Members of the Board:

On September 19, 2000, your Board received the last status report (Attachment 1) and directed that a further status report on the Pajaro River Watershed Flood Protection Authority be presented today. Since the last report, the Pajaro River Watershed Flood Protection Authority (PRWFPA) held meetings on September 15, 2000, in Watsonville and on November 17, 2000, in Salinas. Their most recent meeting was held on January 19, 2001, in Hollister. (Copies of the meeting agendas and the minutes are included as Attachment 2).

As indicated in the agendas, the PRWFPA Board of Directors has continued to implement a number of administrative actions essential to the operation of the agency. In particular, it has adopted draft by-laws, determined the terms of the directors, established a bank account and acquired insurance. It has also directed the Executive Coordinator to work with the staff of the member agencies to conduct a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process for legal services and for consultant services for a Pajaro River Watershed Basin Study. In conjunction with the legal services, the PRWFPA is asking that each member agency contribute \$2,000.00 toward the anticipated cost of these services over the coming year. As discussed below, it is anticipated that these and other agency costs will be funded by Water Bond funding in future years. Sufficient funds for this purpose are available in the Zone 7 Army Corps Flood Control Project Local Match account.

Staff working group meetings have been held monthly in response to the directions of the PRWFPA Board. Copies of the agendas from these meetings are included as Attachment 3. Staff has interviewed eight law firms and presented their recommendations for legal counsel at the January 200 1 meeting of the PRWFPA Board. The PRWFPA Board unanimously selected the Sacramento law firm of Downey, Brand, Seymour, and Rohwer as its general counsel due to its expertise in water law, reasonable rates, and overall strength as a full service law firm. The Board approved payment for services rendered by Regional Analysis and Planning Services, Inc., from July

1, 2000 through December 3 1, 2000. In addition, the Board approved the fiscal year 2000/01 budget and directed staff to return with additional details.

Staff has also interviewed a number of consulting firms which have responded to the RFQ for the Pajaro River Basin Study. Several excellent firms have submitted their qualifications and expressed interest in the study. Staff is currently working with the Executive Coordinator to finalize a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the study. It is anticipated that the RFP will be transmitted to the highest ranked firms in the coming month. A recommended consulting firm is planned to be presented to the PRWFPA Board of Directors at the March meeting.

As previously reported, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) will administer the \$2.0 million in state Water Bond funds earmarked for the PRWFPA. While the (SWRCB) has passed a resolution to fund a number of projects including the Basin Study, guidelines for disbursement and use of these funds are yet to be developed. The Executive Coordinator has been directed by the PRWFPA Board to continue working with the State to secure this funding. It is expected that guidelines will be issued in the near future.

Zone 7 Staff propose to continue to attend the PRWFPA Board and staff level meetings to insure that the policies and directions of your Board are pursued, particularly with regard to identifying and securing adequate local match funds for the Army Corps Pajaro River Levee Reconstruction Project to reduce the flood threat to the city of Watsonville, town of Pajaro and surrounding areas.

It is therefore recommended that your Board take the following actions:

- 1. Accept and file this report and direct that a further report on the Pajaro River Watershed Flood Protection Authority be presented at your next meeting on March 20, 2001.
- Approve the attached ADD-74 transferring funds from the Army Corps Flood Control Project and authorize a contribution of \$2,000.00 to the Pajaro River Watershed Flood Protection Agency for legal services as described in this report.

Members of the Board:

On June 20, 2000, your Board received- the-last status report (Attachment 1) and directed that a further status report on the Pajaro River Watershed Flood Protection Authority (PRWFPA) be presented today. Since the last report; the PRWFPA held meetings on June 15, 2000, in Hollister and on July 21, 2000 in Gilroy. Copies of the meeting agendas and draft minutes from the July 21, 2000, meeting are included as Attachment 2. No official minutes were prepared for the June 15, 2000, meeting, as a contract for a PRWFPA executive coordinator had not yet been approved. The minutes of the July 21, 2000, meeting will be considered by the PRWFPA Board at its next meeting scheduled for September 15, 2000, at 10:00 a.m. in Watsonville.

As indicated in the agenda, the PRWFPA considered a number of items at its June 15, 2000, meeting; however, except for an appointment of an interim chair and several requests for information to the various agency staff attending, no actions were taken. The lack of actions was due in part to concerns raised by some Board members over whether the Authority was in fact officially established under the provisions of AB 807 before July 1, 2000.

