SUBJECT: RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF ILLEGAL DISPOSAL SITES CLEANUP GRANT

Members of the Board:

The California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) is the County's acting Local Enforcement Agent and as such is responsible for coordinating cleanups of illegal disposal sites within the county. Public Works has been working with the CIWMB on three such cleanup activities, one off Rodeo Gulch Road and two additional sites on the upper banks of the Pajaro River near Rogge Lane. Details on the illegal disposal sites and the proposed cleanup program can be found in the attached application packets. The CIWMB has determined through its investigations that none of these illegal disposal sites are the result of negligent actions on the part of the property owners, as certified in the attached affidavits from the property owners.

In light of the CIWMB's findings, Public Works recommends that we support the cleanup activities on these properties through application for the CIWMB's Farm and Ranch Cleanup Abatement Program. To qualify for these grant funds a local government agency must sponsor the grant application. For your Boards' consideration, we have attached the completed grant application packet and the required Board resolution approving the application. We are requesting a total of \$29,588.00 in grant funds for these three sites. Grant funds are available up to \$10,000.00 per site. One of the Pajaro River sites will require property-owner funding in excess of the available grant funds. The other two sites are estimated to cost less than \$10,000.00 each.

If Public Works is successful in securing these grant **funds** for the cleanup, we will return to your Board with funding agreements for each property owner. These agreements will require the owners to fund the cleanups in **full**, pending grant reimbursement **from** the **CIWMB** that can only occur after the cleanups are certified as complete. These agreements will also assure that all costs in excess of the available grants funds will be borne by the property owners and that certain recycling activities will occur as part of each cleanup.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors take the following action:

- 1. Adopt the attached resolution approving submittal of a Farm and Ranch Cleanup Abatement Program grant application for cleanup of illegal disposal sites off Rodeo Gulch Road and along the Pajaro River.
- 2. Authorize the Director of Public Works to sign the grant application on behalf of the County.
- 3. Direct Public Works to return upon successful grant award with funding agreements with each of the affected property owners.

WHEREAS, the people of the State of California have enacted Senate Bill 1330 (Lockyer, 1997) that allows the California Integrated Waste Management Board to allocate monies from the California Integrated Waste Management Fund, California Tire Recycling Management Fund and California Used Oil Recycling Fund to pay for costs of cleanup, abatement, or other remedial action related to the illegal disposal of solid waste on farm or ranch property; and

WHEREAS, said procedures established by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) require the applicant to **certify** by resolution the approval of the application before submission of said application to the State; and

WHEREAS, the applicant will enter into agreement with the State of California for development of the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz hereby:

- 1. Approves the filing of an application for the cleanup of solid waste using grant funds from the three funding sources for the projects specified above; and
- 2. Certifies that said applicant has or will have sufficient funds in addition to **funds** provided by the grant to complete the project; and will execute agreements with property owners to secure said cleanup **funding** in excess of CIWMB approved grant funds.
- 3. Appoints the Director of Public Works as agent of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Cruz to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned projects.

Introduction: (General Criteria (GC) #IA and #1B -Need) *

The California Integrated Waste Management Board administers a Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grant Program which allows cities and counties to seek financial assistance for the cleanup of illegal solid waste sites on farm or ranch property, such as the three sites requested for funding.

Santa Cruz County consists of 52,5 15 acres of farmland, ranchland and vineyards. These sparsely populated areas provide the perfect opportunity for illegal dumping to occur. Abandoned appliances, tires, construction debris, as well as household waste have been illegally dumped on three sites in Santa Cruz County. Illegally disposed appliances, tires and garbage present potential environmental and public health threats. Appliances offer the opportunity for heavy metals and CFC's to be released into the environment. Illegally dumped material quickly becomes a habitat for vector breeding, especially mice, rats and mosquitoes, which can spread diseases such as, encephalitis and Hantavirus pulmonary syndrome. Lastly, piles of disposed waste, which are left unaddressed, encourage additional and increased illegal dumping in the area.

(GC #2A – Objective) * The main objective of the grant proposal is to remove solid waste from the sites described in this grant application and restore the areas back to their original state. The health and environmental benefits of the proposals include immediate protection of nearby bodies of water from point source contamination, removal of vector habitat, removal of community blight and restoration of farmland, ranchland and agricultural-forest land. Specific and measurable goals and objectives, along with the time frames are located in Exhibit E of this application package.

Innovative Programs (Preference Criteria (PC) #2A – Innovative Programs) *

Santa Cruz County has the following programs to help discourage illegal dumping:

- Free dump days at the County owned solid waste facilities,
- Discounted pricing for source separated recyclables such as woodwaste/yardwaste, 'concrete, and scrap metal.
- Free household hazardous waste drop-off facilities, and
- Educational programs on the public health, safety and environmental problems that result from illegal dumping.

Funding Options (PC #I 1 – Funding Options) *

To the best of our knowledge, there are no federal, state or local funds available to cleanup the sites presented in this application.

