SUBJECT: GRAHAM HILL ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

ROARING CAMP ROAD TO 0.64 SOUTH DESIGN SERVICES BY CONSULTANT

Members of the Board:

As directed by your Board on March 27, 2001, the Department of Public Works met with the proposed design consultant, Sandis Humber Jones, to revise the contract language (Attachment I) for the Graham Hill Road Improvement Project to incorporate language that will provide for additional public participation in preliminary engineering and environmental work tasks of the project. The proposed revisions are incorporated in the attached scope of services.

In addition, because the work will require essentially two very distinct processes, Public Works requested that the consultant separate the work into two stages of proposed project development. Stage 1 shown within the attached contract is for both the public relations and environmental work tasks. Stage 2 would allow for all other project development work items, including preparation of plans and specifications for the project.

The proposed cost of these services is a not-to-exceed amount of \$332,698.00. Sufficient funding is included in the approved 2000/2001 Road Program using State Transportation Improvement Program revenue.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors take the following action:

1. Approve the independent contractor agreement with Sandis Humber Jones for engineering and public relations services for a not-to-exceed amount of \$332,698.00.

2. Authorize the Director of Public Works to sign the agreement on behalf of the County.

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INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

THIS CONTRACT is entered into this $\underline{27TH}$ day of MARCH. $\underline{200}$ 1, by and between the County of Santa Cruz, hereinafter called COUNTY, and SANDIS HUMBER JONES, hereinafter called CONTRACTOR. The parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>DUTIES.</u> CONTRACTOR agrees to exercise special skill to accomplish the following results: PROVIDE PRELIMINARY AND FINAL CIVIL DESIGN FOR THE PREPARATION OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE GRAHAM HILL ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PER ATTACHMENT 1.
- 2. <u>COMPENSATION.</u> The County of Santa Cruz shall reimburse the contractor for hours worked specified in the Contractor's Cost Proposal (Attachment 1).
- 3. <u>TIME OF BEGINNING AND COMPLETION</u>. Time of beginning and completion shall be as described: FROM BOARD OF SUPERVISOR'S APPROVAL UNTIL COMPLETION.

The CONTRACTOR shall not commence performance of work or services until this contract has been approved by the COUNTY and notification to proceed has been issued by the County's Contract Manager. No payment will be made for any work performed prior to the approval of this contract.

- 4. <u>EARLY TERMINATION.</u> The COUNTY reserves the right to terminate this contract upon thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the CONTRACTOR with the reasons for termination stated in the notice.
- 5. <u>INDEMNIFICATION FOR DAMAGES TAXES AND CONTRIBUTIONS.</u>
 CONTRACTOR shall exonerate, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless COUNTY (which for the purpose of paragraphs 5 and 6 shall include, without limitation, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers) from and against:
 - A. Any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, defense costs, or liability of any kind or nature which COUNTY may sustain or incur or which may be imposed upon it for injury to or death of persons, or damage to property to the extent arising out of, or caused, by negligent acts, errors or omissions of the CONTRACTOR, and its agents, officers, or employees in performing the work or services herein, and including reasonable attorney's fees provided, however that the CONTRACTOR'S duty to indemnify and hold harmless shall not include any claims or liability arising from the negligence or willful misconduct of the COUNTY, its agents, officers, or employees.
 - B. Any and all Federal, State and Local taxes, charges, fees, or contributions required to be paid with respect to CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S officers, employees and agents engaged in the performance of this Agreement (including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, social security and payroll tax withholding).

6. <u>INSURANCE</u>. CONTRACTOR, at its sole cost and expense, for the full term of this Agreement (and any extensions thereof), shall obtain and maintain at minimum compliance with all of the following insurance coverage(s) and requirements. Such insurance coverage shall be primary coverage as respects COUNTY and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by COUNTY shall be excess of CONTRACTORS insurance coverage and shall not contribute to it.

