Dear Members of the Board:

The Mesa Verde Homeowners Association (MVHA) was established in August, 2000, as a direct result of the support of the Sheriff's Department's Problem Oriented Policing (P.O.P.) program. The Mesa Verde Homeowners Association meets on a regular basis, along with the Deputies from the Sheriff's substation in Freedom, to attempt to foster safe neighborhoods and to tackle the problems of gangs, graffiti and the like. In order to continue with their efforts, MVHA will be conducting a Spring neighborhood cleanup day.

Waste Management of Santa Cruz County has generously agreed to provide two dumpsters and a driver for the event, and residents of the neighborhood will be strongly encouraged to recycle everything possible. Flyers will be generated by MVHA in both English and Spanish, informing the residents of this important message on recycling.

Jim Moresco from Waste Management of Santa Cruz County continues to demonstrate his commitment to our community. However, he will need our assistance. Clearly, a collaborative project such as this, between the private and public sectors, is of significant benefit to the residents of the County of Santa Cruz.
