treatment services claimed in 10 minute increments for a minimum of 50 minutes, up to a maximum of 200 minutes of individual and/or group counseling per calendar month to each beneficiary. A client visit is a face-to-face contact between a counselor and client, for group or individual counseling. Telephone contacts and visits not at the certified site are not billable units of service. Group counseling shall be conducted with no less than 4 and no more than 10 clients at the same time with at least one of the clients in the group being a Medical beneficiary focusing on the needs of the individuals served. Counseling sessions shall meet the requirements specified in Section 10345, Title 9, CCR.
 - C. STAFF HOUR OUTPATIENT COUNSELING (NNA and CalWORKS Clients): A staff hour is defined as those hours that a direct service staff person is on the job and available to provide services. A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients including individual counseling and group therapy to a minimum of 3 and not more than 15 unrelated individuals, intake, assessment, case management or aftercare. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations, holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County. Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County. Time is to be billed in 15 minute increments of direct staff time.
- D.5. ADVANCE BASE: Advances shall be made on a base of \$340,459 \$378.459. (Advance base does not include 15% of Federal Drug Medical funds. See provision C.9.). State and Federal Medical funds earned by Contractor in excess of this amount shall be paid by County upon submission by Contractor of a year-end cost report showing properly claimed State and Federal Medical revenues.
- D.6. LIABILITY LIMIT: Contractor shall not be liable for any past debts, personnel claims, patient claims or claims of third party contractors of any prior Santa Cruz County Methadone Clinic contractors.

In the event that Agreement between parties is terminated, Contractor agrees to assign to County title to fixed assets purchased above.

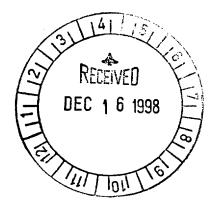

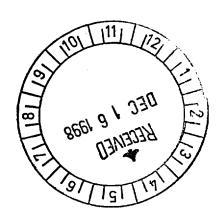

INDIVIDUAL CONTRACTOR INFORMATION

- A.1 ADMINISTRATION: County's Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator, hereinafter called County's Administrator, under the direction of the Health Services Agency Administrator shall represent County in all matters pertaining to services rendered pursuant to this Agreement and shall administer this Agreement on behalf of County. Contractor's Executive Director shall administer this Agreement on behalf of Contractor.
- A.2. TERM: The term of this Agreement shall commence on July 1, 1998 and continue through and including June 30, 1999 during which time Contractor shall perform the services provided herein.
- A.3. COMPENSATION FOR FEE-FOR-SERVICE CONTRACTS: County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Forty Thousand One Hundred and Eighty-Six Dollars and No/100 (\$40,186.00) Forty-Four Thousand One Hundred and Eighty-Six Dollars and No/100 (\$44,186.00) for services performed during the term of this Agreement in accord with negotiated rates set forth in Exhibit D. CalWORKS funds may only be used for activities described in Exhibit E-3 related to CalWORKS. In no event shall County obligation of State Drug and Alcohol Allocation base and required COUNTY funds exceed this amount.

COST-BASED REIMBURSEMENT FOR CalWORKS START-UP ACTIVITIES: Out of the total sum stated in the paragraph above. County agrees to pay Contractor a total sum not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars and No/100 (\$200.00) for reimbursement of actual costs of start-up activities related to CalWORKS services as described in Exhibit E-3 in accordance with the attached start-up budget. Any changes in line items of the start-up budget that exceed the greater of 10% of the line item amount or \$500 must be approved by the County's Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator.

In no event shall County be required to pay for the cost of services which are covered by funding received by Contractor from other governmental contracts or grants.

