January 1, 1998 to December 31, 1998

-1. Role of the Historic Resources Commission

The role of the Historic Resources Commission is to represent the County in matters pertaining to the protection and preservation of the historic and cultural resources of Santa Cruz County.

2. Meeting Dates, Time and Location

The Historic Resources Commission meets on the third Thursday of the month from 3:30 - 5:00 p.m in Conference Room 413 of the Planning Department, with Special Meetings and expanded meeting hours scheduled as needed.

3. Board or Commission Structure

The Commission is composed of five members who are residents of the County and have been appointed by the Board of Supervisors. They are as follows:

- o Michael Bethke, Second District (Chairperson, through 5/98) (resigned 5/98)
- o Terri Fisher, First District (Vice-Chairperson)(elected Chairperson 12/98)
- o Jacquie Low, Third District
- o Carolyn J. Swift, Fourth District
- o Barbara Kennedy, Fifth District
- o Pat Manning, Second District (appointed 7/98; seated 8/98)(elected Vice-Chairperson 12/98)

4. Commission Staff

Cherry McCormick is Staff to the Commission.

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- 6. Annual Goals and Accomplishments:
- a) <u>Historic Resources Inventory.</u>

The Commission maintains the County Historic Resources Inventory, making changes to the "NR" (National Register) ranking of resources as defined by County Ordinance and the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), or by adding or deleting structures from the Inventory, or by modifying existing Inventory listings as needed.

b) Participation in the Certified Local Government (CLG) Prooram

Santa Cruz County is one of few jurisdictions in California designated as a Certified Local Government by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). This designation allows the County to compete for grants benefiting local historic preservation efforts. It also involves, but is not limited to, attendance at various historic preservation workshops, comments on historic/cultural resource-related legislation, and preparation of an extensive CLG Annual Report with SHPO.

CLG Participation also requires a higher level of Commissioner/Staff expertise and level of training in regards to historic preservation issues.

c) <u>Timely Review of Project Applications Submitted to the Planning Depart</u>ment.

The Historic Resources Commission, and the Staff to the Commission, are committed to providing thorough, efficient and timely review of all:

o Historic Preservation Plans and Preservation Plan Amendments involving a designated historic resource, submitted by the public and/or other County departments, and

o Building, Demolition and/or Development Permit applications involving a designated or potential historic resource.

The Historic Resources Commission reviewed 2 Historic Preservation Plans (see Attachment 2) during the course of the year.

e) <u>HRC review/action to protect resources listed on the Historic Inventory</u> <u>from unauthorized impacts.</u>

The HRC reviewed and took specific action to protect 6 listed resources (see Attachment 3).

f) <u>Historic Inventory Reassessments</u>

The HRC considered the redesignation of NR ranking for two historic resources (see Attachment 4).

- g) <u>HRC Letter of Support for National Reaister Nomination</u> for Elias Robinson House, City of Santa Cruz - which was placed on the National Register in 2/98.
- h) <u>HRC Subcommittees Created:</u>

o Subconmittee to address Castro Adobe Preservation. Members: Commissioners Manning and Swift.

o Subconmittee to prepare 1998 CLG Application. Members: Commissioners Low and Bethke.

o Subcommittee to monitor and advise on the restoration of 33 Hollins, Pasatienpo. Members: Commissioners Low and Fisher.

o Subcommittee to prepare Valencia Hall Commendation.. Members: Commissioners Swift and Fisher.

o Subconnittee to research historic status of Johnson Sisters proper-• ty, Westpark Avenue, Boulder Creek. Members: Connissioners Bethke and Fisher.

i) Appreciation/Recognition

The HRC received thanks and recognition from the Clerk to the Board of Supervisors for their help and role in transferring County records to ucsc.

The HRC offered gestures of thanks or commendation to the following for their efforts on behalf of historic preservation:

- 1) County Parks and the Valencia Hall Coalition, for their efforts to preserve Valencia Hall an NR1 rated resource.
- 2) Paul Bernal, preservation advocate and historian in San Jose, re: Calvary Cemetery.

