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EDUCATION:

PATRICIA A. SPENCE STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS Santa Cruz Metropolitan Transit District Board of Directors

I am a stroke survivor since October 1996. My life and that of my family/ caregivers changed forever and we now view the world from an entirely different perspective. If eel lucky, if it can be said, that my disability was incurred in the late 1990's and not earlier. People in years prior to ADA guidelines must have suffered great indignation due to the lack of facilities, transportation or other services.

Because of my stroke I am wheelchair user for outings away from home and have been a regular passenger using the Santa Cruz Metropolitan Transit Paratransit service. This is the service mandated by the ADA for providing transportation service for people with disabilities who are unable to ride the fixed route bus service. The service has been invaluable to me and has given me the freedom to access many services and community activities that otherwise were not available to me.

In September 1999 I had an extremely dirty paratransit vehicle dispatched for a ride from the Stroke Center in De Laveaga Park to my home in Watsonville. In April 2000 I was approached by the acting director of the Stroke Center and asked if I would represent the Center in a Metro sponsored audit/ recertification program of the paratransit system. At this same time I had personal concerns regarding safety and maintenance factors, vehicle cleanliness and enforcement of standards so I was eager to accept the offer.

After my appointment to the Commission on Disabilities, I became increasingly involved in paratransit issues and decided to focus my efforts exclusively in transportation for people with disabilities. After my initial poor and subsequent experiences, I made it my personal commitment to carry through on an effort to improve the quality of service. I have been actively working on the audit of services conducted by Metro during the community outreach phases, drafting the new Customer's Guide's and drafting request for proposals for the re-certification all paratransit customers.

Since June of 2001 I have chaired a subcommittee that includes two other MASTF members to develop an activity for the Metro Board members and management to access an perform rides on paratransit to obtain first hand experience and knowledge of the service. In approximately **4** weeks, the participants and subcommittee will be able to conclude the process and file a final report.

I have become more familiar with fixed route services and other transit operations by attending MASTF and monthly Board meetings. The issues covered by the Transit District are vast and varied and I am sure I have much more to learn. An appointment to the Santa Cruz Board of Directors will allow me the opportunity to continue the commitment of improving not only paratransit service, but all phases of transportation in Santa Cruz County.

Thank you for considering my appointment.