If CONTRACTOR utilizes one or more subcontractors in the performance of the Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall obtain and maintain Independent Contractor's Insurance as to each subcontractor or otherwise provide evidence of insurance coverage for each subcontractor equivalent to that required of CONTRACTOR in this Agreement, unless CONTRACTOR and COUNTY both initial here

- (2) Automobile Liability Insurance for each of CONTRACTORS vehicles used in the performance of this Agreement, including owned, non-owned (e.g. owned by CONTRACTOR'S employees), leased or hired vehicles, in the minimum amount of \$500,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. This insurance coverage shall not be required if vehicle use by CONTRACTOR is not a material part of performance of this Agreement and CONTRACTOR and COUNTY both certify to this fact by initialing here ____/_
- (3) Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance coverage in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit, including coverage for: (a) bodily injury, (b) personal injury, (c) broad-form property damage, (d) contractual liability, and (e) cross- liability.
- (4) Professional Liability Insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit, if, and only if, this Subparagraph is initialed by CONTRACTOR and COUNTY ____/

B. Other Insurance Provisions

(1) If any insurance coverage required in this Agreement is provided on a "Claims Made" rather than "Occurrence" form, CONTRACTOR agrees to maintain the required coverage for a period of three (3) years after the expiration of this Agreement (hereinafter "post agreement coverage") and any extensions thereof. CONTRACTOR may maintain the required post agreement coverage by renewal or purchase of prior acts or tail coverage. This provision is contingent upon post agreement coverage being both available and reasonably affordable in relation to the coverage provided during the term of this Agreement. For purposes of interpreting this requirement, a cost not exceeding 100% of the last annual policy premium during the term of this Agreement in order to purchase prior acts or tail coverage for post agreement coverage shall be deemed to be reasonable.

(2) All required Automobile and Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance shall be endorsed to contain the following clause:

"The County of Santa Cruz, its officials, employees, agents and volunteers are added as an additional insured as respects the operations and activities of, or on behalf of, the named insured performed under Agreement with the County of Santa Cruz."

(3) All required insurance policies shall be endorsed to contain the following clause: "This insurance shall not be canceled until after thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to:

(4) CONTRACTOR agrees to provide its insurance broker(s) with a full copy of these insurance provisions and provide COUNTY on or before the effective date of this Agreement with Certificates of Insurance for all required coverages. All Certificates of Insurance shall be delivered or sent to:

- 7. <u>EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY.</u> During and in relation to the performance of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:
 - A. The CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancer related), marital status, pregnancy, sex, sexual orientation, age (over 1 8), veteran status or any other non-merit factor unrelated to job duties. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: recruitment; advertising; layoff or terminate; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training (including apprenticeship), employment, upgrading, demotion and transfer. The CONTRACTOR agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notice setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.
 - B. If this Agreement provides compensation in excess of \$25,000 to CONTRACTOR the CONTRACTOR shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancer related), marital status, pregnancy, sex, sexual orientation, age (over 1 8), veteran status or any other non-merit factor unrelated to job duties.
 - C. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with the Federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) Consultant Contract Requirements as outlined in Attachment No. 2.

- (1) The CONTRACTOR shall furnish COUNTY Affirmative Action Office information and reports in the prescribed reporting format (PER 4012) identifying the sex, race, physical or mental disability and job classification of its employees and the names, dates and methods of advertisement and direct solicitation efforts made to subcontract with Minority/Women/Disabled Business Enterprises.
- (2) In the event of the CONTRACTORS non-compliance with the non- discrimination clauses of this Agreement or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders said CONTRACTOR may be declared ineligible for further agreements with the COUNTY.
- D. The CONTRACTOR shall cause the foregoing provisions of Subparagraphs 7B. and 7C. to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered under this Agreement by a subcontractor compensated more than \$25,000, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- 8. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS.</u> CONTRACTOR and COUNTY have reviewed and considered the principal test and secondary factors below and agree that CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor and not an employee of COUNTY. CONTRACTOR is responsible for all insurance (workers compensation, unemployment, etc.) and all payroll related taxes. CONTRACTOR is not entitled to any employee benefits. COUNTY agrees that CONTRACTOR shall have the right to control the manner and means of accomplishing the result contracted herein.

