SUBJECT: LIVE OAK PARKING PROGRAM

Members of the Board:

The Live Oak Parking Program (LOPP) completed its nineteenth summer of operation on September 6, 1999. The 1999 program activity is detailed in Attachment 1. It is recommended that the County continue with a 2000 Parking Program essentially the same as the 1999 program with the enhancements approved by your Board on December 14, 1999. This year's term would run from April 15 through September 4, 2000, during the hours of 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, and additional refuse carts will be placed in the Program area. At the request of 36th Avenue and Floral Drive residents, 36th Avenue from East Cliff Drive to Floral Drive and Floral Drive from 37th Avenue to 35th Avenue will be included in the proposed 2000 program when proper Coastal Commission permits have been issued. Zone boundaries are shown on the attached map (Attachment 2), and are designated on the Resolution Establishing the Live Oak Permit Parking Zone for 2000. The cost for permits will remain unchanged from 1999.

Staff consists of a Program Manager and the temporary positions of a clerk and five enforcement officers. The approved budget including the citation revenue collection service contract for 1999/2000 is \$142,000. Costs for the final three months of the 2000 program will be included in the 2000/2001 fiscal year budget request which will be considered by your Board in June 2000.

County Code relating to the Live Oak Parking Program prescribes that the parking zone, fees and term of the program are all set by resolution. These resolutions are attached for your Board's action.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors take the following action:

- 1. Approve the attached 1999 Live Oak Parking Program Report and Recommendations.
- 2. Direct the Public Works Department to initiate the 2000 Live Oak Parking Program.
- 3. Adopt the attached Resolutions to implement the 2000 Live Oak Parking Program.

### 1999 LIVE OAK PARKING PROGRAM Summary Report

The 1999 Live Oak Parking Program again met the goals of reducing traffic congestion in beach neighborhoods and this was the eighteenth year of permit operations.


**Zhee** boundaries of the 1999 program remained the same as the 1998 program.

Term: The 1999 Program began May 1, 1999, and ended September 6, 1999. The recommended term for 2000 is from April 15, 2000, through September 4, 2000 (Labor Day).

Revenue: Citations for the 1998-99 fiscal year generated \$109,567. Permit revenue from May to September 1999 totaled \$54,862 (\$5 1,220 in 1998). The breakdown is: 5 143 Day Permits (1998: 4762), 868 Annual Visitor Permits (1998: 837); 1402 Guest Permits (1998: 1271); and 399 Annual Resident Permits (1998: 372). There was no change in price for permits in 1999 from those of 1998. It is recommended that the cost for permits remain unchanged in 2000 from those of 1999.

Staff: For 2000 it is recommended that staff count remain the same as in 1999. The 1999 staff consisted of a full time Program Manager, five temporary Enforcement Officers and one clerical position, which is normally phased out in August when most of the permit application processing is completed.

Cost of Program: The program cost for fiscal year 1998-99 was \$119,946, which included the salaries of all staff members, citation maintenance contractor, hearing officer, printing materials for the following season, installing and removing of all LOPP sign posts, vehicle maintenance, and miscellaneous program purchases.

## RESOLUTIONESTABLISHING THE LIVE OAK PERMIT PARKING ZONE FOR 2000

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz has adopted Chapter 9.44 of the Santa Cruz County Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 9.44.030 of said Chapter authorizes said Board to establish by resolution the Live Oak Parking Zone in which parking will be permitted by display of a valid permit; and

WHEREAS, said Live Oak Parking Zone was modified and adopted for the 1999 beach season on March 2, 1999, by Resolution 7 1-99;

WHEREAS, said Zone is to be established for the 2000 Parking Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz establishes that:

- (1) Resolution 7 1-99 is hereby rescinded.
- (2) Permit parking regulations in the Live Oak Parking Zone unless otherwise noted will apply to both sides of each street hereinbelow enumerated:

1.	Dolores Street	from Lake Avenue to Tenth Avenue
2.	Carmel Street	from Lake Avenue to Tenth Avenue

On the motion of Supervisor duly seconded by Supervisor the following resolution is adopted

### RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING 2000 FEES FOR PERMIT PARKING IN THE LIVE OAK BEACH AREA

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz has adopted Chapter 9.44 of the Santa Cruz County Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 9.44.050 of said Chapter authorizes said Board to establish by resolution fees for parking permits in the Live Oak Parking Zone; and

WHEREAS, said Board adopted fees for the 1999 Live Oak Parking Program on March 2, 1999, by Resolution No. 70-99; and

WHEREAS, said fees are to be established for the 2000 Parking Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz establishes that:

- (1) Resolution No. 70-99 is hereby rescinded.
- (2) The fee for each parking permit for vehicles owned by, or under the control of, occupants or owners of a residence in the permit parking zone shall be no charge for two permits, and five dollars (\$5.00) for each additional permit before June 1, 2000, and seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) thereafter.
- (3) The fee for parking permit for a guest of a resident of the Parking Zone shall be five dollars (\$5.00) before June 1, 2000, and seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50) thereafter.
- (4) The parking permit fee for non-resident vehicles not included in paragraphs 2 and 3 above shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per day or twenty (\$20.00) per year if issued before June 1, 2000, and thirty dollars (\$30.00) per year thereafter.
