SUBJECT: LANDFILL GAS COLLECTION SYSTEM MONITORING, MAINTENANCE

AND REPAIRS

Members of the Board:

In May 2001, the Buena Vista Landfill was issued a new federal Title V permit from the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District. This new federal permitting program, administered at the local air district level, addresses recent changes in federal and state laws which require expansion of air pollution control measures to medium to large sized municipal solid waste landfills. The permit contains several new and more stringent landfill gas management requirements that are being added to our environmental management program at the Buena Vista Landfill, These new air pollution control measures, not currently required under our operational permit, include regular scheduled monitoring of surface emissions from the active and closed landfill, 24-hour remote monitoring of the landfill gas destruction equipment, expansion of the gas collection system to capture a higher percentage of the generated gas, installation of new collection wells in response to monitoring results, and more frequent reporting requirements. Plans are currently being finalized for expansion of the gas collection system which is scheduled for bidding this winter. Our deadline for coming into full compliance with this new permit is May 2002.

The new landfill gas management conditions in the Title V permit will require more advanced staff training and experience. We have recently experienced turnover in our environmental compliance staff at the landfill and do not currently have the expertise or experience at the field staff level to fully implement these new permit requirements. In response to this immediate need, we have interviewed and reviewed qualifications of three solid waste consulting firms, including our current solid waste consultant, GeoSyntec, to evaluate its expertise in the area of landfill gas management operation and maintenance services. Based on this interview, we have selected SCS Field Services (SCS) as the most qualified landfill gas field service provider. SCS is a full service solid waste consultant engineering firm; however, they specialize and have a strong reputation in the area of landfill gas management services.

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Attached you will find an agreement with SCS for monitoring, maintenance and repairs of the Buena Vista Landfill and Ben Lomond Landfill gas migration and control facilities. This agreement is structured for SCS to initially provide regular landfill gas management services and at the same time train and educate new environmental compliance staff at the landfill. SCS will also be available for emergency repairs and parts supply on an as-needed basis. Over time SCS's role will be reduced to quarterly review of system operations and emergency repairs.

The first year monitoring and maintenance component of this agreement is \$32,920. **An** additional \$15,000 is being added to this agreement to cover emergency system repairs, parts and unscheduled collection well replacements. Sufficient funds are available in the County Service Area No. 9-C, Solid Waste and Recycling Services Budget for this purpose.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors approve the attached independent contractor agreement with SCS Field Services for landfill gas collection system monitoring repairs and maintenance, for a total not-to-exceed cost of \$47,920.00, and authorize the Director of Public Works to sign the agreement on behalf of the County.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

THIS CONTRACT is entered into this 6th day of November, 2001, by and between the COUNTY OF SANTA CRUZ, hereinafter called COUNTY, and SCS FIELD SERVICES, hereinafter called CONTRACTOR. The parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>DUTIES</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to exercise special skill to accomplish the following result: provide monitoring, maintenance and repair services for the County landfill gas collection and treatment systems as outlined in the attached Scope of Work.
- 2. <u>COMPENSATION</u>. In consideration for CONTRACTOR accomplishing said result, COUNTY agrees to pay CONTRACTOR as follows: Contractor shall receive monthly progress payments in accordance with tasks outlined in the attached Scope of Work. A contingency of \$15,000 is included for emergency repairs, parts and unscheduled replacement of landfill gas collection wells. Contingency funds can only be utilized with prior approval of Public Works for services not specifically outlined in the attached Scope of Work. Payment for services performed, including any approved use of contingency funds shall not exceed \$47,920.
- **3.** TERM. The term of this contract shall be: From Board approval to June 30, 2002"
- **4.** <u>EARLY TERMINATION</u>. Either party hereto may terminate this contract at any time by giving 30 days written notice to the other party.
- 5. <u>INDEMNIFICATION FOR DAMAGES, TAXES AND CONTRIBUTIONS</u>. CONTRACTOR shall exonerate, indemnify, defend, and hold harmless COUNTY (which for the purpose of paragraphs 5 and 6 shall include, without limitation, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers) from and against:
- A. Any and all claims, demands, losses, damages, defense costs, or liability of any kind or nature which COUNTY may sustain or incur or which may be imposed upon it for injury to or death of persons, or damage to property as a result of, arising out of, or in any manner connected with the CONTRACTOR'S negligent performance under the terms of this Agreement, excepting any liability arising out of the sole negligence of the COUNTY. Such indemnification includes any damage to the person(s), or property(ies) of CONTRACTOR and third persons.
- B. Any and all Federal, State and Local taxes, charges, fees, or contributions required to be paid with respect to CONTRACTOR and CONTRACTOR'S officers, employees and agents engaged in the Performance of this Agreement (including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, social security and payroll tax withholding).
- 6. <u>INSURANCE</u>. CONTRACTOR, at its sole cost and expense, for the full term of this Agreement (and any extensions thereof), shall obtain and maintain at a minimum compliance with all of the following insurance coverage(s) and requirements. Such insurance coverage shall be primary coverage as respects COUNTY and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by County shall be excess of CONTRACTOR'S insurance coverage and shall not contribute to it.