 $\underline{PRINCIPAL\ TEST} \hbox{: The CONTRACTOR rather than COUNTY has the right to control the manner and means of accomplishing the result contracted for .}$

SECONDARY FACTORS: (a) The extent of control which, by agreement, COUNTY may exercise over the details of the work is slight rather than substantial; (b) CONTRACTOR is engaged in a distinct occupation or business; (c) In the locality, the work to be done by CONTRACTOR is usually done by a specialist without supervision, rather than under the direction of an employer; (d) the skill required in the particular occupation is substantial rather than slight; (e) The CONTRACTOR rather than the COUNTY supplies the instrumentalities, tools and work place; (f) The length of time for which CONTRACTOR is engaged is of limited duration rather than indefinite; (g) The method of payment of CONTRACTOR is by job rather than by time; (h) The work is part of a special or permissive activity, program, or project, rather than part of the regular business of COUNTY; (i) CONTRACTOR and COUNTY believe they are creating an independent contractor relationship rather than an employer-employee relationship; and (j) the COUNTY conducts public business.

It is recognized that is not necessary that all secondary factors support creation of an independent contractor relationship, but rather that overall there are significant secondary factors which indicate that CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor.

By their signatures to this Agreement each of the undersigned certifies that it is his or her considered judgment that the CONTRACTOR engaged under this Agreement is in fact an independent contractor.



9. <u>CONTRACTOR</u> represents that its operations are in compliance with applicable County planning, environmental and other laws or regulations.

- 10. <u>COST PRINCIPLES.</u> Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 48 Chapter 1, Part 3 1 shall be used to determine the allowability of the individual items of cost. The contractor agrees to comply with federal procedures in accordance with CFR 49, Part 18, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments. Any costs for which payments have been made to the contractor, which are determined by subsequent audit to be unallowable under CFR 48, Chapter 1 Part 3 1, are subject to repayment by the contractor to the County of Santa Cruz, the State and the Federal Government. Any subcontract, entered into as a result of this contract, shall contain all of the provisions of this article.
- 11. <u>NON-ASSIGNMENT.</u> CONTRACTOR shall not assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the COUNTY.
- 12. RECORD RETENTION AND AUDIT. CONTRACTOR shall retain records pertinent to this Agreement for a period of not less than five (5) years after final payment under this Agreement or until a final audit report is accepted by COUNTY, State and the Federal Highway Administration, or their duly authorized representatives, whichever occurs first. CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to be subject to the examination and audit by the Santa Cruz County Auditor-Controller, the Auditor General of the State of California, the Federal Highway Administration or the designee of either for a period of five (5) years after final payment under this Agreement. Any subcontract entered into as a result of this contract shall contain all of the provisions of this Article.
- 13. <u>PRESENTATION OF CLAIMS.</u> Presentation and processing of any or all claims arising out of or related to this Agreement shall be made in accordance with the provisions contained in Chapter 1.05 of the Santa Cruz County Code, which by this reference is incorporated herein.
- 14. <u>COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES</u>. The CONTRACTOR warrants that he/she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working for the CONTRACTOR, to solicit or secure this agreement, and that he/she has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona tide employee, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or formation of this agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, the COUNTY shall have the right to annul this agreement without liability, or at its discretion to deduct from the agreement price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee.
- 15. <u>DESIGN STANDARDS</u>. The CONTRACTOR shall conform with standards for design as required by the COUNTY, State of California and the Federal Highway Administration. All documents required under this Agreement, including but not limited to plans, specifications, estimates, reports and investigations, shall be prepared in accordance with guidelines established by the COUNTY, State of California and the Federal Highway Administration.
- OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS. All tracings, plans, specifications and maps prepared or obtained under the terms of this agreement shall be delivered to and become the property of the COUNTY. Basic survey notes and sketches, charts, computations and other data prepared or obtained under this agreement shall be made available, upon request, to the COUNTY without restriction or limitation on their use. The COUNTY shall not reuse or make any modification to the plans and specifications without the prior written authorization of the CONTRACTOR.

