I have more than twenty-five years experience of organizational leadership, of program innovation, development and management, and of resource development and fiscal accountability.

In the course of my career, I have demonstrated the ability to:

- Develop and provide leadership for dedicated program teams,

District Director, California Conservation Corps (1988 to 2000)

Responsibilities: provide management, leadership, and accountability for CCC operations in the San Francisco and Monterey Bay areas. The District had 25 to 30 staff, serving **230** Corpsmembers and 200 plus public agency partners with annual budgets exceeding **\$6** million.
