
SUBJECT: BUDGET HEARING SCHEDULE

SUBJECT: SOQUEL DRIVE BRIDGE AND SOQUEL CREEK HYDROLOGY STUDY

Members of the Board:

This past year the County received a Hazard Mitigation grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (**FEMA**) for the replacement of the Soquel Drive Bridge at Soquel Creek. In approving the grant, FEMA acknowledged that the existing structure was a flood hazard and has now authorized the County to begin the design phase of the project. Along with other local match monies from Transportation Improvement Funds, the Redevelopment Agency and the Road Budget, funds for this project were also included in the approved 1998/99 Zone 5 Expansion/Construction Budget.

The Department of Public Works has negotiated a contract with the firm of **Buckland** and Taylor to prepare a design for the new bridge. Included in its proposal is a separate hydrology study to be performed by the firm of Northwest Hydraulic Consultants. However, since approximately half of its hydrology study would address important issues downstream from the bridge, this part of the study will not be eligible for FEMA assistance. As a result, funding for this supplemental study will need to come **from** the Redevelopment Agency and Zone 5. Fortunately, adequate funding was included in the approved 1998/99 Zone 5 Expansion/Construction Budget that can be used for this purpose.


This contract is funded by Redevelopment **funds**. Redevelopment funds are being used because it has been determined that the study will be of benefit to the project area or the immediate neighborhood in which the study is located, that no other reasonable means of financing the study is available to the community, that completion of the study will assist in the elimination of blight, and that the study is consistent with the Redevelopment Agency's five year implementation plan.

The Board of Directors of the Redevelopment Agency is scheduled to approve the expenditure of funds necessary for this contract on May 18, 1999.

It is therefore recommended that the Zone 5 Board of Directors take the following action:

1. Make findings that the study is of benefit to the project area or the immediate neighborhood in which the project is located, that no other reasonable means of financing the study is available to the community, that completion of the study will assist in the elimination of blight, and that the study is consistent with the Redevelopment Agency's five year implementation plan.
2. Authorize the use of up to \$20,000 from the Zone 5 Expansion/Construction Budget budget for the supplemental hydrology study of the creek downstream from the Soquel Drive Bridge.
3. Approve the contract with Northwest Hydraulic Consultants for a not-to-exceed amount of \$57,894.
4. Authorize the District Engineer to sign the contract on behalf of the County.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

THIS CONTRACT is entered into this _____ day of _____ 1999, by and between the COUNTY OF SANTA CRUZ FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, ZONE 5, hereinafter called COUNTY, and NORTHWEST HYDRAULIC CONSULTANTS, INC., hereinafter called CONTRACTOR. The parties agree as follows:

1. DUTIES. CONTRACTOR agrees to exercise special skill to accomplish the following result: PROVIDE CONSULTING SERVICES FOR THE HYDROLOGIC, HYDRAULIC, AND GEOMORPHIC STUDY OF SOQUEL CREEK.
2. COMPENSATION. In consideration for CONTRACTOR accomplishing said result, COUNTY agrees to pay CONTRACTOR as follows: THE TOTAL AMOUNT SHALL NOT EXCEED \$57,894.00 (SEE ATTACHMENT 1, SCOPE OF WORK AND FEE SCHEDULE).
3. TERM. The term of this contract shall be: FROM APPROVAL OF CONTRACT THROUGH COMPLETION OF STUDY.
4. EARLY TERMINATION. Either party hereto may terminate this contract at any time by giving 30 days written notice to the other party.
5. INDEMNIFICATION FOR DAMAGES, TAXES AND CONTRIBUTIONS. CONTRACTOR shall exonerate, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless COUNTY (which for the purpose of paragraphs 5 and 6 shall include, without limitation, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers) from and against:
 - A. Any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, defense costs, or liability of any kind or nature which COUNTY may sustain or incur or which may be imposed upon it for injury to or death of persons, or damage to property as a result of, arising out of, or in any manner connected with the CONTRACTOR'S negligent performance under the terms of this Agreement. Such indemnification includes any damage to the person(s), or **property(ies)** of CONTRACTOR and third persons.
 - B. Any and all Federal, State and Local taxes, charges, fees, or contributions required to be paid with respect to CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S officers, employees and agents engaged in the performance of this Agreement (including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, social security and payroll tax withholding).
6. INSURANCE. CONTRACTOR at its sole cost and expense, for the full term of this Agreement (and any extensions thereof), shall obtain and maintain at a minimum compliance with all of the following insurance coverage(s) and requirements. Such insurance coverage shall be primary coverage as respects COUNTY and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by County shall be excess of CONTRACTOR'S insurance coverage and shall not contribute to it.

