Resolution Authorizing Application for Schiff-Cardenas Crime Prevention Act of 2000 Program Funds, and Re-authorizing the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council Through June 30, 2003

Dear Board Members:

The State Board of Corrections (BOC) recently announced the availability of \$121.3 million to counties from Assembly Bill 1913, the Schiff-Cardenas Crime Prevention Act of 2000. The allocation for Santa Cruz County, based on a per capita formula, is \$900,650. Funds are available to implement a comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan which is to be developed locally by each county's juvenile justice coordinating council. To qualify for funding on a noncompetitive basis, each county must submit a plan to the Board of Corrections for a 30-day compliance review based on criteria specified in the statute. Programs and approaches proposed for funding must consider efforts that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency and addressing juvenile crime. Proposed programs also need to address the areas of prevention, intervention, suppression, and/or incarceration. Funds have already been distributed to the counties, but cannot be appropriated by the auditor-controller until the BOC approves the comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan. Annual county reports are required by statute to be submitted to the Board of Supervisors and to the BOC in a format specified by the BOC. The BOC is required to submit an interim and final report to the legislature addressing each county's outcomes. Funds may be utilized in support of approved programs as soon as the county's comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan is approved by the BOC and must be expended by June 30, 2002.

The county's comprehensive multi-agency juvenile justice plan must be developed by the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC). As your Board will recall, the Santa Cruz County JJCC was established in 1996 as a requirement for applying for funds under the Juvenile Crime Enforcement and Accountability Challenge Grant program. Your Board approved a resolution in November 1996, establishing the general membership of the JJCC, followed by Board Resolution 418-96 in March, 1997, which identified the JJCC by name as required by legislation.

In October 1998 your Board re-authorized the JJCC as part of the Probation Department's application for a second round of funding made available in Challenge Grant II through the BOC. It should be noted that the JJCC is also required to advise the Probation Department on the expenditure plan for the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), as mandated by the Comprehensive Youth Services Act of 1997.

In October 1998 your Board re-authorized the JJCC as part of the Probation Department's application for a second round of funding made available in Challenge Grant II through the BOC. It should be noted that the JJCC is also required to advise the Probation Department on the expenditure plan for the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), as mandated by the Comprehensive Youth Services Act of 1997.

The attached resolution identifies the proposed members of the JJCC, updated due to various personnel changes. In addition to those changes, it is requested that Christine Johnson-Lyons, Executive Director for the Community Action Board of Santa Cruz County, be appointed as the representative for the Community-at Large, as the Community Action Board is currently the only community-based organization involved in the juvenile criminal justice system not represented on the JJCC. A roster listing the current and proposed membership of the JJCC is attached for your information.

The Schiff-Cardenas Crime Prevention Act of 2000 requires that the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council review and update the local action plan that was previously developed and approved as part of the Challenge Grant II program. This local action plan forms the basis for the county's multi-agency juvenile justice plan. The Probation Department will be convening the JJCC to review and update the local action plan, and will return to your Board for final approval to submit the county's multi-agency juvenile justice plan and application for funding to the Board of Corrections. No matching funds are required, and there is no increase in county cost associated with this funding opportunity.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that your Board:

- 1. Approve the attached resolution authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to submit an application for approval in the amount of \$900,650 for Schiff-Cardenas Crime Prevention Act of 2000 funding to the State Board of Corrections; and
- 2. Approve the membership and re-authorize the Santa Cruz County Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council through June 30, 2003.
