REPORT ON COMMUNITY PROGRAMS TECHNOLOGY ENHANCEMENT

Dear Members of the Board:

As you recall, on December 12, 2000 your Board approved a \$225,000 contract with HandsNet to provide technology enhancements for Community Programs as the County's contribution to the Technology Learning Community (TLC) project. Since the contract generally provides for purchase and installation of computer hardware, software and start-up connectivity services, your Board requested a report back on how the computer technology would be distributed to the Community Programs.

HandsNet has completed its technology infrastructure survey of the Community Programs, and has generated a list of items each agency or program needs in order to enhance the computing capacity of the County funded community based organizations. As the attached summary indicates, \$78,744 will be spent to provide 68 computers to Community Programs, all PC units to be purchased locally. The contract will also invest more than \$93,012 for intra-agency networking as well as initial high-speed Digital Service Line (DSL) intemet connectivity services. Reserve funds are available to meet additional individual agency needs identified as the equipment and services are installed. This reserve is available, primarily because HandsNet has successfully leveraged the County support of TLC to obtain \$100,693 in inkind software contributions.

HandsNet will continue working with the Human Care Alliance to assure the acquisition and distribution of the hardware, software and services prior to June 30, 2001. Once

the equipment and services are installed, HandsNet will implement the TLC educational component focusing on program utilization and adaption to the new technology. For your reference, the attached summary also contains a list of the agencies and programs which will benefit from your Board's commitment to enhancing the technological capacity of the County's Community Programs.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED that your Board accept and file this report on the Community Programs Technology Enhancement contract.