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If CONTRACTOR utilizes one or more subcontractors in the performance of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall obtain and maintain Independent Contractor's Insurance as to each subcontractor or otherwise provide evidence of insurance coverage for each subcontractor equivalent to that required of CONTRACTOR in this Agreement, unless CONTRACTOR and COUNTY both initial here _____/

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A. Types of Insurance and Minimum Limits

- (2) Automobile Liability Insurance for each of CONTRACTOR's vehicles used in the performance of this Agreement, including owned, non-owned (e.g. owned by CONTRACTOR's employees), leased or hired vehicles, in the minimum amount of \$500,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. This insurance coverage shall not be required if vehicle use by CONTRACTOR is not a material part of performance of this Agreement and CONTRACTOR and COUNTY both certify to this fact by initialing here _____/___.
- (3) Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance coverage in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit, including coverage for: (a) bodily injury, (b) personal injury, (c) broad-form property damage, (d) contractual liability, and (e) cross-liability.
- (4) Professional Liability Insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit, if, and only if, this Subparagraph is initialed by CONTRACTOR and COUNTY _____/___.

B. Other Insurance Provisions

- (1) If any insurance coverage required in this Agreement is provided on a "Claims Made" rather than "Occurrence" form, CONTRACTOR agrees to maintain the required coverage for a period of three (3) years after the expiration of this Agreement (hereinafter "post agreement coverage") and any extensions thereof. CONTRACTOR may maintain the required post agreement coverage by renewal or purchase of prior acts or tail coverage. This provision is contingent upon post agreement coverage being both available and reasonably affordable in relation to the coverage provided during the term of this Agreement. For purposes of interpreting this requirement, a cost not exceeding 100% of the last annual policy premium during the term of this Agreement in order to purchase prior acts or tail coverage for post agreement coverage shall be deemed to be reasonable.
- (2) All required Automobile and Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance shall be endorsed to contain the following clause:

"The County of Santa Cruz, its officials, employees, agents and volunteers are added as an additional insured as respects the operations and activities of, or on behalf of, the named insured performed under Agreement with the County of Santa Cruz."

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(3) All required insurance policies shall be endorsed to contain the

following clause:

"This insurance shall not be canceled until after thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to:

(4) CONTRACTOR agrees to provide its insurance broker(s) with a full copy of these insurance provisions and provide COUNTY on or before the effective date of this Agreement with Certificates of Insurance for all required coverages. All Certificates of Insurance shall be delivered or sent to:

- 7. <u>EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY</u>. During and in relation to the performance of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR agrees as follows:
- A. The CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancer related), marital status, pregnancy, sex, sexual orientation, age (over 18), veteran status or any other non-merit factor unrelated to job duties. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: recruitment; advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training (including apprenticeship), employment, upgrading, demotion, transfer. The CONTRACTOR agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notice setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.
- B. If this Agreement provides compensation in excess of \$50,000 to CONTRACTOR and if CONTRACTOR employs fifteen (15) or more employees, the following requirements shall apply:
- (1) The CONTRACTOR shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition (cancer related), marital status, pregnancy, sex, sexual orientation, age (over 18), veteran status, or any other non-merit factor unrelated to job duties. In addition, the CONTRACTOR shall make a good faith effort to consider Minority/Women/Disabled Owned Business Enterprises in CONTRACTOR's solicitation of goods and services. Definitions for Minority/Women/Disabled Business Enterprises are available from the COUNTY General Services Purchasing Division.
- (2) The CONTRACTOR shall furnish COUNTY Equal Employment Opportunity Office information and reports in the prescribed reporting format (PER 4012)

identifying the sex, race, physical or mental disability and job classification of its employees and the names, dates and methods of advertisement and direct solicitation efforts made to subcontract with Minority/Women/Disabled Business Enterprises.

