SUBJECT: 12TH ANNUAL BOULDER CREEK ART AND WINE FESTIVAL
 AND 4TH OF JULY PARADE, HIGHWAY 9 CLOSURE

Members of the Board:

The Public Works Department was asked by the Boulder Creek Business Association to obtain a resolution from your Board in conjunction with the State Highway 9 community events. The resolution needs to be forwarded to the State of California Department of Transportation (CALTRANS) and the California Highway Patrol (CHP).

The 12th Annual Boulder Creek Art and Wine Festival is planned for the Memorial Day weekend, Saturday, May 26, 2001, through Monday, May 28, 2001. The festival will be similar to last year's event, with the exception that they will not close Forest Street nor perform one-way traffic restrictions along Pine Street.

The 12th Annual Boulder Creek 4th of July Parade involves a closure of Highway 9 in downtown Boulder Creek on Wednesday, July 4, 2001, from 8:00 a.m. until noon. As in past years, the CHP and the Santa Cruz County Sheriffs Office will assist with the control of traffic and the closure of Highway 9.

Prior to CALTRANS issuing an encroachment permit to use a State highway for a parade or special event, policy requires approval of a resolution from the local jurisdiction. Since these events only involve State Highway 9, other than the rerouting of traffic along County roads, approval of a County permit is not necessary from your Board.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors adopt the attached resolution requesting that CALTRANS permit the 12th Annual Boulder Creek Art and Wine Festival and the 4th of July Parade Highway 9 closure.

WHEREAS, a festival or parade on a State highway requires that the local jurisdiction request approval for the festival and parade.


