EMPLOYEE PRESENTATIONS: SECOND HARVEST FOOD DRIVE AND COMBINED GIVING CAMPAIGN

Dear Members of the Board:

As you are aware, your Board has established two programs that are enthusiastically supported by County employees--the Second Harvest Food Bank Holiday Food Drive and the Combined Giving Campaign. This letter summarizes the results of these programs and recommends that your Board acknowledge the departmental coordinators for their efforts.

Second Harvest Food Bank Holiday Food Drive

For the past eight years, SEIU Local 4 15, the Mid-Management Association and Executive Management have combined in a joint venture to support the Second Harvest Food Bank Holiday Food Drive. The Second Harvest Food Bank is a private nonprofit organization that distributes food to 100 charitable programs serving more than 36,000 people per month.

SEIU distributes donation bags to all of its members to assist employees in bringing in food donations and this year also contributed \$100. The Mid-Management Association contributed \$500 and Executive Management helped coordinate the barrel distribution and brown bag distribution to the other employees.

Again this year departmental coordinators took on the task of coordinating the Food Drive effort at the departmental level. While the County had set a goal of 20,000 pounds, the incredible generosity of County employees resulted in contributions totaling 27,475 pounds, which includes 8,374 pounds in direct food donations and \$6,367 in monetary donations that the Food Bank counts triple in pounds.

Combined Giving Campaign

During the past twelve years the County has conducted its charitable contribution efforts through a Combined Giving Campaign. The federations that participate in the County program are: Combined Health Appeal of California, Cultural Council of Santa Cruz County, Earth Share of California and United Way of Santa Cruz County. The federations represent hundreds of nonprofit agencies and allow our employees to direct their contributions to their preferred agencies.

Each year the federations work with the County Campaign Director (a department head), the County Campaign Coordinator (a designated staff member), and the departmental coordinators to organize the campaign. The departmental coordinators conduct departmental information meetings and process the donation/pledge registrations.

It is a pleasure to report that the 1998 Combined Giving Campaign was a tremendous success. This year County employees pledged/donated a total of \$69,133, an 18.8% increase over 1997's total of \$58,186. Additionally, we wish to thank the Human Resources Agency for providing the designated staff person to serve as the County Coordinator in recent years.

I am pleased to recommend that your Board present proclamations to:

- 1. Departmental coordinators who led the County to win a Gold Award for collecting 27,475 pounds of food to support residents of Santa Cruz County;
- 2. Departmental coordinators who led the County to an 18.8% increase in pledges/donations, for a total of \$69,133 for the 1998 Combined Giving Campaign; and
- 3. Combined Giving Campaign Coordinators and support staff who managed the campaign efforts from 1992-1997.


