# ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE UNANTICIPATED REVENUE FOR WELFARE-TO-WORK TRANSPORTATION

Dear Members of the Board:

As you will recall, in December 1998, the Human Resources Agency (HRA) applied to the California Department of Transportation (CALTRANS) for a Job Access/Reverse Commute grant from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). We are pleased to report that the grant has been approved in the amount of \$200,000 for transportation alternatives to serve the CalWORKs population. The purpose of this letter is to accept and appropriate unanticipated revenue and take related actions to initiate implementation of the proposed projects.

## **Background**

In November 1998, Caltrans invited communities with urbanized areas under 200,000 to apply for Job Access/Reverse Commute (JARC) grants from the Federal Transit Administration. The Human Resources Agency (HRA) submitted an application for three projects to serve CalWORKs participants in the welfare-to-work program, which was reviewed and supported by the Transportation Commission and the Transportation Task Force of the Coalition for Workforce Preparation. HRA has been awarded the full amount requested for the following initiatives:

## **Emergency Ride Home Program**

The JARC grant includes \$50,000 for an Emergency Ride Program, which will provide emergency transportation back-up for working CalWORKs participants who utilize alternative transportation and face unexpected transportation emergencies which can cost them their jobs. For example, the program could assist parents to pick up sick children if they have taken the bus or used another alternative form of transportation, or if their car breaks down during the day. It is anticipated that this service will be contracted out to an organization which already provides such services, such as a transportation management association.

#### **Carp001 Incentives Program**

The JARC grant includes \$50,000 for a Carpool Incentives Program to strengthen carpooling

supports for working participants. The incentives will be transportation-related, such as payment for a car tune-up or smog inspection, and will require CalWORKs participants to share their cars with other participants to attend work or work-related activities.

#### **Connections Shuttle**

Finally, the JARC grant includes \$100,000 in capital funds for the purchase of shuttle vans for the Connections Shuttle job training program, which trains drivers and dispatchers and serves working CalWORKs participants who cannot take the bus for all or part of their route, as a short-term interim solution.

The Connections Shuttle Program is operated as a training activity for CalWORKs participants, who earn their Class B driver's license and learn dispatching skills, while providing shuttle services to CalWORKs families who cannot use the bus for all or part of their routes. Driving and dispatching have been identified locally as high demand occupations, and 13 of the 30 CalWORKs participants enrolled in the training program have already found unsubsidized jobs. The service aspect of this program is provided as a short-term, interim solution to transportation problems, including a job retention service for employed participants. Users of the shuttle are transitioned to the public transportation system or an alternative mode of transportation such as a carpool whenever possible.

Since the grant was awarded, the Human Resources Agency has been meeting with the Santa Cruz Metropolitan Transit District (SCMTD) and the United Transportation Union (UTU) to work out issues of concern to them regarding coordination of the Connections Shuttle with the bus services. In addition, HRA has been working cooperatively with SCMTD to market bus services to the CalWORKs population. HRA will continue to meet with SCMTD and the UTU on a regular basis to address mutual concerns.

#### **Next Steps**

HRA will work closely with the Santa Cruz Metropolitan Transit District, the Santa Cruz Area Transportation Management Association, the United Transportation Union, the Transportation Commission, Food & Nutrition Services, and Caltrans to implement the JARC grant. It is the intent to contract out JARC grant services to community-based transportation organizations.

The Federal Transit Administration administers the JARC grants using an electronic grants management system called TEAM, for which specific authorization utilizing FTA language must be approved by your Board, as shown on the attached authorizing resolution; and through a fiscal electronic management system called ECHO.

The next steps in implementation include: 1) approving and submitting authorizing documents to the Federal Transit Administration to use the TEAM and ECHO systems; 2) accepting and appropriating half of the grant funds for expenditure this fiscal year; and 3) negotiating and

approving contracts for services which are planned to begin no later than July 1, 2000. The remaining revenue will be included in the agency's FY 200012001 proposed budget.

It will be necessary for your Board to approve a resolution authorizing the Human Resources Agency Administrator or designee to act as project administrator and signatory on behalf of the County in communications about this grant with the Federal Transit Administration via the TEAM electronic grants management system and the ECHO fiscal management system. The resolution specifies authorizations which are required by the Federal Transit Administration to implement the grant, and is attached for your approval. A copy of the grant is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

## IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that your Board:

- 1. Adopt the attached resolution, accepting and appropriating \$100,000 in unanticipated revenue from a Job Access/Reverse Commute grant in FY 1999/2000;
- 2. Approve the attached Authorizing Resolution, authorizing the Human Resources Agency Administrator to execute and file an application for Federal assistance on behalf of the Human Resources Agency of Santa Cruz County with the Federal Transit Administration;
- 3. Authorize the Human Resources Agency Administrator to execute and file with its application the annual certifications and assurances and other documents the Federal Transportation Administration requires before awarding a Federal assistance grant or cooperative agreement;
- 4. Authorize the Human Resources Agency Administrator to execute a grant and cooperative agreement with the Federal Transit Administration on behalf of the Human Resources Agency of Santa Cruz County for the purposes of this Job Access/Reverse Commute Grant;
- 5. Authorize the Human Resources Agency Administrator or designee to act as the project administrator and signatory in the TEAM electronic software grant management system, and as recipient organization official in the ECHO fiscal system; and
- 6. Direct the Human Resources Agency to negotiate contracts for Job Access/Reverse Commute services and to return to your Board for contract approval no later than June 30, 2000.
