Re: Acceptance of Unanticipated Revenue for Medi-Cal Outreach Program

Dear Board Members:

The Health Services Agency has been notified that funding for the Medi-Cal Outreach Program has been extended through June 30, 2001 and that additional funds are being made available this fiscal year. Attached are the funding notification letter and a resolution accepting \$58,452 in unanticipated revenue for this program. HSA is also requesting authority to sign the related amendment to the State revenue agreement when received.

As your Board is aware, the State awarded federal funds in 1998-99 to the Health Services Agency to conduct Medi-Cal Outreach activities. These activities are directed toward children and families who are in need of health services available through Medi-Cal, who are potentially eligible for program benefits, but have not participated, or who are no longer receiving benefits. The initial contract award covered the period through December 1999.

In 1999-2000, the Outreach allocation is funding a full-time Departmental Administrative Analyst in HSA for countywide program coordination, plus additional part-time staffing in Community Mental Health and the Human Resources Agency. Also funded are related services, supplies, and equipment. In 2000-01, the allocation will fund the coordinator position in HSA and a fulltime eligibility worker position in HRA.

The State is extending funding through June 2001, with an annual allocation of \$135,978. The 1999-2000 adopted County budget includes \$77,526 in Medi-Cal Outreach revenue. The attached resolution accepts \$58,452, the balance of this year's funding allocation. The State is amending its existing Outreach revenue agreement to extend the term and to incorporate the annual funding allocations. HSA is requesting authority to sign the amendment when received, as well as any subsequent amendments involving minor program or administrative changes.

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board:

- 1. Adopt the attached resolution accepting and appropriating \$58,452 in unanticipated revenue for the Medi-Cal Outreach Program; and
- 2. Authorize the Health Services Agency Administrator to sign the related amendment to the State revenue agreement for the Medi-Cal Outreach Program when received and any subsequent amendments involving minor program or administrative changes.

TO: California Counties and Cities of Berkeley, Long Beach, and Pasadena

The California Department of Health Services is pleased to announce the availability of additional funds for Medi-Cal Section 1931 (b) Outreach contracts for fiscal years (FY) 1999-2000 and 2000-2001. This will result in a funding increase for 1999-2000 and a new allocation for 2000-2001.

The maximum amount of contract funds to be awarded to each county and city for each fiscal year is listed on the enclosed table. Counties and cities are not required to contract for the full allocation in FY 1999-2000 if the funds cannot be spent by June 30, 2000. Any funds not spent in FY 1999-2000 will be allocated to future years. Although we anticipate that the allocation for FY 2000-2001 will be the same as in FY 1999-2000, the actual amount is subject to the FY 2000-2001 State Budget Act appropriation.

Counties and cities must meet a 10 percent matching requirement. Federal law prohibits nongovernmental entities from using their funds to match federal funds in exchange for contracts from state or county\city agencies.

Counties and cities with an existing Medi-Cal Section 1931 (b) Outreach contract ending September 30, 1999, can have their contract amended to extend through June 30, 2001. (This includes any counties or cities with pending contract extensions to December 31, 1999.). If your county or city does not wish to receive a contract extension for additional funds, please notify Yvonne Lee of my staff at the telephone number shown below by February 7, 2000.

In light of the increased funds available in FY 1999-2000 and the *new* allocation of funds in FY 2000-2001, counties and cities will have additional resources for Medi-Cal outreach efforts. This one contract amendment will create a multi-yea! contract, through June 30, 2001, with separate budgets for FY 1998-I 999, 1999-2000, and 2000, 2001. Any unspent funds from one fiscal **year** cannot be utilized for expenses incurred in a prior or subsequent fiscal year. Additional information will follow within 10 days regarding the revised budgets and scopes of work that counties and cities will need to amend their contracts for FY 1999-2000 and FY 2000-2001,

Counties that have never contracted for the Medi-Cal Section 1931 (b) Outreach funds and are interested in applying should contact Patricia Warriner DeWeese, Acting Chief, Office of Medi-Cal Procurement (OMCP), at (916) 323-7406, by February 7, 2000. The OMCP will send copies of the 1998 Medi-Cal Outreach (Section 1931 (b)) Request for



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Application (RFA) that outlines the requirements for proposal development, including scopes of work, budgets, and budget justifications. Notwithstanding the due date specified in the RFA, counties will have until March 1, 2000, to submit the information required, including a proposal that demonstrates how these funds will be spent.