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If CONTRACTOR utilizes one or more subcontractors in the performance of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall obtain and maintain Independent Contractor's Insurance as to each subcontractor or otherwise provide evidence of insurance coverage for each subcontractor equivalent to that required of CONTRACTOR in this Agreement, unless CONTRACTOR and COUNTY both initial here ____/____.

A. Types of Insurance and Minimum Limits

(1) Worker's Compensation in the minimum statutorily required coverage amounts. This insurance coverage shall not be required if the CONTRACTOR has no employees and certifies to this fact by initialing here _____

(2) Automobile Liability Insurance for each of CONTRACTOR's vehicles used in the performance of this Agreement, including owned, non-owned (e.g. owned by CONTRACTOR's employees), leased or hired vehicles, in the minimum amount of \$500,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. This insurance coverage shall not be required if vehicle use by CONTRACTOR is not a material part of performance of this Agreement and CONTRACTOR and COUNTY both certify to this fact by initialing here - ____/____.

(3) Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance coverage in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit, including coverage for: (a) bodily injury, (b) personal injury, (c) broad-form property damage, (d) contractual liability, and (e) cross-liability.

(4) Professional Liability Insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit, ~~if~~, and only ~~if~~, this Subparagraph is initialed by CONTRACTOR and COUNTY ____/____.

B. Other Insurance Provisions

(1) If any insurance coverage required in this Agreement is provided on a "Claims Made" rather than "Occurrence" form, CONTRACTOR agrees to maintain the required coverage for a period of three (3) years after the expiration of this Agreement (~~hereinafter~~ "post agreement coverage") and any extensions thereof CONTRACTOR may maintain the required post agreement coverage by renewal or purchase of prior acts or tail coverage. This provision is contingent upon post agreement coverage being both available and reasonably affordable in relation to the coverage provided during the term of this Agreement. For purposes of interpreting this requirement, a cost not exceeding 100% of the last annual policy premium during the term of this Agreement in order to purchase prior acts or tail coverage for post agreement coverage shall be deemed to be reasonable.

(2) All required Automobile and Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance shall be endorsed to contain the following clause:

"The County of Santa Cruz, Zone 5, and the Live Oak Soquel Redevelopment Agency, their officials, employees, agents and volunteers are added as an additional insured as respects the operations and activities of, or on behalf of, the named insured performed under Agreement with the County of Santa Cruz, Zone 5, and the Live Oak Soquel Redevelopment Agency."

(3) All required insurance policies shall be endorsed to contain the following clause:

“This insurance shall not be canceled until after thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to: JOHN A. FANTHAM

(4) CONTRACTOR agrees to provide its insurance broker(s) with a full copy of these insurance provisions and provide COUNTY on or before the effective date of this Agreement with Certificates of Insurance for all required coverages. All Certificates of Insurance shall be delivered or sent to: JOHN A. FANTHAM

7. EOUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY. During and in relation to the performance of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:

A. The CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancer related), marital status, pregnancy, sex, sexual orientation, age (over 18), veteran status or any other non-merit factor unrelated to job duties. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: recruitment; advertisiig; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training (including apprenticeship), employment, upgrading, demotion, transfer. The CONTRACTOR agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notice setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.

B. If this Agreement provides compensation in excess of \$50,000 to CONTRACTOR and if CONTRACTOR employs fifteen (15) or more employees, the following requirements shall apply:

(1) The CONTRACTOR shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancer related), marital status, pregnancy, sex, sexual orientation, age (over 18), veteran status, or any other non-merit factor unrelated to job duties. In addition, the CONTRACTOR shall make a good faith effort to consider Minority/Women/Disabled Owned Business Enterprises in CONTRACTOR's solicitation of goods and services. Definitions for Minority/Women/Disabled Business Enterprises are available from the COUNTY General Services Purchasing Division.

(2) The CONTRACTOR shall furnish COUNTY Affirmative Action Office information and reports in the prescribed reporting format (PER 40 12) identifying the sex, race, physical or mental disability and job classification of its employees and the names, dates and methods of advertisement and direct solicitation efforts made to subcontract with Minority/Women/Disabled Business Enterprises.