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- (3) In the event of the CONTRACTOR'S non-compliance with the non-discrimination clauses of this Agreement or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders said CONTRACTOR may be declared ineligible for further agreements with the COUNTY.
- (4) The CONTRACTOR shall cause the foregoing provisions of this Subparagraph 7B. to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered under this Agreement by a subcontractor compensated more than \$50,000 and employing more than fifteen (15) employees, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- 8. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS. CONTRACTOR and COUNTY have reviewed and considered the principal test and secondary factors below and agree that CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor and not an employee of COUNTY. CONTRACTOR is responsible for all insurance (workers compensation, unemployment, etc.) and all payroll related taxes. CONTRACTOR is not entitled to any employee benefits. COUNTY agrees that CONTRACTOR shall have the right to control the manner and means of accomplishing the result contracted for herein.

<u>PRINCIPAL TEST</u>: The CONTRACTOR rather than COUNTY has the right to control the manner and means of accomplishing the result contracted for.

SECONDARY FACTORS: (a) The extent of control which, by agreement, COUNTY may exercise over the details of the work is slight rather than substantial; (b) CONTRACTOR is engaged in a distinct occupation or business; (c) In the locality, the work to be done by CONTRACTOR is usually done by a specialist without supervision, rather than under the direction of an employer; (d) the skill required in the particular occupation is substantial rather than slight; (e) The CONTRACTOR rather than the COUNTY supplies the instrumentalities, tools and work place; (f) The length of time for which CONTRACTOR is engaged is of limited duration rather than indefinite; (g) The method of payment of CONTRACTOR is by the job rather than by the time; (h) The work is part of a special or permissive activity, program, or project, rather than part of the regular business of COUNTY; (i) CONTRACTOR and COUNTY believe they are creating an independent contractor relationship rather than an employer-employee relationship; and (j) The COUNTY conducts public business.

It is recognized that it is not necessary that all secondary factors support creation of an independent contractor relationship, but rather that overall there are significant secondary factors which indicate that CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor.

By their signatures to this Agreement, each of the undersigned certifies that it is his or her considered judgment that the CONTRACTOR engaged under this Agreement is in fact an independent contractor.

9. <u>CONTRACTOR</u> represents that its operations are in compliance with applicable County planning, environmental and other laws or regulations.

- 10. <u>CONTRACTOR</u> is responsible to pay prevailing wages and maintain records as required by Labor Code Section 1770 and following.
- 11. <u>NONASSIGNMENT</u>. CONTRACTOR shall not assign this agreement without the prior written consent of the COUNTY.

- 12. <u>RETENTION AND AUDIT OF RECORDS</u>. CONTRACTOR shall retain records pertinent to this Agreement for a period of not less than five (5) years after final payment under this Agreement or until a final audit report is accepted by COUNTY, whichever occurs first. CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to be subject to the examination and audit by the Santa Cruz County Auditor-Controller, the Auditor General of the State of California, or the designee of either for a period of five (5) years after final payment under this Agreement.
- 13. <u>PRESENTATION OF CLAIMS</u>. Presentation and processing of any or all claims arising out of or related to this Agreement shall be made in accordance with the provisions contained in Chapter 1.05 of the Santa Cruz County Code, which by this reference is incorporated herein.
- 14. <u>ACKNOWLEDGMENT</u>. CONTRACTOR shall acknowledge in all reports and literature that the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors has provided funding to the CONTRACTOR.
- 15. <u>ATTACHMENTS</u>. This Agreement includes the following attachments: Scope of Work.

