RE: APPOINTMENTS TO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS ADVISORY COMMISSION

Dear Members of the Board:

The term of office of three at-large appointees to the Hazardous Materials Advisory Commission, representing the Community At-Large, Labor and the City of Scotts Valley, will expire on April 1, 2001. These positions were included in the list prepared by the Clerk of the Board denoting scheduled vacancies to occur in the year 2001, therefore meeting posting requirements. While the appointments on behalf of Labor and the City of Scotts Valley only require action on the Consent Agenda to appoint the members nominated by those agencies, our appointment process for the Community At-Large position normally provides a two phase process to accept nominations on the Consent Agenda at one meeting and make final appointment on the next available Regular Agenda.

As you are aware, Supervisor Pirie has included a letter elsewhere on our agenda today which proposes to refer the issue of MTBE to the Hazardous Materials Advisory Commission so that the Commission can provide the Board with recommendations concerning the reduction or elimination of the storage and sale of gasoline containing MTBE in Santa Cruz County. However, the Commission currently has a number of vacancies and, given our upcoming two week break, will be in jeopardy of not being able to establish a quorum to consider this issue unless we take action today to make appointments. Accordingly, I am recommending that
