Dear Chairperson Almquist and Members of the Board:

We are currently in the **proc** ess of re-applying to the State Board of Control (SBOC) for fiscal year 1999-2000 funding for our Victims of Crime compensation program and to the Office of Criminal Justice Planning for funding to operate our Victim/Witness Assistance Center. In the upcoming fiscal year, Santa Cruz County is eligible to receive \$188,974 from SBOC to implement the crime victim compensation program under the Joint Powers Agreement, which finances the salary, benefits and operating expenses of the Victim-Witness Assistance Center compensation claims staff. In addition, I am including recovery of indirect overhead charges from SBOC. In this grant **staffing** and essential operating expenses, which are required for this program, leave sufficient funds available for the recovery of indirect overhead costs.

For operation of the Victim/Witness Assistance Center, \$187,518 is available from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning. The Victim/Witness Assistance Program which offers financial, emotional and informational assistance to victims and witnesses of crime in Santa Cruz County. These services are fully funded by revenues from the State Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP). Staffing and essential operating expenses required by the program leave sufficient funds available for the recovery of indirect overhead costs.

- Adopt a Resolution authorizing the District Attorney to reapply to the State Office of Criminal Justice Planning for funding for operation of the Victim/Witness Assistance Center;
- Include the requirement for the recovery of indirect costs from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning for the operation of the Victim-Witness Assistance Center in fiscal year 1999-2000 pursuant to County Procedure Section 900A.3; and
- Include the requirement for the recovery of indirect costs from the State Board of Control 4. for the operation of the Victim-Witness Assistance Center Victims of Crime compensation program in fiscal year 1999-2000, pursuant to County Procedure Section 900A.3.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that state funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant local funds that would, in the absence of the California Victim/Witness Assistance Program, be made available to support assistance to the victims of crime.

IT IS AGREED that any liability arising from the Center's operations or services rendered pursuant to this contract, including civil court actions for damages shall be the responsibility of the grantee and the authorizing agency, except that the State Board of Control shall be responsible for any and all damages arising from or connected with its acts or omissions under the contract.