(3) In the event of the CONTRACTOR'S non-compliance with the non-discrimination clauses of this Agreement or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders said CONTRACTOR may be declared ineligible for further agreements with the COUNTY.

(4) The CONTRACTOR shall cause the foregoing provisions of this Subparagraph 7B. to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered under this Agreement by a subcontractor compensated more than \$50,000 and employing more than fifteen (15) employees, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.

8. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS. CONTRACTOR and COUNTY have reviewed and considered the principal test and secondary factors below and agree that CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor and not an employee of COUNTY. CONTRACTOR is responsible for all insurance (workers compensation, unemployment, etc.) and all payroll related taxes. CONTRACTOR is not entitled to any employee benefits. COUNTY agrees that CONTRACTOR shall have the right to control the manner and means of accomplishing the result contracted for herein.

PRINCIPAL TEST: The CONTRACTOR rather than COUNTY has the right to control the manner and means of accomplishing the result contracted for.

SECONDARY FACTORS: (a) The extent of control which, by agreement, COUNTY may exercise over the details of the work is slight rather than substantial; (b) CONTRACTOR is engaged in a distinct occupation or business; (c) In the locality, the work to be done by CONTRACTOR is usually done by a specialist without supervision, rather than under the direction of an employer; (d) the skill required in the particular occupation is substantial rather than slight; (e) The CONTRACTOR rather than the COUNTY supplies the instrumentalities, tools and work place; (f) The length of time for which CONTRACTOR is engaged is of limited duration rather than indefinite; (g) The method of payment of CONTRACTOR is by the job rather than by the time; (h) The work is part of a special or permissive activity, program, or project, rather than part of the regular business of COUNTY; (i) CONTRACTOR and COUNTY believe they are creating an independent contractor relationship rather than an employer-employee relationship; and (j) The COUNTY conducts public business.

It is recognized that it is not necessary that all secondary factors support creation of an independent contractor relationship, but rather that overall there are significant secondary factors which indicate that CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor.

By their signatures to this Agreement, each of the undersigned certifies that it is his or her considered judgment that the CONTRACTOR engaged under this Agreement is in fact an independent contractor.

9. CONTRACTOR represents that its operations are in compliance with applicable County planning, environmental and other laws or regulations.

10. CONTRACTOR is responsible to pay prevailing wages and maintain records as required by Labor Code Section 1770 and following.

11. NONASSIGNMENT. CONTRACTOR shall not assign this agreement without the prior written consent of the COUNTY.

12. RETENTION AND AUDIT OF RECORDS. CONTRACTOR shall retain records pertinent to this Agreement for a period of not less than five (5) years after final payment under this Agreement or until a final audit report is accepted by COUNTY, whichever occurs first. CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to be subject to the examination and audit by the Santa Cruz County Auditor-Controller, the Auditor General of the State of California, or the designee of either for a period of five (5) years after final payment under this Agreement.

13. PRESENTATION OF CLAIMS. Presentation and processing of any or all claims arising out of or related to **this** Agreement shall be made in accordance with the provisions contained in Chapter 1.05 of the Santa Cruz County Code, which by this reference is incorporated herein.

14. ATTACHMENTS. This Agreement includes the following attachments: SCOPE OF WORK AND FEE SCHEDULE DATED APRIL 6, 1999.



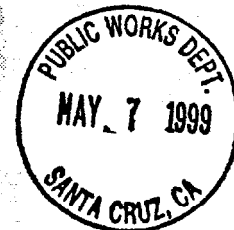

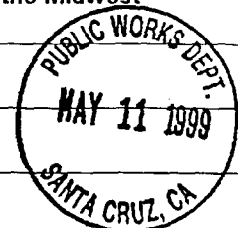

Per our recent telephone conversations, Northwest Hydraulic Consultants (nhc) has separated the hydrologic, hydraulic, and geomorphic study of Soquel Creek into two projects. The first project includes only those items in the immediate vicinity of the bridge. For that project, nhc will work as a subconsultant to Buckland & Taylor. The second project, an overall analysis of the stream, includes all remaining items of the study, and for this project nhc will contract directly with Santa Cruz County.

