I am retired after spending 26 years in the insurance industry as Administration Manager for the Aetna Life and Casualty. During that period 1967-1992 my efforts were directed at raising a family and earning a living. I did not have the time, experience or desire to get involved in civic activities, even though I realized what a difference the dedication of community members could make in the communities we live in.

Since retiring I have had the time and opportunity to get involved and commit my energies towards making a difference in the community I choose to be a member of I have done this by serving on the Portola Heights Homeowner's Assoc. for two terms, this term as president. Portola Heights is an all-age mobile home park with 118 sites. I have seen the need for active involvement **from** publishing a monthly newsletter to educating and gaining support for Watsonville's Rent Control Ordinance.

I am a founding member of the Watsonville Community Posse and presently serving as Secretary/Treasurer. I did the filing to establish the Posse as a non-profit organization at the state and federal level. The goal of the Posse is to assist **the** Police Dept. and make Watsonville a better place to live and work and raise a family.

I am realistic enough to know that any one of these organizations is not going to solve all the problems that face a community be it a neighborhood, city or county. I am ambitious and know that I can do my part in any of these activities.

Affordable housing is desperately needed in the Watsonville community and mobile home living can be a partial answer to this need. If it is to serve as a viable means to provide affordable living, it must overcome the stigmas associated with this life style.

Controlling space rental in parks is desperately needed. There are rent control ordinances in the county and the cities but they are continually under attack. In a community such as Watsonville where many of the tenants are Hispanic and many speak little or no English, much education is needed and government officials must be made aware of the needs of the mobile home community. This can only be done by volunteers willing to stand up and be counted as proud and educated on the issues of the mobile home community.

Yes, I feel I am qualified to serve on the Mobilehome commission and would be proud to do so.
