Redistricting of Supervisorial Boundaries

On March 27, 2001, your Board directed staff to return on April 17, 2001 with information on the 2000 census population of each Supervisorial District. Your Board also directed staff to return with a list of election contests requested by Board members for use in determining communities of interest for the redistricting process. And you requested that staff return with a review of the process of assigning population to census blocks and precincts, based on proportional geographic distribution.

Numerical Equality

Section 21500 of the Elections Code states that "following each decennial federal census, and using that census as a basis, the board shall adjust the boundaries of any or all of the supervisorial districts of the county so that the districts shall be as nearly equal in population as may be...". According to the 2000 Census data, the County of Santa Cruz has a population of 255,602. The target for numerical equality for each district is the total population divided by 5, or 51,120. The following table illustrates the census population for each Supervisorial district, and shortages or excesses, as compared to the target population.

The Process of Proportionate Geographic Distribution

As discussed in our report of March 27th, the method approved by the Board to allocate population where census blocks are split by Supervisorial boundaries, and where census blocks are intersected by precinct boundaries is to assign population consistent with the proportional geographic area.

There are 3,625 census blocks in the County, and of those 68 that had population were intersected by Supervisorial district lines. The geographic method of allocating population was employed for those 68 blocks, which accounted for 14,648 of the County's total population of 255,602. Maps and information demonstrating this process will be displayed at your meeting.

Election Contests

Staff provided your Board with a master list of election contests that have been held since 1992, and asked Board members to choose the contests that would be helpful to determining communities of interest for the redistricting process. In total, about 125 contests have been forwarded to staff by the Board offices. The contests requested are attached for your reference (Attachment 1). Staff is in the process of evaluating how best to address the differences in how voter precincts have been consolidated election year to election year, and how best to schedule the approximately 62 hours required to convert the data to the mapping software. Contest results for these elections will be provided by precinct in a report format for use in the redistricting process.

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Next Steps

Mapping staff has begun the process of allocating population to the County's voter precincts, as you know, the one representative from each Supervisorial District has been added to the Staff Working Group. The newly constituted group had its first joint meeting on Friday, April 13th. Staff is in the process of developing a calendar of meetings that would coincide with the Redistricting timeline that was adopted by your Board on March 27th. The public meetings that your Board requested be held in North County and South County have been scheduled, and they will be noticed to the public. The first will be at your regular meeting on May 22nd in the Board Chambers, and the second will comprise the evening schedule of your regular meeting on June 5th. The Watsonville City Council Chambers will be the location for the evening meeting on June 5th.

It is recommended that your Board accept and file this report on the Redistricting process.
