WATSONVILLE SLOUGHS WATERSHED CONSERVATION AND ENHANCEMENT PLAN

Dear Members of the Board:

The California State Coastal Conservancy ("the Conservancy") was awarded funds in the amount of \$100,000 from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for the preparation of a wetland resource enhancement plan for the Watsonville Sloughs Watershed. The Conservancy accepted these funds, matched them with an additional \$100,000 from their Habitat Conservation Fund and authorized disbursement of the funds, totaling \$200,000, to the County of Santa Cruz as lead local agency for the preparation of the plan.

#### <u>Background</u>

The Watsonville Sloughs System consists of a remnant 800 acre complex of primarily freshwater wetlands consisting of six major branches: Watsonville Slough, Harkins Slough, Hanson Slough, Struve Slough, West Branch of Struve Slough and Gallighan Slough. The sloughs receive runoff from a 13,000 acre watershed area which includes a mix of urban, industrial, rural residential, agricultural and open space areas. As the largest remaining freshwater wetland on the Central Coast, with it's large diversity of habitats and location on the avian Pacific Coast flyway, it is a tremendously important environmental resource.

In 1996, your Board and the City of Watsonville accepted the Water Resources Management Plan for the Watsonville Sloughs System, as prepared by the Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments (AMBAG) using federal Clean Water Act 205(j) funds. In addition, your Board directed staff to continue monitoring water quality within the sloughs in cooperation with the City of Watsonville, to pursue implementation of a watershed stewardship program and to continue to actively participate in future Watsonville Sloughs Water Quality meetings and other related programs.

Analyses of water samples collected before and after completion of the AMBAG Water Resources Management Plan detected a number of pesticides and trace metals in the water column at concentrations greater than or equal to concentrations previously shown to be toxic to resident aquatic organisms. Previous water quality studies by the California State Mussel Watch program, using clams transplanted into waters of the sloughs, measured numerous pesticides at tissue concentrations greater than those seen in 95% of their samples collected statewide over the past 20 years.

The AMBAG Water Resources Management Plan identified a variety of measures for improving the quality of water entering the sloughs and Pajaro River Estuary. Recommended management strategies were focused on controlling upstream non-point source pollution and creating mechanisms for filtering urban and agricultural runoff. While the plan proposed creation of wetland buffers and modifications to increase the filtering capacity of existing wetlands, it's scope did not permit a full analysis of how these activities fit into broader community goals for wetlands in the watershed. Also, this Plan did not investigate the restoration of the sloughs for such benefits as wildlife habitat, flood control, or assess the potential for enhancing or protecting the surrounding uplands. In addition, many grant agencies and foundations are reluctant to fund conservation projects in the absence of a comprehensive resource protection strategy. This proposed project would address these issues.

County participation in the ongoing Watsonville Sloughs Water Quality meetings has led to some positive results. First of all, Planning Department staff in conjunction with the Natural Resources Conservation Service District Conservationist were successful in their efforts to attain designation of the Watsonville Sloughs System as a geographic priority area for the purpose of securing funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) which provides up to 70 % in cost-sharing assistance to farmers willing to invest in soil conservation practices. The USDA allocated EQIP funds for the Watsonville Sloughs over a period of five years beginning with the federal fiscal year of 1997/98. Additionally, the State Coastal Conservancy, with assistance from Planning Department staff, applied to the U.S. EPA for a Wetlands Program Development Grant and received funding in the amount of \$100,000. The Coastal Conservancy matched this with another \$100,000 from their Habitat Conservation Fund and \$25,000 of in-kind services.

#### Project Description

The proposed project is the development of a comprehensive resource assessment and enhancement plan for the Watsonville Sloughs Watershed. The objectives of the plan are to: characterize the existing biological and physical resources of the sloughs and surrounding uplands; analyze the relationship between the resources and land uses in the watershed; describe site-specific opportunities for enhancement and protection that recognize existing land use constraints; and produce a plan that has community support and that provides information needed for support by funding agencies. The plan will identify specific measures for resource enhancement and protection which, where possible, will be designed to confer both ecological benefits and improvements to conditions such as those associated



with water supply, flood control and agricultural drainage. It is proposed that the Santa Cruz County Planning Department act as local lead agency for the management of a consultant contract for preparation of the plan and for actively soliciting local community participation throughout the process. This effort will build on the foundation of cooperative relationships already developed among citizen groups, local jurisdictions and agencies as a result of the water quality planning efforts undertaken in the watershed over the recent years. The timing is especially fortuitous because of the recent award of a Packard Foundation Grant to the Santa Cruz County and Monterey County Resource Conservation Districts for a three-year project which will allow for the continuation and expansion of the ongoing, successful community-based erosion control program in the Elkhorn Slough watershed and the initiation of a similar program in the Watsonville Sloughs watershed. The Packard Foundation grant will fund a full time watershed coordinator, to be contracted through the Santa Cruz County Resource Conservation District, for specific assignment to the Watsonville Sloughs and a Natural Resources Engineering Technician, contracted through the Natural Resource Conservation Service, with duties in both the Watsonville Sloughs and Elkhorn Slough Watersheds. The Packard Foundation grant also supplies funding for exotic plant removal and native habitat restoration.

In order to complete acceptance of the grant, your Board must take several actions:

- Adopt a resolution accepting the terms of the grant (Attachment 1);
- Approve the grant agreement (Attachment 2), and;
- Adopt a resolution accepting and appropriating \$50,000 in unanticipated revenue in the Flood Control and Water Conservation budget since only \$150,000 of the \$200,000 grant amount was included in the Fiscal Year 1999-2000 District budget (Attachment 3), and;
- Adopt a resolution accepting and appropriating \$13,260 in the Planning budget, representing GIS service charges to the Flood Control and Water Conservation District for grant related work (Attachment 4).

The grant contract with the State Coastal Conservancy is included for your information as Attachment 2. A listing of the tasks required of County staff for project management and administration and Geographic Information Services data development and analysis and the costs of the proposed project are also included for your information as Attachment 5. A consultant services contract for the preparation of the plan will be brought to your Board for approval at a later date.

#### Recommendations

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board take the following actions:

(1) Adopt the attached resolution accepting a grant from the State Coastal Conservancy in the amount of \$200,000 for preparation of a resource assessment and conservation plan for the Watsonville Sloughs Watershed; and



- (2) Approve the attached grant agreement with the State Coastal Conservancy and authorize the Planning Director to execute the agreement on behalf of the County and;
- (3) Adopt the attached resolution accepting and appropriating unanticipated revenue in the amount of \$50,000 from the State Coastal Conservancy into the Santa Cruz County Flood Control and Water Conservation District budget; and
- (4) Adopt the attached resolution accepting and appropriating unanticipated revenue in the amount of \$13,260 from the Santa Cruz County Flood Control and Water Conservation District into the Planning Department Geographic Information Services budget.
