AUGMENTATION TO CHILD WELFARE SERVICES INDEPENDENT LIVING SKILLS PROGRAM

Dear Members of the Board:

The State Department of Social Services has recently increased its allocation of funds to the Human Resources Agency (HRA) for the Independent Living Skills Program (ILSP). The ILSP provides services to prepare foster youth to live independently after they age out of the foster care system. The increased allocation is designed to expand services to all eligible foster care youth up to age 21. The purpose of this letter is to request your Board's acceptance of unanticipated revenue associated with this augmentation as well as the addition of one position and purchase of fixed assets required for the implementation of program activities.

Independent Living Skills Program (ILSP)

As you know, the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) annually allocates Title IV-E dollars to individual counties in order to provide life skills education and services to foster youth ages 16 to 2 1. These monies allow the County to operate an Independent Living Skills Program.

In the County's current ILSP, an Employment Training Specialist II (ETS II) works collaboratively with Adult Family and Children's Services social workers, the Careerworks/JTPA Division and the County Probation Department to provide a continuum of services to youth. Services include; individualized assessment and direct case management; independent living skills classes providing youth with knowledge about securing a job, money management, making decisions and choices, and building self-esteem; skills training; and financial assistance with college or vocational schools. There are strong links to the community in order to provide mentorships, employment training, and scholastic improvement. ILSP works closely with the Independent Living Program at Cabrillo Community College, which is a state contracted companion program that focuses on college and career preparation.

Augmentation to Child Welfare Services, Independent Living Skills Program

The ILSP provides valuable and effective services to foster youth. However, due to limited resources and staffing, the program is not always able to provide outreach and services to reach all eligible foster youth in the County. Therefore, a top priority is to expand the program in order to make it accessible to all eligible youth, so they can live independently after they exit the foster care system.

The County has been notified that the ILSP allocation would be \$100,410 more than anticipated in the 1998/99 County budget. All funds provided in this allocation can be utilized without a County match. It is anticipated that the increased ILSP allocation will become a permanent part of the County's ILSP funding from the State and Federal Government.

As a result of the increased ILSP allocation, we now have the opportunity to add much needed staffing and other resources to enhance services and increase accessibility particularly to youth in South County. HRA maximizes the increased funding for services through an agreement with Careerworks/JTPA for direct services. HRA has developed the following proposal for the utilization of increased ILSP funds.

ILSP Position to be Added

The added position will be fully funded by the ILSP allocation and represent no new county cost.

• 1.0 FTE Employment Training Specialist II- to provide comprehensive educational, vocational employment and other independent living skills services to eligible youth in accordance with State and Federal guidelines. This position will be located in Watsonville in order to increase program participation and enhance accessibility in South county.

ILSP Fixed Assets and Other Operating Costs

In addition to the position listed above, increased operational costs and fixed assets are needed to enhance ILSP operations. A Laptop computer is needed to enable the additional ETS II to perform data entry to the Child Welfare Services/Case Management System (CWS/CMS). Operational costs and fixed assets will be funded by the ILSP allocation, at no additional county cost. I-IRA is requesting approval to purchase the following fixed asset:

1 Laptop computer equipped for CWS/CMS

\$4,000

The remainder of the augmented allocation will be utilized for associated costs of enhanced ILSP activities such as mentorships, incentives and academic tutoring.

Conclusion

The funding allocation for the Independent Living Skills Program provides Santa Cruz County with much needed resources to strengthen services for foster children who are aging out of the system and require special educational and life skill services, so that they can successfully transition to independent living. At this time, HRA requests your Board's approval to accept and appropriate revenue allocated by the State and to take related actions necessary in order to implement these activities.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that your Board:

- 1. Adopt the attached resolution accepting and appropriating \$48,238 in unanticipated revenue into the Social Services 392100-budget index;
- 2. Adopt the attached resolution accepting and appropriating \$52,172 in unanticipated revenue into the Careerworks/JTPA 396000-budget index;
- 3. Approve the 'addition of 1 .O FTE ETS II to the Human Resources Agency Careerworks/JTPA 396000- budget index, and
- 4. Approve the purchase of fixed assets in the amount of \$4,000.
