Dear Members of the Board:

The following is the Annual Report for the Santa Cruz County Domestic Violence Commission for the years 2000 and 2001.

Introduction

The Domestic Violence Commission was established under the authority of Government Code Section 31000.1, and in compliance with Chapter 2.38 of the Santa Cruz County Code. (Ord. 4329 §1 (part), 1994)

The Domestic Violence Commission consists of the following members:

The county administrative officer, or his or her designee;

The sheriff-coroner of the county, or his/her designee;

A chief of a police agency, designated by the law enforcement chiefs association of the county or that police chiefs designee;

The district attorney of the county, or his/her designee;

Two judges, one familiar with domestic violence cases, one familiar with family law, to be chosen by the courts;

The chief probation officer of the county, or his/her designee;

The public defender of the county, or his/her designee;

The superintendent of the county office of education, or his/her designee;

One representative of each of the following, as appointed by the Board of Supervisors, upon nomination by the identified agency:

The Human Resources Agency of the county,

The Women's Crisis Support and Shelter Services,

Defensa de Mujeres,

The Battered Women's Task Force,

The Family Mediation Service,

A certified batterer's treatment provider approved by the county probation department pursuant to Penal Code Section 1000.94,

The Women's Commission of the county,

The City of Santa Cruz Commission for the Prevention of

Violence Against Women,

Dominican-Santa Cruz Hospital,

Watsonville Community Hospital,

The health services agency of the county,

Walnut Avenue Women's Center,

The Community Clinic Coalition,

A representative of the Family Law Bar of Santa Cruz

County,

The Seniors Commission of the county, and

Sutter Maternity and Surgery Center of Santa Cruz;

The following at-large representatives, as appointed by the Board of Supervisors:

A survivor of domestic violence.

A representative of the gay/lesbian/bisexual community.

The following is a list of the Commission's accomplishments for the years 2000 and 2001:

The Commission produced a video for health care providers on how to recognize and report domestic violence. One hundred fifty copies of the video were distributed to health care professionals throughout our community. Trainings by Commissioners were presented at grand rounds at Dominican and Watsonville Hospitals, as well as other meetings of health care providers and physicians groups. Captain Kim Austin of the Watsonville Police Department has advised the Commission that reporting by medical providers in south county has increased 150% since the training was concluded. Copies of the video are enclosed with this annual report for your information.

On August **9**,2000, the Commission hosted a half day study session on "Evidence Based Prosecution." Experts on domestic violence prosecution, Gael Strack and Rolanda Pierre Dixon, were the featured speakers. The study session was attended by Commissioners and members of the public.

The Commission determined that a new strategic plan would enable Commission members to develop future goals and projects. Towards this end, the Commission requested funds from the Community Foundation to help the Commission plan for and conduct a one day planning retreat that will focus on developing a strategic plan. The Community Foundation has agreed to provide \$2,500 towards this event. The consultant selected, Kay Bowden, will interview commissioners and work with the Executive Committee to prepare for the one day planning session to be held on February 22, 2002, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Simpkins Swim Center. In addition, Ms. Bowden will prepare a final report evaluating the retreat and its effectiveness in achieving the retreat objectives. The Commission made a request to the Board of Supervisors for funding in 2001. That request was approved. The balance of approximately \$1,200 to host the strategic planning session will be borne out of the fund authorized by the Board of Supervisors.

For the years 2000 and 2001, the Commission honored Domestic Violence Awareness Month with its annual Purple Ribbon Campaign and Awards Dinner at the Posse House. Guest speaker at the 2001 dinner was Ariel Hand, Coordinator of the Violence Intervention Program at Valley Medical Center of Santa Clara Valley. Ms. Hand spoke of Santa Clara County's innovative new program at Valley Medical Center which identifies and assists victims of domestic violence.

The Commission agreed to support "What Works? Keeping Children Safe in Their Families." The project will collect data regarding children who witness domestic violence in the home.

The Commission established a Domestic Violence Commission website at www.co.santa-cruz.ca.us.

The Commission published a brochure containing the procedure for public comments



and other pertinent information about the role of the Commission. Additionally, the Commission established the position of "Greeter." The Commission's "Greeter" welcomes the public to its meeting, provide the public with the brochure, and contact the member of the public following his or her presentation to the Commission.

The Commission has begun the process of revising the Domestic Violence Law Enforcement Protocol.
