Re: APPROVAL OF OFFICE OF TRAFFIC SAFETY GRANT APPLICATION

Dear Members of the Board:

The Health Services Agency (HSA) requests your Board's approval to apply to the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) for a two-year grant to develop and establish a Comprehensive Countywide Bike, Pedestrian, and Occupant Protection Education Program.

The County is eligible to receive a two-year grant award of \$234,882. Proposed activities will:

- Expand the Community Traffic Safety Coalition's current countywide bilingual Bicycle and Pedestrian Education Elementary School Program;
- Identify areas near schools that are dangerous to school-age pedestrians and bicyclists and expand safety outreach and education efforts in these areas;
- Establish a bicycle safety training program for adults to include the provision of rechargeable bike lights as incentives to program participants; and
- Develop and implement a Child Passenger Safety Program, including child safety education and training, expanding car seat distribution sites, car seat checkup events, and community outreach efforts.

HSA met with the Community Traffic Safety Coalition, the Public Works Department, and Bike to Work staff on July 11, 2001, to develop a Draft Project Agreement within the parameters suggested by OTS. A copy of the Draft Project Agreement is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

Establishment of a Comprehensive Countywide Bike, Pedestrian, and Occupant Protection Education Program will assist our community in the realization of its goal for a comprehensive

approach to traffic safety education and outreach. These new components will enhance ongoing programs to improve the safety of road travel in Santa Cruz County.

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board:

1. Authorize the submission of the funding application (on file with the Clerk of the Board) to the California Office of Traffic Safety for the Comprehensive Countywide Bike, Pedestrian, and Occupant Protection Education Program in the amount of \$234,882.