As we have discussed in past conversations, these two projects must occur at the same time. While we can separate the overall project into two distinct smaller projects for accounting purposes, there are tasks in each project that are necessary for the other project to proceed. Neither project can be successfully started without the other project.

Included with this letter is a scope of work for the stream analysis project and a detailed cost estimate for the project. The scope of work and cost estimate include survey work which will be performed by DeWitt and Associates. The cost estimate for the survey work is based on a detailed cost estimate that Robert DeWitt sent to you on March 31, 1999. The survey cost estimate has been increased \$150 to include any direct expenses that the surveyors may have and has been increased 5% to cover associated costs that nhc will incur while administering the contract for the work.

Scope of Work

Soquel Drive Bridge Project Hydrologic, Hydraulic & Geomorphic Studies

1. **Review Literature** – Review previously conducted hydrologic, hydraulic, and geomorphic studies of Soquel Creek. This will include reviewing specific studies in the area of Soquel Village, and general studies of the entire basin. This review will determine the amount of data available which can be used for the analysis of Soquel Creek. The review will also determine where specific data necessary for the analysis of channel modifications related to the Soquel Drive bridge replacement project is lacking and thus what will need to be provided by the new analysis.
2. **Meetings** – Attend meetings with Santa Cruz County staff and public meetings.
 - a. **County Staff** – Attend meetings with Santa Cruz County Public Works and Planning Department staff. An initial meeting, held prior to analysis, will ensure that the analysis will include all related items necessary for the design and construction of the bridge. The initial meeting will also provide NHC with any pertinent information that Santa Cruz County staff has obtained regarding hydrology, hydraulics, or **geomorphology** of Soquel Creek which does not appear in any of the published literature. Meetings held after the analysis has begun should coincide with 30 percent and 90 percent completion of the project design. These later meetings will provide opportunities to review and discuss the analysis performed by NHC, ensure that all items necessary for the analysis and design of the stream modifications have been covered, and update the stream analysis with any changes that have occurred as a result of the bridge project design.
 - b. **Public** – Attend **two** public meetings during the design of the project. These meetings should coincide with 30 percent and 90 percent completion of the project design. Prepare visual aids related to the hydrologic, hydraulic, and geomorphic analyses for the meetings. Explain the findings of the hydrologic, hydraulic and geomorphic analyses and answer related questions that the public may have. Document any pertinent comments provided by private citizens during the meetings and incorporate this information into the hydrologic and hydraulic analysis.
3. **Survey** – Conduct a survey of the creek channel from the Porter Street bridge to approximately 250 meters upstream of the Soquel Drive bridge. Where possible, channel cross sections will be surveyed at locations with historic data to allow comparison of channel geometry and assist in determining channel stability. If **necessary**, some points in the floodplain will also be surveyed to supplement the data provided on the existing contour maps of the floodplain. All survey data will be input into AutoCAD files to facilitate multiple uses of the data (e.g., hydraulic modeling, geomorphic analysis, floodplain mapping) and long term accessibility.
4. **Geomorphic Assessment** – Assess the stability of the creek channel and future woody debris recruitment potential.
 - a. **Channel Stability** – Analyze Soquel Creek from approximately 1 kilometer upstream of Soquel Drive to the mouth of the creek for historic lateral and vertical stability. A

qualitative assessment of future trends in channel stability will be provided. The analysis will be done by reviewing current and historic aerial photographs, maps, channel cross sections, and geologic records, by reviewing data collected in Tasks 1 and 2, and by inspecting the site. NHC will coordinate with the geotechnical subconsultant for the bridge design project to obtain borings of the stream bank material and gradations of the channel bed material as necessary for this task.

- b. **Woody Debris Recruitment** – Provide a reconnaissance level assessment of future woody debris recruitment by the creek as a result of lateral movement of the creek or geologic processes in the watershed. This assessment will be accomplished by reviewing the same materials used for the channel stability analysis. The woody debris recruitment assessment will help identify the potential for future log jams at Soquel Drive for each the proposed bridge alternatives.
- c. **Channel Modifications** – Develop recommendations for modifications to the channel in the general vicinity of the bridge. The intent of these modifications will be to create a stable channel based on geomorphic characteristics observed during the review of Soquel Creek.