Evaluation of the Project (GC #4 – Evaluation) *

The success of the project and determination of whether the objectives were accomplished will be evaluated by Patrick Mathews, Solid Waste and Recycling Manager with Santa Cruz County



Public Works in coordination with Jeff Hackett, LEA with the California Integrated Waste Management Board. An inspection of the sites will be made to make sure all the tasks listed on the Work Plans, Exhibit F, are accomplished, including:

- ♦ the sites are free of all solid waste and/or litter, and
- there is no attractive nuisance remaining at the site to propagate further dumping, and
- all potential threats to the public health and safety and the environment have been abated.

Photos will be taken during and after the cleanup and abatement of the sites. The photos will document the work done, which can then be compared to the photos presented in this application package to show success of the program. Patrick Mathews, Solid Waste and Recycling Manager with Santa Cruz County Public Works in coordination with Jeff Hackett, LEA with the California Integrated Waste Management Board will prepare a final report as specified in the Grant Agreement summarizing the project activities and include the photos mentioned above.







(GC #2 – Objectives, GC #3A – Methodology)* (PC #8 – Work Plan, PC 10 – Use of Funds)*

Project Description/Background

The Rodeo Gulch Road Illegal Dump Site is located on North Rodeo Gulch Road, approximately 0.3 miles south of the Mountain View Road and North Rodeo Gulch Road intersection. Solid waste has been dumped from a turnout on Rodeo Gulch Road down a steep embankment onto private property owned by Ms. Ziska Baum (APN 100- I3 I-05 & 06). The waste includes three to four automobile bodies, approximately 20 waste tires, old furniture (couches/tables), white goods and other metal debris, construction and demolition waste, and wood debris.

Scope of Work

The scope of work will consist of six main tasks:

Task # 1 - Mobilization of Crew and Equipment

- Cleanup crew coordinator will make site visit and assess health and safety and sanitation needs
- Organize work crews and staging areas (for equipment and containers), traffic controls
- Move in equipment (loader) and containers for material removal

Task # 2 - Removal of Solid Waste and Separation

- ♦ Cleanup crew begins manually gathering and consolidating the material that is easily managed into collection piles (by waste type) at the bottom and sides of the embankment for removal
- Remove the material stored in the collection piles from the bottom and sides of the hillside, by a cable or basket, and place the material into designated containers at the top of the slope
- Utilize a winch and/or tow truck to remove vehicles, appliances and other bulky items
- Utilize a loader/backhoe to load the materials into the respective containers
- ♦ Tires, metal, and appliances will be separated and sent to a recycler

Task # 3 - Transportation, Disposal, and Recycling

- ♦ Hauler will pick-up full bins and leave empty bins for each waste type (e.g., waste destined for disposal, appliances, waste tires, wood waste, etc.)
- Waste will be hauled to the Buena Vista Drive Sanitary Landfill for disposal or recycling

Task # 4 -Erosion Control

• Stabilize the hillside where waste removal activities occurred using native grass seed to minimize potential erosion, if necessary

Task # 5 – Prevention

- Install 6 foot chain link fence
- ♦ Post "No Dumping" signs

Task # 6 - Verification

- Photographs, receipts, and invoices will be used to verify completion of remediation activities
- Prepare and submit a Final Report to the CIWMB







Project Description/Background

The Pajaro River Illegal Dump Site #1 is located off Highway 129 (Riverside Drive), approximately ½ mile west of Rogge Road, between Highway 129 and the Pajaro River (APN 1 1 O-2 12-05). The property is a working apple orchard with no housing. Access to the dump is by way of a dirt road on the south side of the apple orchards. Illegal dumping of household garbage, tires, scrap metal, appliances, construction & demolition debris, and other refuse has occurred over several years. The waste was dumped along the upper banks of the Pajaro River. Attempts by the property owner to halt the illegal dumping have been unsuccessful, despite placing signs and cables limiting access.

Scope of Work

The scope of work will consist of six main tasks:

Task # 1 - Mobilization of Crew and Equipment

- Cleanup crew coordinator will make site visit and assess health and safety and sanitation needs
- Organize work crews and staging areas (for equipment and containers)
- Move in equipment, backhoe and/or loader, and containers for waste removal

Task # 2 - Removal of Solid Waste and Separation

- Backhoe will be used to retrieve waste from the embankment and place it at the top of the hill to allow for work crews to hand sort/segregate recyclables
- ♦ Cleanup crew manually gathers and consolidates the material that is out of reach of the backhoe (lower part of the embankment) and retrieved by cable or basket and placed at the top of the hill
- Utilize a winch and/or tow truck to remove vehicle(s), appliances and other bulky items
- Utilize a backhoe/loader to load the materials into the respective containers
- Tires, metal, and appliances will be separated and sent to a recycler

Task # 3 - Transportation, Disposal, and Recycling

- Local hauler will pick-up full bins and leave empty bins for each waste type (e.g., waste destined for disposal, appliances, waste tires, C&D, etc.)
- Waste will be hauled to the Buena Vista Drive Sanitary Landfill for disposal or recycling

Task # 4 -Erosion Control

• Stabilize the hillside where waste removal activities occurred using native grass seed to minimize potential erosion, if necessary

Task # 5 -Prevention

- Post "No Trespassing/No Dumping" signs in English and Spanish at the highway and back of the property
- Property owner to implement increased surveillance of property to minimize potential for renewed dumping

Task # 6 - Verification






