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# Santa Cruz Domestic Violence Commission 1999 Annual Report

## 1. ROLE OF THE COMMISSION

- Help increase coordination between agencies, departments and the courts and with victims of domestic violence and abuse
- Promote effective accessible education, prevention, intervention and treatment techniques to be developed based upon research and data collection.
- Seek to improve the response to domestic violence and abuse to reduce the incidents of domestic violence.
- Examine issues relating to domestic violence and make recommendations to the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors concerning administrative and legislative actions.
- Establish a committee, from among its membership, with the addition of a representative from the Office of the Santa Cruz County Counsel, as specified by Penal Code Section 853.5(a) to develop protocols for use by law enforcement officers and recommend the adoption of said protocols to the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors.

## 2. MEETING DATES, TIME AND LOCATION

Meetings of the Commission are held on the second Wednesday of the month. The meetings convene at 5:30 p.m. at various locations. During the calendar year 1999 the Commission met on the following dates:

# 3. COMMISSION STRUCTURE

The Commission is comprised of 27 Commissioners. They are as follows:

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### ANNUAL GOALS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

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- GOAL #1: Continue Work on the Santa Cruz County Medical Reporting Video and creation of resource card on reporting.
- RESULT: The Commission has continued to look for funds to assist in creating a training video for the medical community. The Commission has created information cards on domestic violence and how to report. These informational cards can be found in medical centers/offices throughout the community
- GOAL #2: Address the limited availability of services for the Gay, Lesbian, Bi-sexual, Transgender Community and improve treatment programs for batterers within this community.
- RESULT: The Commission gathered together community members to identify issues faced by the GLBT community. A research project, undertaken at this forum used a survey to gather information on current services and their availability. The Commission compiled a list of the resources and researched program models in outlying counties. A master plan was developed and funding options explored for the GLBT community through the Santa Cruz County Community Foundation.
- GOAL #3: Re-examine the Mission Statement and Bylaws of the Commission.
- RESULT: The commission has been involved in re-writing our mission statement. It is pending approval. The commission will next review the by-laws and make recommendations for improving them.
- GOAL #4: Address Family Court services and explore Santa Cruz County's need for a Domestic Violence Court.
- RESULT: The Commission supported a move by the Santa Cruz County Courts to institute a Domestic Violence Court.

GOAL #5: Domestic Violence Awareness Month

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- RESULT: The Commission was host to a press conference in South Santa Cruz County to launch Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
- GOAL #6: Annual Awards Banquet
- RESULT: The Commission hosted its annual awards banquet. Several certificates of appreciation were presented to individuals who work in the field of domestic violence prevention and education.

- Goal #1: Initiate activities for Domestic Violence Awareness Month October 2000.
- Goal #2: Host the annual Domestic Violence Commission Awards Barbecue with special recognition of the Commissions 5 year anniversary.
- Goal #3: Complete and approve the Domestic Violence Commission Mission Statement and review of bylaws and long-term goals.
- Goal #4: Review and recommend approval of Santa Cruz County District Attorneys Domestic Violence Prosecution Protocol.
- Goal #5: Explore creation of a Santa Cruz County Domestic Violence Commission Website.
- Goal #6: Complete Medical Training Video.
- Goal #7: Update Law Enforcement Protocol.
- Goal #8: Facilitate educational training/forum on "victimless" prosecution of domestic violence.
