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PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSION ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR JANUARY - DECEMBER 1999

During the earlier months of 1999, the County Public Health Commission continued their attention to a variety of issues that affect the health of the public. The Commission spoke out in support of prenatal care for all residents of California. They continued to oppose the State Health Department's regulations that would have stopped Medi-Cal reimbursement for prenatal care for undocumented women. The Commission pointed out the shortsightedness of this policy from a fiscal, as well as a health perspective. Members of the Commission talked to local decision-makers as well, to keep them aware of this problem and its possible impact locally, as challenges to the State regulations were mounted in the California courts. The Commission was gratified when the new Governor signed the 1999-2000 budget that restored funding for prenatal care.

The Commission continued to demonstrate their concerns about smoking and health. At the request of the County Board of Supervisors, the Commission made recommendations for allocation of the \$100,000 fund awarded to the County in the "Joe Camel" litigation settlement. The Commission recommended that a Youth Art Project for elementary students as the most favorable proposal. A smaller amount of funds were recommended for curriculum materials for middle school health education classes and a project to determine some of the local health costs of smoking. These recommendations were approved by the Board of Supervisors. The Commission continued to follow the progress of the art projects and was pleased to see photographs of the murals that were made by the selected schools. The first mural has now been reprinted and is featured on County buses. The Commission also heard a preliminary report by the County's Epidemiologist on the local cost and effect of smoking on health.

The Commission continued to speak out in favor of the California law that banned smoking in bars, taverns and gaming clubs. The Commission supported efforts to enforce the law and opposed legislative efforts to change the law.

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The Commission continued to follow the changing status of Watsonville Community Hospital and spoke out for maintaining the public service commitment that had been a legacy of the hospital under its long non-profit history. The new CEO of Watsonville Hospital attended the Commission meeting in May 1999 and gave a comprehensive report on the status of the hospital and his goals for the future.

The Commission contacted each of the hospitals in the County requesting information about their cleaning procedures for reusable equipment in response to a public concern. The hospitals did respond and the Commission was satisfied that the local procedures were adequate.

The Commission appreciates the opportunity to advise the County and looks forward to continued service in the goal of improving the health of the community. The members are hopeful that appointments will be made to fill the recent vacancies that have hampered their work.

- 6. Continue to monitor and support anti-tobacco efforts and work of Proposition 10.
- 7. Review community assessment data including updated United Way survey results.
- 8. Continue to respond to the Board of Supervisor requests and emerging issues.
