WHEREAS, Santa Cruz County is shocked and saddened by the cowardly acts of terrorism committed on American soil on September 11, 2001; and

WHEREAS, in response to these acts, Santa Cruz County has worked closely with federal, State, and local agencies; and

WHEREAS, Santa Cruz County has increased security measures to protect citizens and their property from any future threats; and

WHEREAS, Santa Cruz County will send trained personnel to assist rescue and recovery efforts, if needed; and

WHEREAS, Santa Cruz County is assisting our employees and citizens in their time of need; and

WHEREAS, by adopting this resolution, the members of the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors, acting on behalf of the Santa Cruz County community, are expressing our extreme gratitude for the bravery and self-sacrifice displayed by rescue personnel; and

WHEREAS, it is vital that the American spirit remain strong and that freedom continues to be the foundation of our country.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Santa Cruz County condemns these terrorist acts and fully supports the ongoing efforts and leadership of the President of the United States as we move forward in this time of tragedy and in pursuit of bringing those behind these attacks to justice.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Santa Cruz County will continue to work closely with the Governor of California on security measures and support his commitment to ensure that our Golden State remains a State of freedom, peace, and prosperity.
