

To the Board of Supervisors:

Please consider my application to the "Children and Families First" Commission for Santa Cruz County. I have worked directly with the Latino children and parents of South County since 1976. I worked as a Family Advocate for Head Start in Beach Flats and Watsonville, taught Child Development in Spanish at Cabrillo College for twelve years, and for the last four years I was a program director with regular contact with migrant families. Currently I am a monitor and trainer for the two local Migrant Head Start programs.

I am a Portuguese-American, middle-aged, married mother of three teenagers, the daughter of immigrants from the Azores Islands. Some groups consider me a Latina, others do not; the official classification changes with the decades. Therefore to be cautious, do not select me to guarantee ethnic. diversity.

I do have direct contact with many Latinas employed in childcare programs via my work with Migrant Head Start and my teaching at Cabrillo. I have conducted three Community Assessments of the local migrant community, involving both the parents and childcare providers. In 1995, I wrote a childcare plan for Pajaro Valley Community Development Corporation which--although never implemented by them--has been quoted by other community studies.

I am tri-lingual and have some of the skills necessary to communicate effectively with people of other cultures. I consider myself particularly effective in translating bureaucratic jargon into clear, useful language. I know how to collect data without using intimidating surveys.

Please call if you would like more information. Enclosed is my most recent resume. If you already have sufficient representation of the Latino community, please consider me for a committee to research the specific needs of the families of our agricultural workers.
