HISTORY LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES



The History Library is open Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from noon to five p.m.. Categories of research include: family, residential, commerce, and event history. Visitors access our service via telephone, mail, email, and on-site. The Museum's Librarian also facilitates monthly Researchers Anonymous discussions. The purpose of these meetings is to promote interest in local historical research.

The archive and collection contains:
