Contract Amendment for Environmental Assessment Services

Dear Members of the Board:

The purpose of this letter is to amend the scope of services and compensation schedules for Remediation Risk Management, Inc. (RRM). RRM provides environmental site assessment reports for staff review prior to acquisition of real property by the Agency. Due to the increasing complexity of environmental reporting requirements and the likelihood of more extensive investigations, we feel that the original scope of services is too limited in its description of potential secondary investigations and their costs.

Background

The Redevelopment Agency has been under contract with Remediation Risk Management, Inc. (RRM) since June 23, 1992 for environmental site assessment investigations and Phase I and Phase II reports, which are routinely reviewed by staff prior to all property acquisition. Phase I reports identify past and present environmental conditions and make recommendations for additional Phase II studies if there appear to be other potential hazards on site. Phase II reports identify particular hazardous conditions such as the presence of harmful residual pesticides and metals from prior agricultural use, or the presence of an abandoned septic tank or fossil fuel tank. If an environmental risk is found, staff obtains cost estimates for removal or remediation of the hazard and if the costs are significant, make further recommendations to your Board to renegotiate the purchase price or cancel the purchase contract.

Proposed Amendments

The description of Phase I environmental site assessment scope of services in Attachment 1 has been reformatted only, with no changes. RRM is requesting, however, an increase

in their flat rate fees for Phase I assessments due to increased costs (over the past eight years) for labor, materials, and business overhead. In addition, as the type and extent of reportable environmental hazards has increased over the years, RRM's description of Phase II services is no longer sufficient to describe today's broader range of hazards. Attachment 1 sets forth new labor rates, fee schedules and equipment and materials charges for all potential Phase II investigations.

Recommendation

We feel that the RRM's request for a modest increase in Phase I fees, after eight years, is quite reasonable. Furthermore, RRM's revised and updated description of potential Phase II investigations, reports and fees will give staff greater flexibility to do necessary investigations, as well as greater accountability for RRM's direct costs.

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board, as the Board of Directors for the Redevelopment Agency:

- 1. Approve the contract amendment with Remediation Risk Management, Inc., (Attachment 1) effective July **1**, 2000; and
- 2. Authorize the Agency Administrator to sign the contract amendment.

Phase I Environmental Site Assessments

The scope of services for Phase I Site Assessments consists of several tasks including:

- a reconnaissance of the site and its vicinity
- a compilation of the property history
- file review(s) at relevant agencies
- agency lists search of facilities with recorded **environmental** issues within the radius specified by ASTM
- interview of property owner and/or occupants, if any
- a summary of findings, conclusions, and recommendations.

The SCRA will need to provide the following information within two working days of project acceptance.

- Site contact name and phone number
- Currentowner
- Date of earliest known building construction
- Site cross →□mm+
- . Parcelnumber

RRM, Inc. (**RRM**) expects the SCRA to arrange for access to the Site and to **notify** the property owner and/or occupants, as it deems necessary. **RRM** will **arrange** a meeting or **telephone interview with the identified** site contact. The owner or the owner's representative is expected to provide for review of any of the following. documents in their possession;

- building **plans**
- previous environmental inspection reports
- environmental permits
- registration for underground storage tanks
- reports regarding hydrogeologic conditions
- notices **from** government agencies
- hazardous waste generator notices or reports
- geotechnical studies

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The Phase I Environmental Site Assessment does not **include** sampling of **suspected** asbestos containing materials, lead-based paint, lead in drinking water, or radon. Depending on the date of construction, site building(s) may be impacted by some or **all** of these potentially hazardous substances. Costs for these specific investigations **can** be supplied upon request

Phase II Environmental Site Assessments

In the event that a Phase **II** Environmental Site Assessment is warranted and recommended, **RRM** will provide these services. The Phase II Environmental Site Assessment may **include** a soil **and/or** groundwater investigation, underground storage tank locating services. lead **and/or** asbestos containing **materials** assessment, or any other **assessment** Of **environmental** media. The scope of work for Phase II Environmental Site Assessments will be evaluated **and** recommended on a case-by-case **basis**. Phase **I** Environmental Site Assessments

Additional Charges may apply if the subject site includes more than one parcel, address, or tenant. Also, property usages associated with high environmental risks are subject to additional charges. These additional charges will be based on the attached rate schedule and will be submitted for approval prior to initiation of the project.

The usual turnaround time for a Phase I Site Assessment is three weeks.

Phase II Environmental Site Assessments

As previously stated, the scope of work of Phase **II** Environmental Site Assessments will be evaluated and recommended on a case-by-case basis. A cost estimate for **the** Phase II Environmental Site Assessment will be provided for your approval prior to the initiation of work. The attached 2000 Fee Schedule and the Equipment & Materials Charge Form will be used to **provide** pricing for the cost estimate.

RRM will not be responsible for costs associated with unforeseen field conditions encountered during the Phase II Environmental Site Assessment. These conditions may include, but are not limited to: health **and safety** issues, site access issues, and damage to potential subsurface **and** above ground obstructions. All additional work will be charged on a time and materials basis; no out of scope **services will** be provided without the prior approval of the SCRA.