A.4. A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients. including individual counseling and group therapy to a minimum of 3 and not more than 15 unrelated individuals, intake, assessment, case management or aftercare. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations, holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County. Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County. Time to be billed in 15 minute increments of direct staff time.
 - **#B.** STAFF HOUR, Prevention Services: A staff hour is defined as those hours that a direct service staff person is on the job and available to provide services. A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations, holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County. Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County.
 - #C. STAFF HOUR, CalWORKS Individual & Group Counseling; Staff hours are defined as those hours that a direct service staff person is on the iob and available to provide services. A direct service staff person is defined as a staff person who spends time providing services directly to program clients, including individual and group counseling. intake, assessment, case management, aftercare. participation in CalWORKS multi-disciplinary team meetings, and outreach and educational activities related to informing and encouraging CalWORKS recipients to enter into alcohol and drug treatment services. Administrative, clerical and other support services may not be billed as staff hours. Staff time used for vacations. holidays, sick leave and other leave may not be billed to County. Volunteer and unpaid intern time may not be billed to County. Time to be billed in 15 minute increments of direct staff time.

- D.4. ADVANCE BASE: Advances shall be made on a base of \$ 40,186 44,186.
- D.5. INCREASE IN MAXIMUM ALLOCATION FOR MODE OF SERVICE: Funds may not be shifted between modalities, e.g., Outpatient and Prevention, without written approval by County Administrator. Shifts can be requested to the extent that there are funds available as a result of reduced billings for another mode of service or other modes of services hereunder. Such shifting of funds shall be on a dollar for dollar basis, and, as the Maximum Allocation for provision of a particular mode of service is augmented, there shall be a corresponding reduction in the Maximum Allocation for another mode of service or modes of services.

Women on CalWORKS who are transitioning into the workforce will be our target population. Program activities will include intake, individual and group counseling regarding the obstacles to employment including drug and alcohol abuse and domestic violence. WCS will maintain a weekly Drop-in Group for 24 weeks during this grant period. The 12-week rotating content of the group will be geared to support clients during their transition and to develop their confidence and skills.  - A.l. CalWORKS funds may be claimed for assessment, treatment, case management and aftercare services that are authorized and approved by the HRA CalWORKS Employment and Training staff. Alcohol and drug services are to be employment focused, and in accordance with CalWORKS Welfare to Work plans and/or participation agreements. Contractor will support and encourage job seeking and job retention activities and will assist participants to overcome employment barriers linked to alcohol and drug abuse issues. As authorized and approved by HRA, CalWORKS funds may also be claimed for participation in CalWORKS multi-disciplinary team meetings; for outreach and education activities related to informing and encouraging CalWORKS recipients to enter into alcohol and drug treatment services: and for start-up activities approved by the County Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator.

- A.2. Contractor shall participate as reauested in multi-disciplinary team meetings to coordinate alcohol and drug treatment activities with CalWORKS Welfare to Work program activities and to monitor individual service and treatment plan outcomes. Team meetings will also address general service delivery coordination issues, and the development of an integrated assessment and case management approach that is employment focused. Service plan objectives will incorporate family self-sufficiency and employment goals as well as treatment and alcohol, drug and mental health goals. Employment focused treatment goals will be incorporated into Welfare to Work Activity Agreements when this plan is approved or amended by the HRA Employment and Training Specialist.
- A.3. CONTRACTOR shall establish procedures for screening all clients at intake regarding their status as a CalWORKS recipient and, pending appropriate releases of information. refer CalWORKS recipients who were not initially referred by the Human Resources Agency (HRA) back to HRA for inclusion of alcohol and drug treatment into their CalWORKS activity agreement and/or CalWORKS Welfare to Work plan.
- A.4. If access to service for clients referred under CalWORKS cannot be provided within seven days of the receipt of the HRA referral, CONTRACTOR shall inform HRA and the Health Services Agency (HSA) Alcohol and Drug Program, and work in cooperation with HRA and HSA to address access issues.
- AS. CONTRACTOR will coordinate with HRA and HSA to develop participant tracking and monitoring systems. as needed, by the CalWORKS program.

 CONTRACTOR will also work with HRA and HSA to develop protocols for protecting client confidentiality and exchanging necessary and appropriate information as required for reporting purposes.