Revised Operation, Monitoring and Maintenance of the Landfill Gas (LFG) Migration Control Facilities at the Buena Vista and Ben Lomond Landfills, Santa Cruz, California

Dear Mr. Matthews:

Pursuant to our site meeting and your recent request, SCS-Field Services (SCS-FS) is pleased to submit the following Scope of Work, Assumptions and Conditions, and Compensation to perform the subject work. As you have indicated, if this work scope/proposal is approved SCS-FS is available to begin services during the month of November/December 2001.

SCOPE OF WORK

Our Scope of Work has been structured to operate, monitor, and maintain the facilities to help control LFG migration such that operational goals and regulatory compliance established by County of Santa Cruz, the system design engineer, local APCD and other regulatory agencies are met. In addition the system will be adjusted to maximize operating hours, flow and Btu's at both the Buena Vista and Ben Lomond facilities. SCS-FS proposes to divide operation, monitoring, and. maintenance services into the following categories:

- Initial monthly LFG collection system inspection, evaluation, operation and reporting,
- Routine quarterly operation, monitoring, maintenance and reporting,
- Quarterly surface emissions testing/reporting (Buena Vista site only),
- Non-routine monitoring and repairs.

Initial LFG Collection System Inspection, Evaluation, Operation and Reporting

The initial work will be performed during the first three (3) months of service (for each site).

Field Activities -

SCS-FS will perform a complete LFG collection and flare system inspection and evaluation. This work will include two (2) complete LFG extraction wellfield testing and adjustment events per month. LFG collection system main and lateral pipelines and vacuums will be tested and inspected for blockageshreakages. Condensate pump stations and all associated air and liquid transmission pipelines will be



inspected for proper operation, blockages/breakages.

Reporting •

Upon completion of the initial LFG collection system inspection and testing. SCS-FS will prepare and submit a report including our observations, recommendations, blower flare station, extraction well and other system monitoring data.

Quarterly Routine Operation, Monitoring, and Maintenance

Subsequent to completion of the first 3 months of initial system evaluation and operation, SCS-FS will implement the following routine quarterly operation, monitoring, and maintenance program (for each site). Routine operation, monitoring, and maintenance will be accomplished via the following:

Monitoring--

Quarterly-

Once each quarter, the Blower/Flare Stations (BFS) will be monitored. Date will be collected, recorded, and stored in a computer database for the following:

- -- date, time and monitoring personnel,
- -- meteorological conditions (i.e. wind velocity, barometric pressure, ambient temperature, weather conditions, etc.),
- -- extraction blower operating inlet/outlet temperatures and pressures,
- -- methane, oxygen, carbon dioxide, and nitrogen gas concentrations at flare inlet,
- -- flare exit gas temperature,
- -- LFG flow rate to flare,
- -- flare combustion louver and flow control valve positions,
- -- supply air pressures to BFS components and condensate handling systems,
- -- gauge LFG condensate storage tank level and injection rates,
- -- check air compressors and oil level;
- -- check pilot ignition system propane storage tank level.

Operation--

Quarterly -

Once each quarter, the LFG extraction wells and BFS total flow will be adjusted as required to help control LFG migration, maximize Btu's and total flow, odors, and meet specific site permit and regulatory agency requirements and conditions. In addition to the parameters below, SCS-FS will document testing protocols and instrumentation calibration. Each extraction well will be tested for the following:

- -- meterological conditions (i.e., wind velocity, barometric pressure, ambient temperature, weather conditions, etc.)
- -- LFG temperature,
- -- wellhead vacuum,
- -- LFG flow (where applicable),
- -- methane, oxygen, carbon dioxide, and nitrogen gas concentrations.
- Once each quarter, main pipeline access ports (where applicable) will be tested for pressure. The results will also be stored in **a** computer database and analyzed for long-term trends (i.e. pressure drops indicating possible condensate blockages, breakage, etc.).

Maintenance--

- * Quarterly Once each quarter, condensate traps/sumps (including pumps, air supply lines, etc.) will be checked and observed for condensate levels and proper operation.
 - Donce each quarter, (if applicable) the oil for the air compressors will be checked, filters will be inspected, cleaned and replaced (as needed), belts will be checked and adjusted, and liquids manually bled from system components (where applicable), in accordance with the manufacturers' specifications.