5. Hydrologic Analysis – Develop an updated flood frequency curve for Soquel Creek at the Soquel Drive Bridge. Gather all peak flow data from the USGS stream gage (#11160000) located just downstream of the project site. Determine the flow at the bridge for floods with a recurrence interval of 2, 5, 10, 30, 50, and 100 years. Compare this flood frequency curve with those that have been previously developed by FEMA, the Corps of Engineers, and other studies of Soquel Creek.

6. Hydraulic Analysis – Analyze the hydraulics of Soquel Creek in the vicinity of the project.

- a. **Develop Geometric Data** – Use surveyed cross sections to develop channel geometry for hydraulic modeling. Use existing aerial photo contour maps to determine floodplain geometry for hydraulic modeling. If necessary, use surveyed spot elevations at critical locations in the floodplain to supplement data from the existing aerial photo contour maps when developing floodplain geometry for hydraulic modeling.
- b. **Channel Modifications** -Modify the hydraulic model input data to simulate modifications to the creek channel that would improve hydraulic conveyance. Channel modifications include reducing vegetation in the channel and changing the channel geometry. Changes to channel geometry would include making the channel at critical locations in the general vicinity of the bridge match typical stable channel geometry of Soquel Creek as determined by the geomorphic analysis. Changes to channel geometry will also include creating channel configurations that provide more hydraulic conveyance than the existing channel geometry. Compare the hydraulics of the creek upstream and downstream of the bridge crossing with no channel modifications in place to those of the creek with the various channel modifications in place to determine the benefits of modifying the channel.
- c. **Woody Debris** – Evaluate the ability of the proposed bridges to convey the type of woody debris commonly found in Soquel Creek during peak flows. If blockage of the proposed bridge opening will occur from woody debris, determine for each proposed bridge alternative the increased water surface elevation due to blockage at various flow

rates. If the proposed bridges are determined to pass the woody debris, evaluate downstream bridges for potential of catching woody debris and creating log jams.

- d. **Flood Storage** – Determine the flood storage capacity upstream of the Soquel Drive Bridge and how it may be affected if hydraulic conveyance through the bridge is improved by the proposed bridge alternatives. Primarily this **will** determine if the flow rate will increase downstream of the bridge due to elimination of woody debris jams at the bridge during a flood. If flow rates increase downstream of the Soquel Drive Bridge, determine the impacts caused by the increased flow.
 - e. **Floodplains** – For the existing conditions and for the preferred bridge alternative, determine a detailed boundary for the 30, 50, and 100 year recurrence interval floods from the Highway 1 bridge to a few hundred meters upstream of the project. For all other alternatives, develop an approximate boundary for the 30, 50, and 100 year recurrence interval floods. The detailed boundaries for the existing conditions and the approximate boundaries for all design alternatives will be developed prior to selection of a preferred alternative. The detailed boundary for the preferred alternative will be developed for the 90 percent project design review. The detailed boundaries **will** accurately show the floodplain locations, but will not be as highly detailed as Flood Insurance Rate Studies.
7. **Documentation** – Prepare reports and maps that document the various analyses performed in the above tasks.
- a. **Reports** – Prepare a report that discusses all of the hydrologic, hydraulic, and geomorphic analyses performed. Include a summary of the findings and also detailed data from the various analyses in the report. Submit an administrative draft for review by Santa Cruz County at 30 percent completion of the project design. Revise the report based on comments from Santa Cruz County. Submit a draft for public review at 90 percent completion of the project design. Revise the report based on comments from the public and comments from Santa Cruz County.
 - b. **Maps** – For the existing conditions and for the preferred alternative, develop detailed maps of the floodplain for the 30, 50, and 100 year recurrence interval floods for the area from the Highway 1 Bridge to a few hundred meters upstream of the Soquel Drive Bridge. For all other alternatives, develop maps of the approximate floodplain for the 30, 50, and 100 year recurrence interval floods. The detailed maps for the existing conditions and the approximate maps for all design alternatives will be developed prior to selection of a preferred alternative. The detailed maps for the preferred alternative will be developed for the 90 percent project design review.-The detailed maps will accurately show the floodplain boundaries, but will not be as highly detailed as Flood Insurance Rate Study maps.
 - c. **Environmental Documents** – Assist the environmental subconsultant in preparing the necessary environmental documents. Provide hydrologic, hydraulic, and geomorphic data, which may not be part of the engineering design but is required for environmental documentation, to the environmental subconsultant upon request.