- 17. <u>CHANGES IN WORK</u>. Changes in work shall be set forth in a supplemental agreement which shall specify, in addition to the work to be done in connection with the changes made, adjustment of contract time, if any, and the basis of compensation for such work. A supplemental agreement shall not become effective until approved by the COUNTY. When compensation for an item of work is subject to adjustment, the CONTRACTOR shall, upon request, furnish the COUNTY with adequate detailed cost data for such item of work.
- 18. <u>DELAYS AND EXTENSIONS.</u> If work called for under the agreement is not finished within the specified time period, the COUNTY may extend the period of the contract. The COUNTY may charge the CONTRACTOR for overhead expenses which are directly chargeable to the contract and accrue during the extension. The CONTRACTOR shall notify the COUNTY of any delays, in writing, within 15 days of the beginning of any delay. The CONTRACTOR shall have no claim for damage or compensation for any delay unless otherwise agreed to by the COUNTY.
- 19. <u>SUBCONTRACTORS. ASSIGNMENT AND TRANSFER.</u> The CONTRACTOR shall perform the work contemplated with resources available within its own organization and no portion of the work pertinent to this contract shall be subcontracted without written authorization by the County of Santa Cruz's Contract Manager, except that which is expressly identified in the Contractor's Cost Proposal. Any subcontract in excess of \$25,000, entered into as a result of this contract, shall contain all the provisions stipulated in this contract to be applicable to subcontractors. Any substitution of subcontractors must be approved in writing by the County of Santa Cruz's Contract Manager.
- 20. <u>CONTRACTORS ENDORSEMENT OF PS&E AND OTHER DATA</u>. The responsible CONTRACTOR shall sign all plans, specifications, estimate, PS&E and engineering data furnished by him/her and where appropriate, indicate his/her registration number.
- 21. <u>GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 7550</u>. The CONTRACTOR shall be subject to the following part of Government Code Section 7550 concerning required notice on any documents or written reports that he/she has prepared:

"Any document or written report prepared for or under the direction of the State or Local Agency, which is prepared in whole or in part by non-employees of such Agency, shall contain the numbers and dollar amounts of all contracts and subcontracts relating to the preparation of such document or written report; provided, however, that the total cost for work performed by non-employees of the agency exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000). The contract and subcontract numbers and dollar amounts shall be contained in a separate section of such document or written report..."

"When multiple documents or written reports are the subject or product of the contract, the disclosure section may also contain a statement indicating that the total contract amount represents compensation for multiple documents or written reports."



- 22. <u>CERTIFICATION BY CONTRACTOR AND BY COUNTY</u>. At the time of execution of this agreement, the CONTRACTOR shall execute Attachment No. 3, "Certification of Consultant" and the COUNTY shall execute Attachment No. 4, "Certification of Local Agency."

COUNTY OF SANTA CRUZ - GRAHAM HILL ROAD 0127 IMPROVEMENT PROJECT SCOPE OF SERVICES

PHASE A -SUPPLEMENTAL TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY

- A I Review existing site conditions
- A2 Review County provided Railroad, County and Utility company plans or record drawings for improvements and utilities in and around the project area.
- A3 Review County provided topographic survey of the project area. This survey to be prepared at a scale of 1:300 by others. We will utilize the 1:300 scale to prepare improvement plans to meet the County off Santa Cruz requirements.
- A4 Perform spot check of Santa Cruz County provided topographic information (8 hours), and tree locations (8 hours). The location of utility vaults, poles, manholes, valve boxes, meter boxes, catch basins and invert information of storm and sewer facilities will be shown based upon the County field survey. The location of underground lines such as gas, water, electric and any private (on-site) utilities will be shown based upon available agency records. Mechanical detection of underground utilities is specifically excluded.

PHASE B - RIGHT-OF-WAY

- B1 County to provide record maps, monumentation and horizontal control for alignment.
- B2 Santa Cruz County property lines and right-of-way lines based upon record data and/or found monuments determined by field survey. Santa Cruz County to prepare any official record maps for recording.
- B3 Santa Cruz County to provide Title Reports for properties that have right-of-way issues.
- B4 Santa Cruz County to prepare Legal Descriptions and Plats for right-of-way acquisition and/or easements.

PHASE C - PUBLIC RELATIONS

- **c1** Review preliminary plan previously prepared by County.
- Sandis Humber Jones, Ingram Group, EMC and others as appropriate will attend meetings with Santa Cruz County staff, present project and any minor revisions and conduct strategy meeting with other team consultants and County regarding any suggestions or recommendations. Particular emphasis shall be given to





discussion and implementing activities which will best encourage public awareness, participation, and dialog related to community issues and concerns to be incorporated in preliminary design, planning and environmental assessment, and construction of the project.