- Once each quarter, the operation of LFG control system blowers, flame arresters, flares (including burner heads), well field, condensate sumps/pumps, and strip-chart recorders will be observed and checked for the following:
 - -- proper operation,
 - -- accessibility,
 - -- vandalism,
 - -- malfunctions,
 - -- leaks.
 - -- check condensate levels and proper pneumatic pump operation.
- Once each quarter, active/inactive blower operation will be rotated.
- Once each quarter, proper operation of the automatic dialer systems, alarm signal inputs (i.e. flame failure, etc.), and BFS controller set points will be verified.
- Once each quarter, all the alarm signals (i.e. blower failure, flame failure, low/high temperature, etc.) will be simulated for proper operation and notification. During alarm simulation activities (when applicable) the alarm sensing equipment will be calibrated in accordance with the manufacturers' specifications.
- Once each quarter, the flare **W** scanner will be observed for proper operation and cleaned in accordance with manufacturers' specifications.
- Once each quarter, the blowers (and electrical motor) bearings will be lubricated in accordance with the manufacturers' specifications.
- Once each quarter, the flame arrester will be observed and checked.

Reporting-

Once each quarter (for each site), SCS-FS will prepare a detailed report for the County of Santa Cruz containing the data collected, equipment calibration logs, recommendations and a summary of activities performed on the projects during the reporting period. Maintenance repairs and/or system modifications will be recommended as required.

Quarterly LFG Collection System Data Quality Assurance

Subsequent to completion of the first 3 months of initial system evaluation and operation, SCS-FS will implement the following data quality assurance review program for each site via the following:

• Quarterly -

Two months per quarter, (for each site) **SCS-FS** will perform data quality assurance review of LFG extraction wells and BFS monitoring performed by county field personnel. A brief report with our comments and recommendations will be submitted to the County.

Quarterly Surface Emissions Monitoring and Reporting

SCS-FS will perform quarterly surface emissions monitoring and reporting (Buena Vista site only) via the following:

• Quarterly -

Surface monitoring (and instruments utilized) will be performed in accordance the Buena Vista site Title V permit requirements. The monitoring event will be performed during each quarter, weather permitting. SCS-FS will perform landfill surface emissions monitoring over the entire landfill surface, which consists of up to approximately 75 surface acres (excluding active work areas, steep slopes, or other inaccessible/unsafe areas). A portable wind station will be temporarily erected at a representative location at the landfill to document compliance with meteorological conditions during the monitoring events. Monitoring will be performed a minimum of 72 hours after the latest rainfall and shall be performed when the average wind speed is less than 5 miles per hour and the instantaneous wind speed remains under 10 miles per hour. Surface emissions monitoring will be performed on 30-meter grids over the entire landfill surface. Monitoring will be performed with the detector inlet held 5 to 10 centimeters above the ground surface. Any locations exceeding 500 parts per million above established background will be recorded and stake marked. During these activities, the landfill cover/surface will be visually inspected for integrity, breaches, or erosion.

Reporting-

* Quarterly -

A detailed written report summarizing the results of monitoring activities will be provided to the County within 30 days of the surface emissions testing events.

Non-Routine Monitoring and Repairs

Non-routine monitoring and maintenance consists of corrective repair or maintenance work identified during the routine site visits or by county personnel. Non-routine maintenance may include, but is not limited to, the following:

- raising of wellheads, lateral, or header lines,
- repair or replacement of non-functional condensate sump components, lateral and header lines,
- replacement of non-functional extraction or monitoring wells.
- assistance with APCD or regulatory site inspections,
- flare stack emission source testing,
- response to emergency call-outs by the Automatic Dialer System (ADS) or county personnel,
- loss of gas flow or flare ignition,
- repair of damaged main pipelines (resulting in no gas flow to the BFS).
- air compressor manufacturers' service.

ASSUMPTIONS AND CONDITIONS

The Assumptions and Conditions for the Scope of Work are presented in Attachment A.