As indicated in the agenda and draft minutes from July 21, 2000, the PRWFPA then approved a contract for administrative services with Regional Analysis and Planning Services, Inc., (a nonprofit arm of Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments). In addition, Santa Cruz County representative Director Tony Campos, was elected PRWFPA Chair and Santa Clara County representative Director Gage was elected Vice-Chair. A number of other administrative actions were taken related to drafting of bylaws, exploring alternatives for legal counsel, and insuring compliance with the provisions of state law establishing the PRWFPA.

An oral report was presented by Santa Clara County staff on the status of efforts to secure ail or a part of \$2 million in state water bond funds in order to initiate a Pajaro River Basin study, assist with local cost matching on federal projects, and support ongoing PRWFPA operating costs, The State Water Resources Control Board will administer the funds, and while they have passed a resolution to fund a number of projects including the Pajaro River Basin study, guidelines for disbursement and use of these funds are yet to be developed. Santa Cruz County staff and Nicolas Papadakis, PRWFPA Executive Coordinator, have also been in contact with state representatives on this issue. The executive coordinator has been directed by the PRWFPA Board to continue working with the state to secure funding.

A staff working group meeting was convened by the executive coordinator on August 16, 2000, to address a number of issues raised by the PRWFPA Board. Staff representatives from the eight agencies were formally identified, recommendations for legal counsel were discussed, and review of draft bylaws was initiated for consideration by the PRWFPA Board at its next meeting. A number of other issues were also addressed as indicated in the agenda from this meeting, included as Attachment 3.

Zone 7 staff proposes to continue to attend the PRWFPA Board and staff level meetings to insure that the policies and directions of your Board are pursued, particularly with regard to identifying and securing adequate local match funds for the Army Corps Pajaro River Levee Reconstruction Project to reduce the flood threat to city of Watsonville, town of Pajaro and surrounding areas.

It is therefore recommended that your Board accept and file this report and direct that a further report on the Pajaro River Watershed Flood Protection Authority be presented at your next meeting on January 23,200 1.

Dear Board of Directors:

The City of Watsonville would like to convey its support for a multi-objective Pajaro River Flood Control Project to the Zone 7 Board of Directors. The City also opposes the concept of pursuing only the single objective flood wall project as the default alternative, and encourages the Zone 7 Board to ask for a more aggressive investigation of multi-objective project alternatives by the Army Corps of Engineers.

On November 28, 2000, the Watsonville City Council heard a presentation by County of Santa Cruz staff regarding the two primary alternatives for the Pajaro River Flood Control Project. The Council also heard a number of comments from the local community on this matter. City staff has been participating on the Zone 7 Design Review Steering Committee from the outset.

It appears that the Army Corps of Engineers (ACE) has chosen the flood wall project alternative as the default project. The City urges the Zone 7 Board of Directors to ask the ACE for a more detailed analysis of multi-objective project alternatives at this relatively early point in the process. The City is concerned that by delaying this analysis, it may jeopardize the opportunity to designate a multi-objective project as the National Economic Development (NED) plan, and the funding associated with such a designation.

Further, we are concerned that the ongoing maintenance requirements associated with the flood wall project alternative will require significant regular dredging of the river bottom. With the recent designation of the Pajaro River as Critical Habitat for steelhead, the environmental requirements could so severely constrain maintenance activities that this alternative may no longer be viable. It would be prudent to initiate some additional environmental study of this matter before the project proceeds all the way to the EIS/EIR stage.

The following is a summary of the City's understanding of the project alternatives, and additional reasons the City would like to see more consideration given to the multi-objective alternative:

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Flood Wall Alternatives: To date, the Army Corps has been focusing primarily on project alternatives which call for construction of flood walls on top of the existing levees. Concrete flood walls varying from zero to seven feet in height would confine Salsipuedes and Corralitos Creeks from Green Valley Road to the Pajaro River. Flood walls would likely vary from four to six feet in height along the Pajaro River from Murphy's Crossing to Highway 1. The level of flood protection is expected to range from 50 to 70 year (the existing levees provide flood protection at about the 25 year level). The total project cost for these alternatives is estimated at \$50 to \$100 million depending on the level of flood protection provided.

Flood Wall Alternatives have several positive aspects including minimal need for additional land/easement acquisition, ease of design, less impact on bridges and estimated lower overall cost. However, they also have significant drawbacks including a relatively low level of flood protection, significant visual impact, increased risk of catastrophic failure, maintenance concerns (graffiti removal & ongoing intensive riparian clearing), compromised public safety access, reduced recreational opportunities and significant environmental impacts.