In addition, the Commission prepared a Welcome package for the new Planning Director, Alvin James ~ which included information on the County's historic preservation program and Commission.

j) <u>National Preservation Week</u>

The HRC requested the Board of Supervisors to adopt a Proclamation in support of National Preservation Week, May 10 - May 16, 1998 - which was done.

k) <u>Study Session on Non-Conforming Use Regulations</u>

The HRC reviewed proposed Phase I revisions to the County's non-conforming structure and non-conforming use requirements, and requested on-going updates on the revision process.

1) <u>CLG Annual Report</u>

The HRC submitted the 1997 CLG Annual Report to the State, as required for CLG jurisdictions.

m) <u>Questers Orqanization</u>

The HRC met with local representatives of the national Questers organization, to discuss this Organization's goals, work efforts and potential new projects.

n) Protection of Jason Brown Cabin.

Commissioners expressed concern, which was relayed by Chairman Almquist to CDF, that this structure be protected during the Timber Protection Plan application process underway.

o) <u>Preservation of Wilder Ranch Warm Up Shack</u>

The HRC wrote a letter to State Parks indicating their desire to protect the warm up shack from continued deterioration.

p) <u>Preservation of the Castro Adobe</u>

Commissioners requested implementation, on a limited basis, of the General Plan policy dealing with financial incentives for historic preservation. In addition, they requested the Board to authorize submittal of a \$10,000 grant to the Santa Cruz Community Foundation for an adaptive reuse study for the Adobe. The Board of Supervisors included preservation of the Adobe in the County's 1998 Legislative Package to the State, as discussed by Supervisor Beautz with the HRC.

q) <u>HRC Resolutions</u>

The HRC passed two Resolutions:

- 1) Resolution recommending Conveyance of County Records to UCSC, and
- 2) Resolution requesting Board of Supervisors authorization to request funds to assist the Castro Adobe.

r) <u>Corralitos Town Plan</u>

The HRC was briefed on progress to date of the Corralitos Town Plan, and provided suggestions in dealing with preservation issues in the Corralitos area.

s) <u>Historic Consultant and Cultural Resource Manager Lists</u>

Historic Consultant and Cultural Resource Manager Lists were created and adopted by the HRC for distribution to the public and applicants, on request. Individuals on the Historic Consultant List are qualified to produce listing forms for inclusion in the County's Historic Inventory, and for doing other types of historic investigation. Individuals on the Cultural Resource Manager List are those typically familiar with archeology and cultural resource protection.

t) <u>County Records Preservation</u>

The Commission pursued preservation of various historic County Records, at the request of the County Clerk and the Elections/Recorders Office Director. The Commission contacted both UCSC and the McPherson Center Museum of Art and History for their assistance. The Board of Supervisors passed a Resolution authorizing transferal of the records to UCSC, following passage of a HRC Resolution requesting the Board to pursue this course of action, with media coverage and considerable involvement by the HRC, County Clerk and HRC Staff.

x) <u>CLG Grant Aoolication</u>

A Subcommittee of the Commission was charged with preparation of a 1998 CLG Grant Application, but could not complete a product, given the short and conflicting time lines provided by the State.

8. Recommendations

a) <u>Historic Resources Inventory</u>.

Extensive amendments to the Historic Inventory were adopted by the Board of Supervisors in 1996. As a result of this process, many follow-up activities such as survey form corrections, historic research, recordation, etc. have been identified as future work items.

b) Cost Recovery Fees.

Consideration should be given by the County to charging a minimal fee to recover some of the costs associated with the nominating of structures to the inventory or the processing of an application involving Historic Re- 104 source Commission review.

c) Incentives in Support of Historic Preservation

Implement the General Plan policy dealing with the provision of incentives for historic preservation.

c) <u>CLG Participation</u>.

Continue participation in the Certified Local Government Program This enables the Commission to foster ties with the State Historic Preservation Office and National Trust for Historic Preservation, keep apprised of State and Federal legislative changes and Court legal rulings, and compete for grants.

d) <u>CLG Grant Award.</u>

Seek and obtain a 1999 CLG grant award. Funds could address a variety of Commission needs, including consultant services, training and resources.

e) <u>"L" (Landmark) zoning</u>.

Ensure that all listed resources in the Historic Inventory carry the "L" Landmark suffix zoning, and can be readily referenced by the County's GIS database system