Ingram Group will conduct initial legally required public informational and scoping meeting with the Graham Hill Road Team (Santa Cruz County, Sandis Humber Jones, EMC Planning Inc., Sampson Engineering Inc., and Biotic Resources Group) to:

- 1) provide information about the proposed project including purpose, need, encouragement and opportunities for meaningful involvement; anticipated work process and time lines; contact information, etc.
- 2) provide a structure for and encourage comments and dialog about items and issues to be considered in the design and engineering of the project.

Outreach methods to be initiated prior to and in conjunction with the scoping meeting, intended to provide information and encourage participation, and are anticipated to include:

- 1) early contact/noticing with affected property owners, decision-makers, organizations, businesses/chamber/community leaders, media, and others;
- 2) flier, news release(s), and display ad in local print media and for community distribution briefly describing the project, announcing the meeting and encouraging participation;
- 3) targeted personal contact;
- 4) website information linkage;
- 5) other informational materials as appropriate and needed for the meeting (ex) map of project area; process and involvement opportunity diagram; anticipated project tasks and time lines.
- c4 Ingram Group will conduct informational workshop prior to release of IS/EA.
- C5 Ingram Group will prepare formal noticing to adjoining property owners (within 500' of project), local agencies (public, utilities), businesses/chamber/ community leaders, clubs or organizations (Sierra Club, Valley Women's Club) and assist in the publication of public notices and newspaper ads in local newspapers (Santa Cruz, Watsonville, San Lorenzo Valley).

In conjunction with the Project Team Ingram Group will:

- 1) prepare legally required formal notice to be mailed by the County to property owners, along with easy to read/understand information about the project and opportunities for and encouraging involvement and comment;
- 2) prepare legally required public notice and a news release and display ad announcing and describing the project, how the public can participate, etc., for print media.
- C6 Ingram Group will conduct follow-up meetings in the community to inform about project by ads in newspapers, mailers to key leaders/organizations, media contracts.
- c7 All publication/media expenses (newspaper ads, fliers/mailers, T.V., radio, web site, etc.) will be paid by the County.



- Ingram Group will facilitate two community meetings during the preliminary design process. The intent of community meetings is to assure that there is meaningful opportunity for the public to be involved in an awareness, understanding, and input process for the project, particularly at key junctures such as in initial scoping, preliminary design, and planning and environmental phases. Meetings will focus on providing information about the project and identifying community issues and concerns that must be addressed in the project phases (trees, environmental issues, aesthetics, traffic, safety, construction issues). Additional meetings, contact, information news releases/updates, and/or presentations can be conducted as needed or deemed desirable.
- C9 Ingram Group will facilitate two community meetings during construction (one meeting for Phase 1 Timber Harvesting and one meeting for Phase 2 Road Construction).

PHASE D - PRELIMINARY DESIGN

- D1 Sampson Engineering Inc. will mark proposed test boring locations in white paint, and contact Underground Service Alert (USA) at least seven days prior to drilling test borings. In addition, Sampson Engineering Inc. will subcontract a private underground utility locator to assist in clearing proposed test boring locations.
- D2 Sampson Engineering Inc. will subcontract United Rentals Highway Technologies (formerly Fitzpatrick Barricade and Safety Supply) to provide a "rolling lane closure" for the two day period over which the drilling work will be performed. This will include two traffic control technicians, traffic cones and signs, and flashing arrow boards.
- D3 Sampson Engineering Inc. will perform exploration, classification and sampling of subsurface soils at the following locations:

Sampson Engineering Inc. will carefully note the existing depth of asphaltic concrete and aggregate base at each test boring location. For the lane center-line borings, a sample of native subgrade soil will be obtained at each location for testing outlined in Item 4. The holes will be backfilled with the soil cuttings and surfaced with compacted "cold patch" asphalt mix at the completion of drilling.

D4 Laboratory testing of the selected soil samples to determine their relevant engineering properties. This will include Atterberg limits, direct shear, gradation, and other relevant tests. The five selected bulk subgrade soil samples obtained from the road center-line will be tested in accordance with California Method 301 (R-value test).

