MOBILEHOME COMMISSION 1999 ANNUAL REPORT

I. ROLE OF COMMISSION

The duties of the Commission are: (1) to study proposed state and federal legislation relating to mobilehome living; (2) to assess the needs of persons living in mobilehomes; (3) to submit an annual recommendation to the Board of Supervisors regarding the reasonable rate of return on capital improvements allowable as an adjustment under the Mobilehome Rent Adjustment Ordinance; and (4) to accept public input on any matter within the jurisdiction of the Commission and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors when appropriate.

II. MEETING DATES

The Commission meets the fourth Thursday of every month at 9:30 a.m. at the Elena Baskin Live Oak Senior Center, 1777 Capitola Avenue, Santa Cruz, California.

III. COMMISSION STRUCTURE

The Commission consists of seven (7) persons: One (1) member nominated by the Golden State Mobilehome Owners League; one (1) member nominated by the Western Mobilehome Association; and five (5) members, each nominated by a Supervisor.

IV. COMMISSION STAFF

The Commission is staffed by the County Counsel's Office.

V. ATTENDANCE

VI. GOALS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

- Four petitions were filed in 1999 by residents for General Rent Adjustment Hearings.
- In 1997 the Commission appointed a subcommittee to review the Mobilehome Rent Adjustment Ordinance and recommend changes. Changes were approved by the Board of Supervisors in June of 1999.
- The Mobilehome Commissioners toured 46 parks in the County, including resident owned parks, and parks located in Capitola, Watsonville, and Scotts Valley, taking notice of the conditions of residences and the common areas.



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• Senior Citizens Legal Services provided assistance to County Mobilehome Park residents under a contract with the County. A total of 45 calls were referred to them. County Counsel staff continued to respond to inquiries regarding the Mobilehome Rent Adjustment Ordinance.

The District Attorney's office received County funds earmarked for the prosecution of park owners or other individuals who are conducting unfair business practices with regards to mobilehomes.

The Commission invited Senator Bruce McPherson and Assemblyman Fred Keeley to meet with them. The legislators met with the Commissioners, answering questions and listening to concerns. This meeting was followed by a Town Hall meeting organized by Senator McPherson and included representatives from the Santa Cruz County Counsels office, HCD, and the State Senate.

County Tax Assessor, Bob Petersen, addressed concerns from residents of Resident Owned Parks, with regards to the imposition of a parcel property tax.

VII. FUTURE GOALS


The Commission's goals for 2000 are to:

- 1. Encourage public attendance by mobilehome park residents and park owners at monthly Commission meetings in an attempt to assess the needs of the mobilehome park community.
- 2. Continue reviewing the Mobilehome Rent Adjustment Ordinance.
- 3. Meet and communicate with the Department of Housing and Community Development, the District Attorney's office and other departments regarding their enforcement of policies and other mobilehome issues for which they are responsible.
