SUBJECT: 2001/2002 ENGINEERING SERVICES BUDGET REVISIONS: GRANT

ACCEPTANCE AGREEMENT, ACCEPTANCE OF UNANTICIPATED REVENUE, FUND TRANSFER, AND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

WITH REPUBLIC ELECTRIC

Members of the Board:

On August 2,2001, the Santa Cruz County Regional Transportation Commission (SCCRTC) programmed \$200,000 in Regional Surface Transportation Program exchange funds for purchasing traffic signal battery-backup equipment and installation for a total of 53 intersections through various local jurisdictions. The County of Santa Cruz is scheduled to receive \$64,151 of those funds for 17 of our signalized intersections. Attached is a memorandum from the SCCRTC dated December 31,2001.

The Department of Public Works recommends that these funds be appropriated for the County Service Area (CSA) No. 9 Budget to allow the County's traffic signal maintenance contractor, Republic Electric, to purchase and install the 17 battery backup systems. The battery backup systems will allow the traffic signals to operate in a flashing red mode during periods of electrical disruption due to blackouts or storm damage. These battery backup systems have been proven to be an effective safety device and will benefit the motoring public.

These funds from the SCCRTC are sufficient to upgrade approximately one-half (17) of the County's 36 maintained traffic signals with the battery backup systems. Additional funding for upgrading the other 19 County-maintained traffic signals is proposed using contingency funds from the CSA No. 9 budget.

It is therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors take the following action:

- 1. Authorize the Director of Public Works to sign the attached Battery Backup Grant Acceptance Agreement with the SCCRTC.
- 2. Direct the Clerk of the Board to return the grant acceptance agreement to Public Works for further processing.
- 3. Adopt the attached resolution accepting and appropriating unanticipated revenue in the amount of \$64,151 for engineering services in the Public Works Department.
- 4. Authorize the transfer of \$81,225 of contingency funds within the CSA No. 9 budget to the Republic Electric contract as indicated on the attached AUD 74.
- 5. Approve the proposed amendment to agreement with Republic Electric to increase the amount of the contract by \$135,864 as indicated on the attached ADM 29 for the purchase and installation of the battery backup systems to all 36 County-maintained traffic signals.

COMMUTE SOLUT ONS		In order to ensure that critical traffic signals remain in operation during power outages, the Commission programmed \$200,000 in Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) exchange funds for traffic signal battery back up equipment and installation in the region at its August 2001 meeting.
TRANSI ORTATION POLICY WORKSHOP		The Battery Backup committee, consisting of staff from local jurisdictions, Caltrans, and the CHP, met in October and November to determine which high priority intersections will receive the funds (Exhibit B). For each of these 53 intersections,

SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM BATTERY BACKUP GRANT ACCEPTANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SANTA CRUZ COUNTY REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION AND THE IMPLEMENTING AGENCY

This agree	ment is made on	April 9	, 2002 1	by and bet	ween	the	Santa Cruz Co	ounty
Regional	Transportation	Commission,	hereinafter	referred	to	as	"SCCRTC"	and
Santa Cru	z Countv ,h	erein after refer	red to as "Imp	plementing	Age	ncy.	,,	

WHEREAS, the SCCRTC has completed a separate agreement with Caltrans to exchange a portion of its Surface Transportation Program apportionment for state Federal Apportionment Exchange Program funds (STP Exchange);

WHEREAS, the SCCRTC has completed a separate agreement with the Implementing Agency for STP Exchange funds;

WHEREAS, the SCCRTC programmed \$200,000 in STP Exchange funds for the Battery Backup Program on August 2,2001 to be disbursed to local jurisdictions according to allocations approved by the Battery Backup Committee consisting of representative of the local jurisdictions, the California Highway Patrol, Caltrans, and SCCRTC staff;

WHEREAS, the Battery Backup Committee on November 28,2001 approved the disbursement of STP Exchange funds to implementing agencies, as shown in Exhibit A, to partially fund equipment and installation of Battery Backup Systems at the intersections listed in Exhibit B.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Implementing Agency shall use the approved STP Exchange funds only for battery backup system equipment and installation.
- 2. The Implementing Agency shall use local funds, as needed, to install Battery Backup Systems at all the intersections listed in Exhibit B.
- 3. The Implementing Agency shall complete the installation of Battery Backup Systems at the intersections listed in Exhibit B within one year of signing this agreement.
- 4. If the funds are more than is needed, the Implementing Agency can use the balance to fund additional intersections.
- 5. The Implementing Agency shall provide a report to SCCRTC on December 31,2002 listing the intersections which received battery backup equipment, month/year of installation, and the costs for each intersection.
- 6. The Implementing Agency may, at its option, receive the approved STP Exchange funds for this project as a lump sum either at the start of the project or after the project is completed, upon

receipt of an invoice for the funds.

The agencies signing below acknowledge that STP Exchange funds are subject to audit by state, federal or SCCRTC auditor. In the event that the Implementing Agency fails to use funds received hereunder in accordance with the terms of this agreement, such recipient shall return the funds to the SCCRTC for credit to the fund established for this purpose.
