PLANNING DEPARTMENT ADVANCED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM FY 1999-2000

Members of the Board:

Each year, your Board reviews and approves the Work Program for the Advanced Planning Section of the Planning Department. The purpose of this review is for your Board to establish priorities and provide direction for various planning studies, special projects, and the development or revision of land use policies. In turn, the Planning Department allocates its limited resources for policy work in accordance with the approved Work Program.

Fiscal Year 1998-99 Work Program

On October 6, 1998, your Board approved the 1998-99 Work Program for the Planning Department's Advanced Planning Section. This Work Program included tasks covering a wide range of topics, from timber harvesting regulations to housing to non-conforming uses. A list of completed 1998-99 Work Program tasks is included as Attachment 1. Most notable of these is the processing of the timber harvesting regulations, various General Plan/Zoning corrections, the amendments to Chapter 17.10, the development of the RV Park Conversion Ordinance and the completion of the amendments to the Geologic Hazards Ordinance.

As reported to your Board on February 23, 1999, the Department's Work Program was affected by the requirements of the U. S. Census Bureau in preparation for the 2000 Census. **Staff was** required to prepare block, tract and County division population forecasts and to re-designate the boundaries of the blocks, tracts, etc. to conform to population ranges established by the Census Bureau. This task required an extensive commitment of staff time for several months to meet the exacting standards of the Census Bureau. In addition, County staff was designated as the coordinator for all of the cities' changes to their tracts and blocks.

Fiscal Year 1999 - 2000 Work Program

The proposed Advanced Planning Work Program for Fiscal year 1999-2000 (Attachment 2) includes a number of on-going tasks, continuing projects, recommended new projects, and a priority project, the development of a 'community plan' for the **Seacliff** area, which your Board directed be included in the proposed Work Program. A description of the recommended Work Program tasks and projects is presented below.

On-going Tasks (tasks which the Advanced Planning Section performs on an as-needed or regular basis)

- General Plan Consistency Review of Development Applications staff review of project applications for large projects (subdivisions, commercial, etc) or where a rezoning and/or General Plan amendments is requested
- General Plan/Local Coastal Program Amendment Rounds Coordination processing of General Plan/Local Coastal Program amendments, including preparation of submittals to the California Coastal Commission
- <u>Annexation Review/Inter-anency LAFCO coordination</u> review of all annexations before LAFCO
- <u>Historic Resource Commission</u> staff prepares agenda materials, responds to Commission requests, and processes all Commission paperwork
- <u>Landscaping project review</u> review of landscape plans for large residential and commercial projects
- <u>Inter-agency Technical Advisory Committee</u> participation in monthly meeting of advisory body to the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission
- <u>Census Ouestions</u> responding to demographic inquiries from the public and other County agencies
- Monterev Bav National Marine Sanctuary Scenic Trail Sub-committee participation in inter-agency trail planning committee, including administration of grants for development of sanctuary access
- <u>Growth Report</u> annual report regarding the growth goals for the coming year, including a recommended growth rate and a building permit allocation to implement that rate

Continuing Projects (projects previously assigned by your Board)

- Measure C Report the "decade of the Environment" ordinance required annual and **end**-of-decade reports assessing the progress in meeting the goals of the Measure;
- · Davenport Commercial Area Assistance limited staff assistance to town planning group
- <u>Census 2000</u> major mapping revision and participation in complete count activities
- <u>Timber Harvesting Ordinances</u> processing of ordinances governing the location of timber harvesting
- Forest Practice Rules Changes processing the proposed changes to the Forest Practice Rules by the Board of Forestry
- <u>Corralitos Community Plan</u> preparation of a community plan, including specific measures to preserve the character of Corralitos and provide for the needs of its citizens

- <u>Farmland Security Ordinance</u> preparation of final ordinance to implement the State law
- Rural Rezoning/Highway 9 pilot study final rezonings to bring the zoning in the rural area into conformance with the General Plan and a special program to study the existing land uses, zoning and General Plan designations along the Highway 9 corridor
- Non-conforming non-residential uses continuation of project from 1998-99 to revise the County's non-conforming uses ordinance
- Landscape Criteria Revisions project to revise the Landscape Criteria for low-water usage and improved design

Recommended New Projects

- <u>Castro Adobe Use Study</u> a grant-funded study of the potential uses of the Castro Adobe
- Felton Grove FEMA grant ordinance amendments this project, if it is found to be necessary, would involve creating special site standards for the Felton Grove area so that the flood-proofing retrofit can proceed
- <u>Via Gaviota amendments</u> special site standards to recognize existing developed subdivision
- <u>Historic Designation revisions</u> prepare and process ordinance amendments to correct in accurate zoning and historic designations
- <u>Seacliff Community Plan</u> the priority project, this project will result in a plan for the land use and design for the **Seacliff** community
- Open Space Easement Policy add policy to General Plan limiting the removal of Open Space Easement contracts to entire, legal parcels of record

The Housing Work Program is presented as a separate document (Attachment 3) as it includes those tasks to be addressed by the Housing Manager in the coming year. In the coming year, the RV park conversion ordinance and updates to the 1994 Housing Element will be completed. New work tasks include those necessary to implement the certified Housing Element.

Discussion/Recommendation

The recommended Work Program complies with your Board's direction regarding specific projects. As indicated in the attached Work Program, most of the Advanced Planning Section's work for the first three (+) quarters will be focused on the Seacliff Community Plan, timber harvesting regulations and a number of on-going tasks. The on-going tasks that will continue to be worked on include annexation review, project review, Local Coastal Program amendment Rounds coordination, the annual growth report, Historic Resource Commission staffing, and limited staff support for the Davenport town planning. Reduced time will be allocated to the Corralitos Community Plan and the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary trails planning effort until the Seacliff Community Plan is completed. Following completion of the Seacliff Community Plan and the hiring of the new Housing Planner (January), work on the rural rezoning projects will recommence, the Corralitos Community Plan will be completed, and work on a number of continuing projects will proceed. The Work Program also lists a number of tasks and projects which must be deferred until FY 2000-01, including the Right-to-Farm ordinance, the

agricultural support facilities study, the groundwater policy review and sound wall policy review requested by the Planning Commission.

It is, therefore, RECOMMENDED that your Board:

1. Approve the Planning Department's Advanced Planning and Housing Work Programs as presented in Attachment 2 and 3, respectively.


