

# **ROLE OF THE COMMISSION**

The Hazardous Materials Advisory Commission (HMAC) was established under the authority of government Code Section 31000.1, and in compliance with Section 2.38.060 of the Santa Cruz County Code. Pursuant to Section 2.92.050, the HMAC is empowered to advise the Board of Supervisors on the initial and continuous implementation of the County's Hazardous Materials Ordinance. This includes effective methods of public information and education on all other matters pertaining to the use, transportation, handling and storage of toxic materials in the County.

# **MEETING DATES, TIME AND LOCATION**

The HMAC held meetings on a bi-monthly schedule throughout 2000. The meetings were held at 4:00 PM on the fourth Thursday of January, March, May, July, September, and on the third Thursday in November. Meetings are held at the County Buildings at 1080 Emeline Avenue, Building **F**, Solarium. The mailing address for the HMAC is in care of the Health Services Agency, Environmental Health Service at 701 Ocean Street, Room 312, Santa Cruz.

#### **COMMISSION STRUCTURE**

The HMAC consists of 15 positions, residents of Santa Cruz County, appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Following is a list of the year 2000 HMAC representatives:

# ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF COMMISSION

- Continued to review and assess hazardous materials issues forwarded by the Board of Supervisors.
- Continued to monitor hazardous materials and environmental issues related to legislative changes to assess their impact on Santa Cruz County.
- Continued oversight of the County's Household Hazardous Waste drop-off program.
- Supported the Environmental Health Services, Hazardous Materials website to assist in the County's public education program.
- Kept abreast of Environmental Heath Services activities related to hazardous materials.
- Reviewed and considered alternatives for funding of emergency response to hazardous materials incidents in Santa Cruz County.
- Made recommendation to pursue agreement for local Level II hazardous material spill/release response capability.
- Closely monitor rising concern of MTBE contamination in County water supplies.

### 2001 Goals of the Commission

- Submit Annual Report for 2000
- Continue to review and assess hazardous materials issues forwarded by the Board of Supervisors.
- Continue to monitor hazardous materials and environmental issues related to legislative changes to assess their impact on Santa Cruz County.
- Pursue universal adoption of Chapter 7.100 of the Santa Cruz County Hazardous Materials Ordinances by all cities in the County.
- Continue oversight of Household Hazardous Waste program.
- Continue to monitor the progress of the Memorandum of Understanding with the Scotts Valley Fire Protection District for Level II Hazardous Materials Response capabilities and track the kinds of incidents and problems that may arise out of the MOU's implementation.
- Investigate the possibility of a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors banning the use of MTBE in gasoline for Santa Cruz County and possibly a Board recommendation to the Regional Water Quality Control Board supporting a "regional ban".
- Monitor the countywide pesticide ban and provide comment.

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# **2001 Goals of the Commission** (Continued)

- Seek resolution to the fact that the Santa Cruz County Environmental Health Services does not currently have copies of historical UST/Clean-up files previously overseen by the City of Watsonville Fire Department.
- Explore the possibility of leaking underground storage tank contamination at Watsonville City Airport, similar to what has been found in Monterey.

## SPECIAL ACKNOWLEDGMENT

The Commission would like to acknowledge hard work and dedication of recently retired Helene French. In January 2001, Helene officially retired from the HMAC after 15 years of dedicated service. Commission members will miss Helene's wit, attention to detail, and reminder phone calls prior to each meeting. During Helene's tenure on the Commission many important issues were addressed including:

- The Comparative Risk Study
- Implementation of the Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA)
- Revision of the County's Hazardous Materials Ordinance