Multi-Objective Project Alternatives: A multi-objective project alternative could potentially integrate other features such as bench land farming, recreational components, walking paths/bikeways, redevelopment, and environmental restoration with flood control. These alternatives consist of locating levees to create a wider corridor which would accommodate multiple uses in addition to providing flood protection. It is currently estimated that approximately five hundred feet of setback (roughly doubling the existing width) could provide over 100 year flood protection. Since it may not be feasible to move the levees back in some areas, a project of this type would probably require a combination of different approaches. The total cost for a multi-objective project alternative is estimated at approximately \$100 to \$150 million.

A multi-objective project alternative would potentially be eligible for a significant amount of outside funding not only for flood protection, but for recreational purposes and environmental enhancement as well. The federal government pays up to 50% of the non-flood control costs (i.e. costs exceeding those of the basic flood wall project). In addition, several State and private funding sources have expressed interest in supporting this type of project. This additional funding could potentially result in lower local costs than those of the flood wall alternative.

Multi-objective alternatives have many positive aspects including a high level of flood protection, significantly enhanced recreational opportunities, and reduced long term flood control maintenance costs, as well as significant visual and environmental enhancement. There are negative impacts to these alternatives including the need for land acquisition along the creeks and river resulting in a impacts to agricultural lands, a possible need for some relocation of housing/businesses and higher overall project cost.

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<u>City's General Plan:</u> The multi-objective alternative would support the goals and policies of the City's General Plan. The General Plan specifically calls for protection of the City's viewscapes and scenic natural resources (Policies 5.E and 5. J). Flood walls along the Pajaro River, Salsipuedes, and Corralitos Creek would negatively impact the current viewscape. The multi-use alternative would also provide for additional open space and wildlife habitat protection (Policies 9.A and 9.F), while the flood wall alternative would result in a number of environmental impacts, such as the periodic dredging that would be required to maintain river channel capacity.

Conclusion: The City of Watsonville fully supports improving flood control in the community. However, the City believes a multi-objective project approach would enhance the quality of life in our community, while flood wall alternatives would likely have a significant negative impact. Although land acquisition impacts of multi-objective alternatives are significant, the City believes the broad range of community benefits resulting from this type of project would outweigh such impacts. It is critical that the ACE conduct a thorough evaluation of potential multi-objective project alternatives to ensure that the best overall project concepts, or combination of concepts, are incorporated into the final project.


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

FLOOD WALLS

MULTI-OBJECTIVE PLAN

Without public input, the fate of the Pajaro River and Saisipuedes and Corralitos Creeks could be left to people who consider these waterways little more than drainage ditches. The Zone 7 Board, composed of Santa Cruz County Supervisors and other appointed individuals, will decide on February 6th whether the up to 8' high flood walls or a multi-objective plan should be done on these systems.

The flood walls would cost the least, take the shortest time to complete, and impact agriculture minimally. But the risk of a castastrophic failure would be high, the flood protection would only be for 50-70 years, the aquatic and terrestrial habitat would be significantly affected, recreational opportunities would be reduced, and it would be ugly.

A range of alternative plans could cost 15-20% more, take longer, and impact some agricultural pieces owned by farmers who would voluntarily allow their lands to be put into easements. On the up side, some of these plans would not be as dangerous, would provide 100-year or higher flood control, fish and bird habitat would be enhanced, recreation and ecotourism opportunities increased, and aesthetics would of course increase.

There is a need for everyone to work together to come to consensus about the river system, in a manner similar to the process that occurred on the Napa River. So there are two options for the community: a) flood walls, which is the position that the Army Corp of Engineers is promoting, and would be an easy fall back position for the Zone 7 Board since this is what they thought was originally going to happen before the multi-objective was suggested, orb) a yet-to-be determined multi-objective plan, which is what the City of Watsonville would like, and a request to institute a cross-county community planning process that would examine everything from fl ood walls to multi-objective (some flood walls may be inavoidable at critically narrow points).

Voice your concerns. The Zone 7 Board Meeting will address this issue on February 6th, 7:30 PM in Watsonville. The exact location is yet to be determined. Call the Santa Cruz County Public Works Dept. at 4542160, or the Board of Supervisors office at 4542200, to find out where the meeting will be held.
