RE: Motor Vehicle Emission Reduction Grant Application

Dear Members of the Board:

The Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District (MBUAPCD) administers the AB 2766 Motor Vehicle Emission Reduction Grant Program. The program provides funds for projects which reduce air pollution from motor vehicles and related planning, monitoring, enforcement and technical studies to implement the California Clean Air Act. The amount available will be determined by the District Board, but will exceed one million dollars. The District is seeking project applications which would reduce motor vehicle emissions or would build, operate or demonstrate emission-reducing infrastructure. Projects are scored by cost effectiveness, status as an adopted Transportation Control Measure, total project cost relative to the request, and reduction of vehicle miles traveled. This letter is to provide your Board with background information; and to request adoption of a resolution approving the submission of an application from the Sheriffs Office to the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District for the Motor Vehicle Emission Reduction Grant Program to purchase a new cleaner-burning Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) van.

The Sheriffs Office is applying to the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District for a Motor Vehicle Emission Reduction Grant in the amount of \$21,276 to replace one of our 1992 gasoline-powered, prisoner transportation vans, with a new cleaner-burning CNG van. This van will be used primarily to move prisoners from the Main Jail in Santa Cruz to the single courtroom in Watsonville. Page 2/Motor Vehicle Emission Reduction Grant Application

Currently, a deputy, assigned to transit security duty, transports approximately eight unsentenced prisoners from the Main Jail to the Watsonville Courthouse via the prisoner transportation van each day court is in session. The mileage in each direction is 17.5 miles. Two round trips are driven daily, for a total of 70 miles. This process is repeated for 248 court days a year, which adds up to 17,360 miles. The Sheriffs Office anticipates that prisoner transportation demands will increase after the completion of the new Watsonville Courthouse.

This application will make a significant difference in the air quality **of** our community. It is the recommendation of this office that your Board approve this application.

It is therefore RECOMMENDED that your Board adopt the resolution approving the submission of an application to the Monterey Bay Unified Air Pollution Control District for the Motor Vehicle Emission Reduction Grant Program.

## Watsonville Courthouse Prisoner Transportation Van Santa Cruz County Sheriff-Coroner's Office

The Santa Cruz County Sheriff-Coroner's Office is requesting replacement of one of our **1992** gasoline-powered, prisoner transportation vans, with a new cleaner-burning CNG vehicle. This van is used primarily to move prisoners from the Main Jail in Santa Cruz to the single courtroom courthouse in Watsonville.

The county of Santa Cruz currently has a conveniently located CNG filling station on site.

A deputy, assigned specifically to this transit, security duty, uses the Watsonville Courthouse prisoner transportation van. The officer begins his/her workday by picking up the van at the Watsonville Courthouse and driving it to the Main Jail where he/she picks up unsentenced prisoners and transports them to the courthouse in Watsonville. In the afternoon, upon completion of the court proceedings, the prisoners are returned to the Main Jail in Santa Cruz and the van is returned to the Watsonville Courthouse. Approximately **8** inmates are transported each day. The mileage each direction is **17.5** miles. Two round trips are driven daily, for a total of 70 miles. This process is repeated **248** court days a year, for a total of **17,360** miles. Additional regular unscheduled prisoner transportation trips are made in the van by the courtroom bailiff in the late afternoon or early evening. The Watsonville Superior Court Judge on a weekly basis remands defendants into the custody of the Sheriff or the Juvenile Probation Department. These prisoners are either transported to the Main Jail in Santa Cruz (17.5 miles each direction) or to the Juvenile Hall in Felton. (22 miles each direction)

In addition to our current Watsonville transportation needs, plans and construction agreements are currently underway to build a new, larger courthouse in downtown Watsonville. It is anticipated that the completion date is approximately four years away. This new courthouse will expand, accommodate and improve the availability of legal services to the residents of Watsonville and the surrounding community. Three additional courtrooms are planned, which will greatly increase the number of prisoners that will have their criminal cases heard in the city of Watsonville. We expect to hire additional deputies to staff the courtrooms and supervise larger, in-custody inmate populations waiting in court at the Main Jail in Santa Cruz. We foresee that a much higher number of prisoners will be transported from the Main Jail to the new, Watsonville courthouse. We therefore expect that more frequent use of the CNG van will be necessary.

The Santa Cruz County Fleet Services Department has a ten-year vehicle usage, service, maintenance and replacement contract with the Sheriff-Coroner'sOffice. The CNG van would be maintained under a similar agreement between our departments. This new vehicle is also expected to be operational for ten years. The fleet services manager has reported that a CNG van's **fuel** and maintenance costs are similar to a gasoline-powered van and therefore current budget costs would remain the same.

In order to transition to this new, CNG- powered van, we will wait 150 days to secure delivery from the manufacturer. Three additional installation steps must be performed prior to implementation. First, we will apply departmental identification insignia and striping on the exterior **of** the van. This usually takes about a week. Second, we will exchange the police radio, cellular telephone and other emergency services equipment from the old van to the new one. This process also takes about one week. Finally, we will take the van to Sacramento for the installation of metal prisoner separation. This process takes approximately two to three weeks.

We look forward to this project as a successful, emission reduction model in the Santa Cruz County Sheriff-Coroner's Office fleet operations.
