RE: Annual appropriation to the Sheriffs Office to enhance law enforcement

efforts

Members of the Board:

The Rural County Crime Prevention Act of 2001, approved by the State legislature, authorized an annual appropriation of \$18,500,000 to 37 rural and small county sheriffs' departments to enhance law enforcement efforts in those counties. The Santa Cruz County Sheriffs Office was one of the recipients of this annual funding in the amount of \$500,000 with the assistance received from both Senator McPherson and Assembly Member Keeley. This letter is intended to provide your Board with background information and request authorization to purchase two vehicles for the watch team command lieutenants, provide partial funding towards an appropriate site for secured vehicle storage, purchase mobile data computers, five replacement bicycles, laptop computers and various safety equipment to assist with the increased demands for patrol services in the unincorporated areas of Santa Cruz County.

In the 2001 legislative session, Governor Davis signed legislation to enhance law enforcement efforts for 37 rural and small California county sheriffs' departments. He stated at a press conference that this legislation would provide an ongoing opportunity to put more front line deputies in California's rural and small counties. To support this commitment, the enacted legislation provides annual funding in Government Code Section 30070. The legislation contains no restrictions on the use of funding as long as it enhances law enforcement efforts in the Sheriffs Office. The funds, until July 1, 2002, are required to be used to supplement rather than supplant existing law enforcement resources. It is anticipated that

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the State legislature plans to review in detail how counties used this allocation to supplement local law enforcement services.

As you are aware, the Sheriffs Office is committed to Community Policing as an integral part of combating crime and improving the quality of life in our community. In the 1999/2000 fiscal year, the Sheriffs Office handled 91,956 documented calls for service. Approximately, **42%** of the total calls were generated in the Live Oak and Aptos beat areas. Live Oak accounted for over 23% of the total patrol calls for service received by the Sheriffs Office. The workload figures have clearly identified the need for more Sheriffs Patrol resources devoted to these areas.

In the Sheriffs Operations budget preparation for this year, the department requested patrol deputies for Live Oak and the south county to assist with increased service demands. These requests were not recommended in the final budget because of the County's fiscal constraints.

It is the intention of the Sheriffs Office to use these funds to add deputy positions to enhance front line law enforcement efforts in the County. However, the Sheriffs Office is aware of the current fiscal constraints that the County may face due to the repeal of the Utility Tax and the long term commitment of funds that may be required with the addition of new positions. To address this situation, the Sheriffs Office will return to your Board in April regarding the issue of new positions after the outcome of the vote on the Utility Tax is determined.

At this time, the Sheriffs Office is recommending the one time purchase of two vehicles for the watch team command lieutenants and to set aside \$21,000 as partial financing towards an appropriate site for secured vehicle storage. The Sheriffs Office also plans to purchase mobile data computers for front line officers, five replacement bicycles, new laptop computers and various safety equipment. A line item detail (Attachment A) is attached to this letter that addresses the \$432,678.01 in expenditures. The remainder of funds will be addressed when the Sheriffs Office returns to your Board in April 2002.

- 5) Approve set aside of \$21,000 as partial financing towards an appropriate site for secured vehicle storage;
- 6) Adopt resolution accepting and appropriating unanticipated revenue in the amount of \$100,000 from the Sheriff's Department for the Fleet Replacement program; and
- 7) Request that the Auditor-Controller's Office open an interest bearing Rural and Small County Law Enforcement Trust Fund.
