1999/2000 AB 2766 MOTOR VEHICLE EMISSIONS SUBJECT:

REDUCTION GRANT PROGRAM

Members of the Board:

In 1990 Assembly Bill (AB) 2766 was passed by the California Legislature and signed into law by Governor Pete Wilson. This law allows air pollution control districts to add surcharge fees to motor vehicle registration fees for funding of local projects that reduce air pollution from motor vehicles, and for related planning, design, construction, and monitoring programs that serve to implement the California Clean Air Act of 1988. The Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District (MBUAPCD) is responsible for the administration of the AB 2766 Grant Program and the disbursement of surcharge fees through the program.

In past years the MBUAPCD has awarded approximately \$400,000 to the Department of Public Works and the Redevelopment Agency for various projects throughout Santa Cruz County, such as construction of bike lanes, traffic signal improvements, and a pedestrian bridge. The purpose of this letter is to request your Board's approval for the submission of grant applications for projects that will be proposed in the 1999/2000 Road Budget. Based on program criteria, Public Works proposes to submit applications for the following two projects:

1. Holohan Road Bike Lane Project - Phase II: If the County receives the grant, the funds will be used to construct Class II bike lanes on Holohan Road from Green Valley Road to Grimmer Road (Roy Wilson Yard). The department is recommending this project because it fulfills a community demand on Holohan Road for bike lanes in the south county; provides for improved operations by widening the shoulder of the roadway; addresses the Bicycle Committee's highest priority project; and provides for air quality improvements. Attachment 1 is a location map for the project.

The second phase of the Holohan Road Bike Lane Project is estimated to cost \$285,000. The grant request will be for approximately \$150,000 with the remaining funds proposed to come from other grant programs, Pajaro Valley Transportation Improvement Area (TIA) fees, and Transportation Development Act **funds**.

2. Soquel Drive/Freedom Boulevard/Aptos High School Signal Project: This grant submittal would help to finance the upgrade of the signal controller at the Freedom Boulevard and Aptos High School intersection and the interconnection of this signal with a future traffic signal at the Freedom Boulevard and Soquel Drive intersection. The new controller and signal interconnect will reduce motorist delays and improve air quality at this critical, high-traffic mid-county location. Attachment 2 is a location map for the project.

The combined Freedom Boulevard signal project is scheduled to be built in the fall of 1999, with a project cost estimated at \$380,000. The grant request will be for \$40,000. The remaining project costs are proposed to be financed by Aptos TIA fees and County Service Area 9 Highway and Safety Lighting **funds**.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors take the following action:

- 1. Adopt the attached resolution approving the proposed filing of two grant applications to the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District.
- 2. Appoint John A. Fantham, Director of Public Works, and the Department of Public Works, administrating agency applicant to execute and submit all documents which may be necessary for the completion of the projects.

WHEREAS, Santa Cruz County has various projects proposed within the 1999/2000 Road Budget that would allow a significant improvement to vehicular emissions.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz:




HOLDHAN ROAD BIKE LANES PHASE II