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SANDIS HUMBER JONES

- D 5 Slope stability analyses will be performed on selected cut and fill embankments. This will assist with determining appropriate slope gradients and required geotextile fabric reinforcement of 1.5:1 or steeper slope sections.
 - Preparation of a written report presenting Sampson Engineering Inc.'s findings and conclusions, and providing geotechnical recommendations for: site preparation; grading and compaction; retaining wall foundations and allowable bearing capacities; retaining wall lateral pressures; new pavement sections; backfill requirements for utility trenches; and surface drainage control. This report will include boring logs indicating the soil profile encountered and a site plan showing the test boring locations.
 - D7 Three copies of a report presenting Sampson Engineering Inc.'s findings, conclusions, and recommendations will be prepared and submitted to the County. If the presence of hazardous materials/waste and/or petroleum contamination is suspected or identified, additional sampling and chemical analyses may be recommended. The report shall include a site map showing the locations of soil vapor sampling and any suspected or identified contamination.
 - D8 Review cross sections prepared by County of existing roadways at 20 meter intervals.
 - D9 Sandis Humber Jones and our consultants will utilize the approved horizontal alignment prepared by County.
 - D10 Sandis Humber Jones will review existing County drainage data and storm drainage analysis to confirm the size of proposed storm drain pipe.
 - D11 Prepare a set of Final Preliminary Design Plans showing the proposed Improvements required by the County and prepare an Engineer's Preliminary Opinion of Probable Construction Costs.
 - D12 Submit Final Preliminary Design Plans for review and approval by the neighborhood and the County prior to starting Final Improvement Plans.

PHASE E- PLANNING/ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

- Confirm project limits and project components and review existing County documentation.
- Sandis Humber Jones, Ingram Group, EMC and Biotic Resources Group will attend a site visit meeting to confirm the existing EA/IS findings and to gain the focus necessary to make recommendations to the Santa Cruz County Public Works staff regarding the earlier public comment received during preliminary plan preparation.
- E3 EMC Planning Group will prepare a comment letter addressing the adequacy of the DEA/IS.
- E4 Biotic Resources Group will prepare a Riparian and Wetland Revegetation Plan.



SANDIS HUMBER JONES

- E5 Biotic Resources Group will assist with securing necessary regulatory permits COE Nationwide Permit, CDFG Streambed Attention Permit, RWQCB water quality certification, USFWS Section 7 consultation with FHWA as lead agency.
 - E6 County will prepare and submit the permit applications to the regulatory agencies

PHASE F - CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS

F1 It is proposed that the project be split into two phases, the Timber Harvest - Phase 1 and the Road Construction - Phase 2.

Prepare two final sets of Improvement Plans based on the approved Final Preliminary Plans and submit for review and approval by the county. Plans to be prepared in Autocad Release 14/SoftDesk Version 8 format at a metric scale of 1:300.

- F2 Consultant and County to coordinate with utility companies on the approved Preliminary Design Plans so they can identify conflicts/problems for undergrounding/relocating their facilities as soon as practical.
- F3 Consultant and County to Coordinate with the Railroad on the approved Preliminary Design Plans such that the County of Santa Cruz, the Rail Road and the Consultant can identify problems with the tracks to Roaring Camp.
- F4 Biotic Resources Group will develop planting notes, notes for site maintenance and monitoring, and specifications for planting and seeding.
- Provide four sets of plans for each phase for review by County at the 60%, 90% and 100% complete stage.
- Prepare a complete set of Technical Specifications for each phase for review and approval by the County. Work to include review of county provided "boiler plate" to make documents project specific.
- Prepare Engineer's Final Opinion of Probable Construction Costs for Civil work for both phases and submit for review and approval by the county. Probable costs to be presented in spreadsheet format based on Microsoft Excel.

PHASE G - CONSTRUCTION SUPPORT SERVICES

G1 Construction support services are excluded from the contract.

- Attend monthly progress meetings for the duration of the project (based on 18 months).
 - Prepare brief Monthly Progress Reports for the duration of the project.
 - Reimbursable expenses such as; progress printing, copies, photos, travel costs within Santa Cruz County, etc. Bid sets and out of County travel costs are specifically excluded.