COMPENSATION

<u>Initial LFG Collection System Inspection, Evaluation, Operations and Reporting</u> - as described in the Work Scope, will be performed on a lump sum amount as follows:

- Buena Vista \$2,695 per month
- Ben Lomond \$2,695 per month
- Total Budget \$16,170 (3 months)

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Routine Quarterly Operation, Monitoring, Maintenance and Reporting - as described in the work scope, will be performed on a lump sum amount as follows:

-	Buena Vista	\$1,695	per quarter
-	Ben Lomond	\$1,195	per quarter
-	Total Budget	\$8,670	(3 quarters)

Quarterly LFG Collection System Data Quality Assurance Review

As described in the Work Scope, will be performed on a lump sum amount as follows:

- Buena Vista	\$275	per month
- Ben Lomond	\$275	per month
- Total Budget	\$3,300	(3 quarters)

Quarterly Surface Emissions Monitoring and Reporting

As described in the Work Scope, will be performed on a lump sum amount as follows:

- Buena Vista \$1,195Total Budget \$4,780 (4 quarters)
- Total Annual Budget for both sites will be \$32,920

Attachment A Assumption and Conditions For the Buena Vista and Ben Lomond Landfills Santa Cruz, California October 12,2001

- 1. SCS-FS will be responsible for LFG collection and flare system operation, monitoring, and maintenance as described in this proposal. The Buena Vista system consists of approximately 57 extraction wells, 2 condensate pump stations, 1 callidus flare and appurtenant electrical panels and controls. The Ben Lomond system consists of approximately 28 extraction wells, 1 condensate sump station, 1 John Zirk flare and appurtenant electrical panels and controls.
- 2. The on-site automatic dialer alarm system will immediately notify the County or SCS-FS of a Blower/Flare Station shutdown. Response to shutdowns or callouts can be performed under the non-routine services section of this proposal.
- 3. All routine operation, monitoring, and maintenance can be completed by a one man field crew; all monitoring and adjustment of extraction wells can be accomplished without entering vaults greater than 4 feet deep.
- **4.** This bid price is valid for a period of **45** days from the date of this submittal.
- 5. SCS-FS will not take responsibility for the overall quality of the gas collected from the LFG control system with regard to trace components.
- 6. SCS-FS takes no legal responsibility for any of the potential hazards associated with the LFG condensate.
- 7. Flare emission testing or other analysis that may be required by the APCD or other regulatory bodies, can be performed under the non-routine monitoring and repair service section of this proposal.
- **8.** Meetings with APCD or other regulatory bodies is considered non-routine work.
- 9. The routine portion of this proposal does not include cost for repair and/or replacement spare parts or materials (e.g., propane, chart paper, oil/grease, belts or filters).
- 10. The Client is responsible for ensuring that SCS-FS and **County** personnel are the only parties designated to operate or adjust the subject facilities.
- 11. Unrestricted site access for personnel, equipment, and materials to enable completion of work.

- 12. The work will be performed in accordance with the GRCDA/SWANA Landfill Gas Division Health and Safety Task Force, "A Compilation of Landfill Gas Laboratory and Field Practices and Procedures," dated March 1992. The work will be performed in OSHA Level D protection (including hard hat and safety vest). Any additional health and safety requirements may cause an increase in our price.
- 13. At no time shall the title to any hazardous substances, solid wastes, petroleum contamination, or other regulated substances pass to SCS-FS, nor shall any provision of an ensuing Agreement be interpreted to permit SCS-FS to assume the status of a "generator", "transporter", or "treatment, storage, or disposal facility" under state or federal law.
- 14. The Client will provide SCS-FS, prior to start of work, available information regarding manufacturer's operation and maintenance documents, design engineer operation and maintenance requirements, and any other applicable regulatory agency operating requirements.
- 15. Laboratory services or flare emissions testing (if required) are by others.
- 16. SCS-FS shall be responsible for providing the necessary portable field instrumentation and small hand tools required to support the performance of the Scope of Services.
- 17. Routine service will be performed during normal working hours (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.), 8 hours per day or 40 hours per week, 5 days per week, excluding holidays.
- 18. This proposal (bid) and Assumptions and Conditions shall become a part of a mutually agreeable contract and/or purchase order.
- 19. This proposal assumes the utilization of non-union, non-prevailing wage labor rates.
- 20. Our routine services does not include quarterly/annual cost for air compressor service by the manufacturer. This work can be performed under the Non-routine section of this proposal.
- 21. Routine surface emissions testing costs assume that each quarterly event can be completed in one mobilization. Additional costs may be required if meteorological conditions or other factors outside of SCS-FS's control require more than one mobilization.
