Portola Drive and 41st Avenue Improvement Project: **Bid Award**

Dear Members of the Board:

Or July 20, bids were received for the Portola Drive and Forty-First Avenue Improvement Project, with the start of construction scheduled for late summer. The Department of Public Works subsequently reviewed bid proposals and, in a separate letter on this agenda, is lasking the Board of Supervisors to accept the low bid from Granite Construction Company of Watsonville in the amount of \$1, 528,528, and to authorize award of the associated construction contract. In order for the necessary funds for construction to be available a parallel action is required from you, as the Board of Directors for the Redevelopment Agency.

This project has been developed over a five year period of planning and cooperation with he Peasure Point community, which has included the adoption of the Pleasure Point Commercial Area Plan by your Board in 1995, and the approval of the route concept for Portola Drive in 1998. The project is designed to balance a number of important objectives including improved access and safety for pedestrians and bicycles, as well as improved traffic circulation, parking, and beautification. Project improvements include the construction of readway, sidewalk, street lighting, landscaping, and drainage improvements on Portola Drive between 26th Avenue and 41st Avenue, and on 41st Avenue from Portola Drive up to the cty limit line of the City of Capitola. The final plans and specifications for this project were approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 22, 1999.

The project is being financed through several funding sources, including the Recevelopment Agency's project budget, the State Transportation Improvement Program STP) funds, Transportation Development Act (TDA) funds, and the County Road budget. The Redevelopment Agency's share of the cost for the construction contract of the project, incliding overhead and contingency, is \$1,155,404.40

Funds for this project have been set aside in Index 611185, however, it will be necessary to transfer funds from the Agency's reserves to award this contract. As the project evolved over the years, not only have construction costs increased, but the project scope has expanded, and it was anticipated that additional funds for the project would be needed at the time the contract was awarded. In addition, the low bid for the project is approximately \$200,000 over the Engineer's cost estimate. This may be partially explained by a very active construction industry in which qualified construction companies with sufficient capacity to undertake projects of this scale are in high demand. In order for the project to move forward as planned, it will be necessary to transfer \$545,000 from the Renevelopment Agency's Reserve Fund. A Resolution authorizing that transfer is included as Attachment 1.

Redevelopment Agency staff has determined that the improvements planned in the Portola Drive and 41st Avenue Improvement Project are of benefit to the Project Area, that no other reasonable means of financing the improvements are available to the community, that the project will assist in the elimination of blight, and that the project is consistent with the Redevelopment Agency's Five Year Implementation Plan.

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board, as the Board of Directors for the Redevelopment Agency, take the following actions:

Approve Agency funds totaling \$1,155,404.40 for the cost of the construction contract for the Portola Drive and Forty-First Avenue Improvement Project.

Approve the attached Resolution Accepting Unanticipated Revenue totaling \$545,000 from the Redevelopment Agency Capital Projects Bond Proceeds Reserves; and

Concur with and adopt the associated findings.
