Subject: 1999 TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT ACTIVITIES (TEA)

PROJECT SUBMITTAL

Dear Board Members:

The Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission is requesting applications for eligible projects for federal Transportation Enhancement Activities (TEA) grant funding. The TEA funds will be allocated over a six-year period from 1998/1 999 through 2003/2004. Approximately \$2,000,000 in funds will be made available to local agencies in the County. A minimum twelve percent non-federal match is required for each project submittal. The Health Services Agency is proposing to submit an application for grant funding. The complete application will be placed on file with the Clerk of the Board on or before April 13, 1999.

HSA is submitting a Pedestrian and Bicyclist Safety Education Project. This project would primarily serve elementary school students in the Watsonville and City of Santa Cruz areas. While other areas of Santa Cruz County experience fewer pedestrian injuries and fatalities per 100,000 population compared to the state, Watsonville and the City of Santa Cruz have more than twice the state's rate of injuries and fatalities. The Health Services Agency will conduct bilingual pedestrian safety presentations and activities in schools with every other year focusing on bicycle safety. The project will also work with the Community Traffic Safety Coalition to assist with implementing a Safe Routes to School/Walking School Bus campaign by conducting outreach to monolingual and bilingual Spanish-speaking parents. The project will fund a 0.8 FTE Health Program

Specialist and related supplies and materials. The total project cost over the period of the grant, including the required match, is approximately \$289,000. The 12% match will come from HSA funds.

It is therefore recommended that your Board:

- 1. Adopt the attached resolution to authorize the Health Services Agency to submit an application in the approximate amount of \$289,000 for a multi-year pedestrian and bicycle safety project to the Santa Cruz Regional Transportation Commission; and
- 2. Direct the Clerk of the Board to return one certified copy of the resolution for the Health Services Agency to forward to the Santa Cruz Regional Transportation Commission for inclusion in the application package.
