Re: BALLOT COUNTING BACKUP

Dear Members of the Board,

Ballot counting on election night is accomplished on the computer located in the Elections Department. Although it has been very reliable, the department desires a backup system in the event of hardware or software failure. Up until now a backup system was very costly, but our software vendor has recently made available a ballot counting system that can run on a PC. An added benefit is that it is portable and can be used to count ballots offsite, such as in Watsonville for the upcoming special elections being held in South County on November 2. Such a system costs approximately \$2,500. There are adequate funds in Office Supplies to pay for it.

The county purchased the existing ballot counting system in 1989, and it has been very reliable. In the last few years, however, one or two of our four card readers have failed to operate on election night. Luckily, the readers failed later in the evening and the vote tally was only delayed less than an hour. However, with the age of the system, the department has become increasingly concerned that the entire system could fail at the most inopportune time. The ballots could still be counted at a later time when the system was operational (or at Santa Clara County which has a similar system), but the candidates and voters would not take kindly to a delay of several hours or more. It would be more prudent to have an onsite backup.

An added benefit to a PC ballot counting system is that it is portable, allowing the department to easily move the ballot counting process when necessary during an emergency. Additionally, ballot counting can become more accessible to voters and other interested parties during smaller, special elections. For instance, during the recent Watsonville City election, the vendor provided the necessary hardware at no charge for counting the ballots in Watsonville. It was well received by the voters in that area as well as the city's officials. If the Board approves this purchase, it is anticipated the ballots for the upcoming election in South County on November 2 will also be counted in Watsonville. Security for the ballot counting PC, wherever it

is being used, will be the same as that for the computer currently maintained in the Elections Department.

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board approve the transfer of \$2,500 from Office Supplies to Equipment, and authorize the County Clerk to purchase a PC for ballot counting purposes.
